



310. IEEE Executive Director's Presentation

IEEE Executive Director **James Prendergast** gave a brief update of the staff activities. The financial forecast for 2011 is good and a surplus is expected. All aspects of IEEE are doing well and membership is on the increase both in general membership and Society membership. He then gave an update on Standards activities and Education activities, Major initiatives, Products and Services and finished by giving his top priorities.

303. Treasurer's Report

Brian Harrington, the Region 8 Treasurer, presented a summary report for 2010 and his outlook for 2011. The budget for 2010 was a balanced one. The Riga and Prague meetings were to budget. The Student Branch Congress was a financial success. Travel costs remain the 25% of the total budget. Region 8 is fulfilling all its obligations and payments, maybe with a small delay. He went on giving more details on the income and expense figures for the year. He continued by presenting the summary of his report. Further progress was made on cost control. There are some cash flow concerns and there is a need to rebuild assets.

306. Member Activities Report

Ali El-Mousa, R8 V/C Member Activities, started by introducing the GOLD team and gave the key facts and activities of the group. He urged everybody to create a GOLD affinity group. Then he presented the Professional Activities team. They organize activities to enchase members' careers in soft skills, management, communications and others. Then the Membership Development team was presented where local activities and personal contact are very important. He then gave some information on e-membership. The Women in Engineering Coordinator resigned for personal reasons. There are many WIE affinity groups and many events have been happening. The Life Members are very active and doing very well with many milestones and conferences. He then gave some information on the Region 8 News and the Region 8 Web page.

307. Student Activities

Elias Nassar, R8 V/C Student Activities, started by introducing all the members of his team. He then gave an overview of Student Membership in R8 and he presented the student activities that took place in 2011 like ISBC March 11-14, Madrid, Spain, MESBC March 15-18, Doha, Qatar, and then the upcoming events like CeUSBC May 12-14, Linz, Austria, MESBC 2013 in Lebanon and others. He also explained what the Twin Student Branch Program is and he gave some information on the Electronic Communications of the Student Web page. Then he asked the Section Chairs for their help in order to promote the student activities.

308. Technical Activities

Saurabh Sinha, R8 V/C Technical Activities, started by stating the Five Priorities that were set by the IEEE BoD for2011. Then he presented the Chapter Coordination Subcommittee (ChCSC), the Conference Coordination Subcommittee (CoCSC), the R8 Conference Activities Subcommittee, Educational Activities Subcommittee (EASC), Industry Relations Subcommittee(IRSC), the Standards Coordinator, the TAB "Committees" Liaisons and the Technical Publications Coordinator. He gave an overview of the Conferences and other events and activities that have happened in the above Subcommittees and an outlook for the future. Daniel Pasquet, Carl Debono, Bakr Hassan, Ghaleb Al-Dandan, David Law and Vladimir Katić gave a short overview of their corresponding areas.

313. IEEE Standards Association

Steve Mills, President, IEEE Standards Association, stated the core purpose of the Association and took a look at the question: What drives standards? Technology, Economics, Politics. Then he went on explaining that global markets require globally relevant standards. We have to ensure the relevance of IEEE Standards. In summary he said: We must recognize that geographically tuned standards strategies are critical to our success, we must value the contribution of IEEE corporate offices located in strategic



geographies and utilize available on-the-ground resources in the execution of our global standards strategy and we must be open to partnering with IEEE OUs, industry or other organizations to achieve the Institute's strategic goals globally.

314. Region 8 Conferences

Carl <u>Debono</u>, the Conference Coordinator, gave short presentations on the conferences of our Region: EUROCON 2011 in Lisbon, Portugal, African 2011 in Livingstone, Zambia, HISTELCON 2012 in Pavia, Italy, SIBIRCON 2012 in Belokuriha, Russia, MELECON 2012 in Medina Yasmine Hammamet, Tunisia, and ENERGYCON 2012 in Florence, Italy.

315. EnergyCon Review

Ghaleb Al-Dandan gave an overview of the EnergyCon 2010 conference that took place on the 18th – 22nd December, 2010 in Manama, Kingdom of Bahrain.

316. Sections Congress 2011

Pilar Molina Gaudó, the Sections Congress Coordinator, gave all the details and planning for Sections Congress 2011. She first gave the Key Milestones for SC2011, then the Focus Areas, the Recommendation Process and the necessary logistics.

317. Workshops - Sec. Con. Recommendations

Pilar Molina Gaudó gave the guidelines for the preparation of the workshops for the recommendations towards the Sections Congress to be held in San Francisco in August 2011.

305. Section Development and Vitality

Martin Bastiaans, IEEE R8 Director-Elect, said that he is a member of the Geographic Unit Operations Support Committee that is discussing Section Vitality and in these terms they would like to establish the Section vitality roadmap and what is needed for a successful and vital Section. There are still many discussions on the subject and after this a plan will be made specifically for our Region in order to proceed with this. Then he gave a list of various ideas on the subject. The road map has to be adapted taking into account the special conditions of each Section. In the near future he will try and check the vitality of the Sections and try to identify the problems, and on a one-to-one basis he will try to assist to boost the vitality of the Sections.

320. Region 8's 50th Anniversary

He urged the Section Chairs to make their inputs to these projects. He finished by giving some information on the creation of the Region 8 archive.

319. President-Elect Candidates' Debate

A debate took place between **Roger Pollard** and **Peter W. Staecker**, President-Elect Candidates for IEEE President. First they each made a short presentation and a debate followed. The debate was moderated by **Salima Kaissi** and several questions were asked and answered.

309. IEEE President's Address

IEEE President **Moshe Kam** gave a presentation with the title "What your Board of Directors has done for you lately". He gave an outline of the Board of Directors priorities for 2011: Emphasis on the external environment wherein IEEE operates, Spotlight on key large-scale activities, Expansion into new areas and strengthening of IEEE competitiveness, Ensure sustainable progress toward establishing IEEE's leadership in important new technical areas, Develop and approve a plan to ensure that IEEE is at the forefront of digital publishing technology, Develop and implement an IEEE Conference Strategy, including protection of quality of IEEE publications, Develop collaborative strategic alliances with other associations and publishers, To ensure all members are engaged and find a professional home in IEEE; create a global strategic member development plan. He then gave more insight on selected activities: The Life Sciences, Humanitarian Activities, and Africa.



318. Final R8 Sections Congress recommendations

Pilar Molina Gaudó, the Sections Congress Coordinator, and the workshop coordinators presented the results of the workshops. The procedure will be continued with an online procedure where the top 5 recommendations will be selected.

322. Election of R8 N&A Member

Jozef Modelski, Past Region 8 Director, presented the 3 candidates for the Nominations and Appointments Subcommittee (N&A). The candidates were **Christopher James** from UKRI, **Daniel Pasquet** from France and **Tunde Salihu** from Nigeria. The R8 Committee met in executive session with only the voting members of the Committee present where views and opinions on the canditates were exchanged. Voting took place and **Tunde Salihu** was elected.

323. IEEE Region 8 Logo

Diogo Mónica, the R8 Information Management Coordinator, explained all the details for the R8 logo competition and then he announced the winner out of 185 entries of the competition and presented the new logo. The logo has been approved by IEEE Corporate Services. The winning logo was designed by Steven Van Vaerenbergh.

The motion to accept the new logo was adopted unanimously.

324. Section Formation Approval Process

Martin Bastiaans, IEEE R8 Director-Elect, gave an overview of the Section, Subsection, Branch and Affinity Groups in our Region. He tried to identify the ideal Section size. Then he showed his proposal for new Section development and sugested that a good way to start a new geographic unit is to create a Subsection that resides directly under the Region.

325. New Business

Charles Turner, the Awards and Recognitions Subcommittee Chair, announced that the winner of the R8 Volunteer Award was Vladimir Dimcev. He also asked the participants to propose candidates for various awards.

Saurabh Sinha, R8 V/C Technical Activities, gave the following motion coming from the CoCSC (Subcommittee motion):

- Appropriate revisions/additions will be entered into the Region 8 operations manual.



During the past few months and following the London meeting, feedback information was gathered from all members of the subcommittees under my supervision. The members were asked to submit their remarks, comments, successes, failures and their recommendations. This was also followed up during various Skype conference meetings. This feedback information was vital to discern the various needs and also to motivate and encourage the region volunteers. This information was discussed and followed up.

The various subcommittee coordinators were asked to submit their individual reports about their activities for the SF meeting. You can find these reports in the agenda book and on the SF meeting web page at:

Additional remarks on the operation and activities of the different subcommittees follow:

Membership Development (MD)

Overall membership in the IEEE continues to grow. Total membership as of end of June 2011 stands at 371749 with an increase of 1.4% from last year. Region 8 membership stands at 67721 with an increase of 3.5% over last year.

Issues of concern which I urge section chairs to observe:

- > First year retention rate for R8 is around 85% of the identified goal. I am sure we can improve this.
- Some sections still do not have an MD officer. Please appoint one. This issue was highlighted in the London meeting. Thank you for the sections which did respond to the call.
- e-membership (where applicable). We have achieved until June only 37% of eligible higher grade members. More focus on this issue is also required in the coming few months specifically after August.

The R8 MD subcommittee has initiated a new program to increase the membership of small sections. It substantial financial rewards for qualifying sections. Please see the details in the SF R8 MD report. Please also consult with the members of the subcommittee in SF.

For Professional Activities (PA)

In these times of economic uncertainties, it is strongly felt that it pays to add value to our members through engaging them within the sphere of PA. To enhance this, it is important for sections to appoint a PA officer to work and coordinate these activities at the section and subsection level. Work is going on to put forward a proposal to this effect to be submitted at the section congress.

Additionally, a focus group is working on what is called thought leadership program to be run through the PA subcommittee. Please have a look at the SF PA report.

Please note that most members of this committee will be available for advice and discussions during the R8 meeting in SF.

Graduates of Last Decade (GOLD)

A highlight of GOLD activity in addition to the various support roles which can be seen in the GOLD report in the agenda book is the compiling, editing and printing of the GOLD book. This book chronicles the activities of GOLD during the last three years across R8. Please make sure to get your copy during the meeting.

Also, the GOLD subcommittee is now engaging in organizing all activities related to IEEE day deployment. Please read the GOLD report and support them within your OU.



Women in Engineering (WIE)

Due to the sudden resignation of Barbara Obryk because of personal reasons, WIE is now under new leadership. Dr Ferdinanda Ponci has been recently appointed to lead the R8 coordination efforts for WIE in R8. Dr Ponci thoughts and ideas can be found on the WIE R8 page.

Electronic Communications (ECC)

The official recognition of the winners, finalists and SPC Jury was organized during the **EUROCON 2011** Gala Dinner, April 28, 2011. It was a magnificent event! IEEE Region 8 Past Director Jozef Modelski and SPC 2011 Coordinator George Paunovic introduced all the SPC finalists, members of the Jury and pronounced three winners. All finalists also obtained certificates that their papers were selected within the five best SPC 2011 papers, and also that they personally participated within the SPC 2011 Oral Finals. All finalists papers were included in EUROCON 2011 Proceedings, will be included in IEEE Explore base and will be posted to SPC Internet pages.

EUROCON 2011 organizers, especially General Chair Joao Costa Freire, made extra efforts to co-organize IEEE R8 SPC 2011. SPC obtained all possible and reasonable support, organizational, financial and promotional. Even more, all SPC participants and Jury really felt as being an important part of the EUROCON 2011 Conference itself.

The SPC final results were already sent to IEEE services. The official prizes (diploma and money) are to be sent by IEEE Services to winners within the next period.

As soon as possible, complete report-information about the results of IEEE Region 8 Student Paper Contest 2011 will be posted at the SAC page, including several pictures. There is a plan to include an article about SPC 2011 in Region8 News September 2011 issue.

2.3.2 IEEEXtreme 24 hour Programming Challenge

This 24-hour programming contest has proven to be a good instrument for membership drive and member satisfaction. In 2010, 188 teams from Region 8 participated, 15 of them ranked in the top 25!

2.3.3 IEEE Student Branch Web Site Contest

With 23 participating student branches around our region, the IEEE Website Contest 2011 was a big success. As a result of the regional evaluations, the following student branch websites made it to the finals:

2.3.4 IEEE Region 8 Student Promotional Multimedia Contest

The goal of the contest is to generate student promotional material for IEEE. The videos display content about IEEE benefits seen by the students, not only products and services but also the impact that IEEE made in their communities, life as engineering students and the world in general.

The videos were shown during the SBC 2010, and voted by the attendees. Three prizes were given: US\$ 500 for 1st place, US\$ 250 for 2nd place, and US\$ 125 for 3rd place.

2.3.5 IEEE Region 8 Ethics Competition

The IEEE Ethics and Member Conduct Committee (EMCC) wants to raise the ethics awareness of IEEE members while they are still in school. To this end, the committee is launching the IEEE Student Ethics Competition, which is designed to provide student members with experience in applying ethical concepts to situations that might arise in the workplace. The competition also wants to increase the visibility of the IEEE Code of Ethics.

During SBC 2010, one of the workshops focused on "How to run a Student Ethics Competition". Due to limited attendance at the workshop, only certificates will be given out.

Note that there is prize money available for Student Branches running an Ethics competition. Further information can be found at http://www.ieee.org/about/ethics/competition.html.

3 Coordinating Student Branches

3.1 Twin Student Branch Program

The Twin Branch Program was established in April 2009, and has been active ever since. We maintain a page on the R8 Student Activities Committee website, where we list branch requests. Registered student branches can then agree to become twins. The relationship between twin branches are free-form, but branches are expected to be in touch, exchange information concerning their activities and difficulties, as well as any supporting documents and ideas that may help their operations. Most twins also organise joint activities, e.g. talks on the premises of both branches, using video-conference links or joint contests.

In this way, the program helps promote activity among the branches in the Region and jump-start recently established branches, while also increasing enthusiasm and creating interpersonal links between distant and otherwise unlikely partners.

The program has attracted considerable interest. We get questions about it at every meeting, and frequently



through email. On several MGA SAC meetings, we have also been approached by representatives from other regions - <u>during the 2011 Sping MGA SAC meeting</u>, it was voted the best <u>SAC activity worldwide</u>. However, the program suffers from lack of funding, which prevents it from realising its full potential.

Aiming to take the program to the next phase, we are in the process of preparing a New Activities Committee Seed Grant Proposal. If approved, this will allows us to financially sponsor twin activities, and, in some cases, inter-twin volunteer exchange to organise such activities.

In the meantime, we have gone live with a new twin registration procedure. This is, however, still in a testing phase, as it is part of the yet-to-be-launched R8 website.

3.2 Student Activities at Section level

Starting from April 2009 Region 8 meeting in Venice, and followed by all the next Region8 meetings we encouraged the Section Chairs to nominate a Section Student Representative (SSR) and a Student Activities Chair (SAC), we have decide to clarify and redefine the role and responsibilities of the SSR for the benefits of Student Branches, Sections and SSRs themselves. We have been working on this project with a few SSRs in Region 8. Database of SSRs and SACs are still not complete, we have been encouraging all Sections officers to provide us with their SSRs and SACs. This program is still ongoing work and our results will be published in our next reports.

IEEE Center for Leadership Excellence (CLE) training modules are now available for the Section Student Representative (SSR) and the Section Student Activities Chair (SSAC). Both can be found at http://ieee-elearning.org/outreach/course/view.php?id=82.

3.3 Communication

3.3.1 Web Activities

We have continued improving our online presence. Here are some of the updates

- Users can now subscribe to our posts by email, in addition to using our RSS, Twitter or Facebook feeds.
- The long-planned Wiki is finally online, although access is, in this phase, still limited to SAC members.
- We have replaced our site search system with Google Custom Search, enabling visitors to easily find the information they are looking for.
- New online cooperation tools are available to SAC members, using Google Apps for Domains.
- We completed the migration of the website to a new domain: www.r8sac.org
- We have started hosting public monthly chat sessions, each having a different topic and different guests. Member response to these sessions has been very positive. We have now deployed a new chat system, that will be used for the coming sessions.
- Our Facebook page is now approaching 1400 fans, and steadily increasing.
- Our Twitter feed is now followed by 150 people.

3.3.2 Emailing

The SAC team sends out bi-monthly email newsletters to all students and graduate students in Region 8. The newsletters contain announcements on upcoming deadlines, programs and awards as well as any news and benefits relevant to the target audience.

3.3.3 Cookbook series R8 News articles on Student Branch Management

We have decided to write a series of articles for Student Branch officers in the Region 8 News (one per issue). We called it "Student Branch Cookbook" and it focuses on practical and useful tips for student branch officers.



The first article of this series was published in the November 2009 issue of the Region 8 News on Student Branch fund-raising. The second article was part of the December 2010 issue and focused on Student Branch Chapters.

Next issues from cookbook and other information about Student Branch operations will be included in the new version of SAC website.

4 Ongoing Programs and Activities

4.1 Membership campaigns

Since September/October (which is also the start of the academic year) is the best time of the year to join the IEEE, R8 SAC and participating Student Branches continue to organize membership campaigns inside universities and online. In December/January our focus changes to membership retentin. In April/June, joining as a Student Member for the second half of the year is beneficial, which is something that Student Branches can use in their membership campaigns.

A reminder for Arrears was sent in February 2011. A large number of responses was received which were helpful in assessing why students do not sometimes renew their membership.

4.2 Student Branch support

R8 SAC supports its Student Branches with seed money for their major activities. This is a successful program with increasingly more requests than we can handle. Only those activities may qualify for financial support, in which more than one Student Branch is involved and/or from which more than one Student Branch will benefit. R8 SAC expect to the Section to support the activity with at least the same amount of money.

4.3 Section's welcome to graduating Student Members

Section Chairs are invited to welcome recent graduates into the Section as voting members and possible new volunteers. We strongly believe that such a personal contact at the Section level is very important for retention.

A program piloted in Region 8 is now a joint SAC-GOLD initiative called STEP (Student Transition and Elevation Partnership). STEP events are organised with funding from GOLD, and are attended by recent graduates, who can hear talks of interest for their professional feature and also learn more about post-student IEEE life and their GOLD AG and Section. See www.ieee.org/step for further information.

4.4 Student professional activities

Student Professional Awareness Conference/Venture (SPAC/SPAV) support funds are available from the global SPAA Committee. SBs can apply to get funding for events.

Workshops on Leadership skills and Project management are successfully organized throughout the Region, and are attended by many IEEE Student Members.

4.5 Travel grants for students at IEEE technical conferences

The Region 8 Voluntary Contribution Fund is not just intended for members, the fund helps also needy students to attend technical conferences (limit \$ 1000 per person in a lifetime).

Students attending technical events or conferences may receive a travel grant to the conference. In 2010 six students received funding (total of \$4500) to travel to conferences and four so far in 2011 received such funding.

4.6 Counselor support program



Section Chairs are requested to remind their Student Activities Coordinators and Student Representatives to remind each student branch to ensure that every SB in a given section benefits from the guidance of SB Counsellor, and helps us to keep our Counsellor list updated.

4.7 EPICS High

Educational Activities is developing the Engineering Projects in Community Service (EPICS) program in IEEE. Conceived and championed by IEEE 2007 President Leah Jamieson, <u>EPICS is a program that organizes university and high-school students</u> to work on engineering-related projects for local area humanitarian organizations.

Region 8 Sections already involved in EPICS projects are

- Nigeria Section

4.8 Teacher In-Service Program (TISP)

<u>The Teacher In-Service Program (TISP)</u> enables IEEE Volunteers to share their technical expertise and demonstrate the application of engineering concepts to support the teaching and learning of science, mathematics, and technology disciplines. <u>IEEE offers training workshops for its members</u> on how to facilitate in-service programs for local teachers to help them introduce hands-on engineering lessons to their students. <u>These lesson plans are aligned with education standards</u> and can easily be used in the classroom.

In 2011, UK&RI Section as well as Saudi Arabia Section will be hosting TISP events.

5 Student Activities on Section and Cross-Section level

Sectional student branch congresses should also be supported by the section. These events add a motivation plus to branches and highly prepared volunteers which can increase not only the number of student events in your sections, but also the membership. In addition, it is suggested the section officers attend the event or some part of them, and use it as a look-up for future section volunteers. Regional SAC will only fund this events if and only if the section also provides some funding.

5.1 Technical Conferences

5.1.1 Student Booth in Technical Conferences in Region 8

But not the big ones like EUROCON or IMS, where a student booth usually exists. We need to have these also in little conferences 100-200 people that take place in R8 and are typically R8 wide. This gives also the opportunity of the SB at the venue (if any) to show off a little. Many Graduate Students attend these events who are not yet IEEE members. In addition, students can help in the organization of these events as they have the necessary experience and skills.

5.2 2011 SBCs

5.2.1 2nd Iberian Student Branch Congress (ISBC 2011)

The ISBC 2011 took place in Madrid, Spain, on March 11-13, and was hosted by the ETSIT UPM Student Branch. It brought together around 60 delegates from Portugal, Spain and several other countries from Europe that had the chance to meet each other and exchange valuable experiences for their future as student leaders.



5.2.2 2nd Middle East Student Branch Congress (ME-SBC 2011)

The ME-SBC 2011 took place in Doha, Qatar, on March 14-18, and was hosted by the Texas A&M University at Qatar Student Branch. It as attended by 146 volunteers, most coming from 25 branches in 13 different sections. The host of the 2013 edition was chosen in a very competitive DOA contest, with the winner being the American University of Beirut, Lebanon Section.

5.2.3 1st Central European Student Branch Congress (CEuSBC 2011)

The first Central European Student Branch Congress took place from 13-15 May 2010 at the Johannes Kepler University in Linz, Austria. The event was attended by more than 40 participants from seven countries and has been organized by the Student Branch JKU Linz. Workshops and talks covering intelligent music processing, patent law, energy issues and social/professional skills were accompanied by social events. The participants used the opportunity to exchange their know-how of shaping a successful student branch.

5.2.4 National Congresses

Several national congresses are planned around the region. Since our level of involvement with these congresses is very variable, we don't have a complete listing. Some R8SAC members have, so far, been confirmed to attend the UKRI SBC in September, and the Portugal SBC in October.

5.2.5 SBC 2012

Two proposals have been received for the SBC 2012, one coming from the UPM Student Branch in Madrid, Spain Section, and the other coming from the Alexandria Student Branch in Alexandria, Alexandria Subsection. The proposals are currently undergoing evaluation by R8 SAC, with requests for comments going out to other stakeholders. The final results are expected soon.

5.3 Cross-committee work

This year the SAC is initiating cross-committee collaborations in order to enhance student activities and support in Region 8. The following SAC members are liaising and coordinating activities with the indicated Region 8 bodies:

5.4 Global MGA Student Activities Meeting

Last June, the global IEEE MGA SAC committee got together in Seattle, WA, USA for another yearly meeting. Region 8 was very well represented by Elias, Martin, Eva, Jorge and Jan Verveckken. Many topics related to student activities were discussed. The Region 8 team was ranked first among all IEEE regions for the best student activity concept. The winning concept was the Twin Student Branch Program implemented in Region 8. For more information about this program and how your student branch can join please visit the Region 8 SAC website.

The Vice-Chair (VC) for Technical Activities (TA) functions via several regional subcommittees and coordinators: (i) chapter coordination subcommittee (ChCSC), (ii) conference coordination subcommittee (CoCSC), (iii) industry relations subcommittee (IRSC), (iv) educational activities subcommittee (EASC), (v) standards coordinator, (vi) publications coordinator (ad hoc) and (vii) TAB committee liaison (ad hoc). Subcommittees carry out various operational tasks, with support of IEEE staff in Piscataway (New Jersey, USA), and strategic undertaking is frequently their own prerogative, but aligned to the overall vision of IEEE Region 8 - as in our approved operations manual. The VC, via referred subcommittees (SCs), provides overall leadership and oversight for all technical activities associated to our region.

This short report is intended as an "Executive Summary" for Section Chairs

The ChCSC takes lead towards supporting our chapters, and the SC has continued to reach out to various chapters in the region, in-concert, with the new "model" of the SC. As a reminder, the new constituency of the SC includes regional representatives of societies and councils. Over 20 new chapters were formed, and a few more split or extended towards a more inclusive service to members in a given locality. As the region develops, where new subsections were recently added, the SC provides support of a special nature to such entities aiming to develop *technical interests* of members towards society membership. It was agreed that the SC will further the role of society representatives with cohesion and engagement - the moment a new chapter is initiated. ChCSC will also avail a call for chapter awards (2012) electronically later this year.

At the previous region 8 meeting, the CoCSC presented a motion (approved) towards formalizing procedures for conference bids. The motion has now been implemented, and supporting documents (such as conference bid templates, budget templates, etc) placed on the Region 8 website for TA. The CoCSC works towards making conferences further "profitable" for Region 8, in the sense of technical co-sponsorship - a comparative of success: at the end of 2010 - some 17 technical co-sponsorship agreements were signed; the same number was already reached by the end of the second quarter (2011). The CoCSC has also kept an operational oversight (from the perspective of the region) on upcoming Region 8 flagship conferences, but has also finalized recommendations for conference bids (such as for Africon 2013). The CoCSC is working with IRSC and the Power & Energy Society (PES) towards a financial co-sponsorship for EnergyCon, the newest Region 8 flagship conference.

The IRSC undertook a workshop bringing together, amidst others, the role of the standards coordinator, with emphasis on the role of standards for industrial professionals. The IEEE Standards Association (IEEE-SA), a board level IEEE entity, took an active role with IRSC in London, and several key outcomes were undertaken. Included in such outcomes - a dialogue with IEEE's Educational Activities Division (EAD), with a long-term aim of in-person training for some online products (such as the IEEE eLearning library). To leapfrog the approach, correspondence was initiated with the IEEE Communications Society (ComSoc) on the Wireless Certification (WCET) programme, where in-person training is being arranged; for such sponsorship from industry (Saudi Arabia's Aramco) has also been established. The Industry Continuing Education (ICED) programme is being actively promoted via the Region 8 website. IRSC plans to call for awards (2012) for industry





leaders of our region – later this year.

The standards coordinator has worked with IRSC and the Educational Activities Board (EAB)'s Standards Education Committee (SEC) towards providing for training of the IEEE 802 suite – this is frequently coupled with Universities (such as in the London area) but also with our flagship conferences (for example, with the upcoming Africon 2011 in Livingstone, Zambia). The integration of IEEE-SA activities and the speaker's bureau (a programme of IEEE-SA) has also lead to individual section requests (for instance in Denmark) for deliveries of sessions on "Demystifying IEEE Standards."

The EASC, with support of EAB, continued to thrive - two major preuniversity initiatives – the Teacher In-Service Programme (TISP) were held in Scotland (March 2011) and Saudi Arabia (April 2011). A TISP presentation (March 2011) further "spun-off" from a TISP workshop held in Zambia (Sept. 2010) – co-hosted by Tunisia Section. Several engagements with Engineering Projects in Community Service (EPICS) continued in 2011 – active sections/countries in this regards include: Zambia, Zimbabwe, Namibia, South Africa, Benelux (Belgium) and Uganda. Further dialogue is ongoing with the Iraq Section and Nigeria Section. For the first time, a continuing education (CE) website has been established, and engagement with the CE director at Section's congress is expected to further benefits for IEEE organizational units in our Region. Accreditation activities encompass the Gulf area and parts of Southern / Eastern Africa. The effort in these areas include long term visions of mobility of graduate engineers and improving the quality/credential of existing engineering, engineering technology or computing programmes. For the first time in years, IEEE Region 8 has received several EAB awards, but all to the South Africa Section; it is hoped that this will encourage other Sections to nominate deserving candidates for the future award call.

The ad hoc coordinator relating to publications continued his efforts towards coupling volunteers with IEEE staff (sales and marketing) towards brokering suitable deals for enabling accessing to the IEEE/IET Electronic Library (IEL), commonly known as IEEE Xplore. The particular coordinator is also working to enhance mutual relations between national societies and the IEEE, with a potential deal here towards national society members also furthering their own technical base, by a suitable subscription to IEL. A more challenging engagement includes the possibility of including journal outputs of national societies to IEL, and work around this is being handled by the VC for TA directly with the VP for IEEE Publication Services and Products Board (PSPB).

The ad hoc coordinator (TAB liaison) has developed a matrix showing the lack of "new directions" (such as life sciences) in our regional conference. The liaison aims to coordinate with CoCSC the possibility to include such new themes for future flagship conferences enabling our region to move along with the rest of IEEE as we embrace these new areas, which brings technology a step closer towards humanity. The coordinator also envisages bridging our region closer with TAB committees relating to cloud computing, IEEE Committee on Earth Observations (ICEO), and the works in this regards is on-going, with hope for a strengthened cooperation with the Global Earth Observation System of Systems (GEOSS), via ICEO and the Group on Earth Observations (GEO).

As the work of various SCs continues, overlap between SCs is identified and synergy fostered. The VC for TA extends gratitude to the hard-work of all involved, and in particular the leadership shown by leads of standing and adhoc committees/coordinators associated to Region 8 TA. A complete listing of office bearers is provided on upcoming pages of this agenda booklet.

Part III. Subcommittees



Awards & Recognition Subcommittee (A&RSC)

The main focus of the Committee since the Region 8 meeting at Heathrow in March has been to finalise the proposal for the creation of an Outstanding Section Award. The regulations for the Award have now been completed and will be presented to the Region 8 Committee for approval at this meeting. A full version will be made available on the Committee website. Under the proposal there will be two awards each year, to recognise excellent performance by a large Section (>500 members) and a small Section (<500 members). The expectation is that the winners would go forward to the annual MGA global competition.

All Section Chairs have been asked to appoint an Awards and Recognition Officer/Coordinator to increase awareness of all levels of IEEE awards. At present only 19 Sections have an A&R Officer/Coordinator, and the Committee believes that this is a primary reason for the relatively small number of nominations submitted from Region 8 Sections for all levels of IEEE awards. The Committee plans to conduct a review of the effectiveness of its Technical Awards Panel (TAP). Although the panel has been able to get some nominations submitted for the major IEEE awards, it wants more information about these awards to be provided to a wider range of volunteers, ideally through Section Awards Officers. The objective is to encourage every Section to identify the leading candidates in their Section, in industry, government service, and academia, eligible for the major IEEE awards.

The Committee continues to liaise on awards issues with other Region 8 committees, including Chapter Coordination, GOLD, Student Activities, Women in Engineering, and Industry Relations.

Finally, a question for all Section Chairs: how many Sections have their own awards program, to recognise outstanding work by volunteers, students, etc.?

2. Meeting in London March 25th, 2011

44 people attended including 23 society representatives. We had a detailed presentation of IEEE vTools and 8 representatives made a presentation that was the opportunity for fruitful discussion. Some important points have been discussed. Roger Pollard, past VP (TAB) and Candidate for IEEE President – 2013 also lead an active discussion at the meeting in London.

2.1. Chapters identification

We could have a map with a list of all chapters in each section, with direct link to their website and e-mail address of the chapter chair. One can increase the local collaboration among chapters/societies. It is important to have a good communication with chapters. Some chapter chairs never answer. In order to keep a better contact with the chapters, it is wiser to have several contact names for each chapter.

The constituency of the chapters is an interesting datum (students, GOLD, retirees, academics, industry).

The ChCSC undertakes to further communication with IEEE staff in Piscataway to identify future opportunities for new chapters, and to establish relevant links with society representatives, in a way to expedite this process.

2.2. Communication with the chapters

Chapter meetings are a good tool to remain in touch with the chapters. Chapter chair training is important, in particular from SAMIEEE and vTools.

2.3. Help to the chapters

Societies give annual subsidies to chapters. The application deadline may be different according to the society. Many societies complain because few chapters ask for *additional* subsidies. Societies also give subsidies for special events organized by the chapters. The Distinguished Lecturers program is a nice tool for the chapters. Societies may contribute to the travel expenses to attend the CCM.



2.4. Duties of chapters

Chapters must communicate with its members (mailing list, e-notice), with the section and with the society. Chapter chairs must not forget that they must be related both to the section and the society. The region, via it's ChCSC, provides oversight to the referred operation.

Chapters must promote IEEE and the society. They may use membership development material that is available from IEEE.

Chapters must promote member elevation (engage members to apply for senior-member and find nominators for fellows).

Chapter web news allows members to be informed of the chapter activities.

Every year, the chapter must remind its member to renew.

The chapters must identify the member needs. The needs are different from the technical meetings.

2.5. Suggestions to chapters

Chapters may organize their own awards.

IM has a chapter development program. IA organizes a chapter web contest.

Technical activities may be common to several chapters. It could be in cooperation between chapters of different societies in the same section or of different sections in the same society or both. The Region also provides chapter awards, and the process for 2012 will be an online application (to be distributed following the meeting in San Francisco).

2.6. New chapters

Section should help to the constitution of petitions. Some societies give a new chapter support. AdCom members and DL should attend the first meeting of a new chapter.

3. Chapter chair meeting in Bucharest June 29th, 2011

The meeting was locally organized by Dr. Mihala Albu and Prof. Nicolae Tapus.

There were 26 attendees from Romania, Germany, Serbia-Montenegro, Italy, Israel. Some chapter chairs could not attend but sent their presentations from Morocco, Tunisia, Poland and Sweden.

The presentation of the rights and duties for chapters has been greatly appreciated. The Region 8 ChCSC website provides a link to additional training material. Many questions have been asked and many of them need to contact officers from Region 8 and MGA. The questions will be written in detail and forwarded to the right person. Among the questions: conference sponsorship, reviewers' evaluation, distribution of the rebates between the sections and the chapters.

All the participants have been invited to send a short summary of his speech. A detailed report and an article in Region 8 news will be written.

4. Continuous action

It is clear that one of the best way to keep in contact with the chapter chairs is to answer their questions as soon as they ask. The ChCSC chair has his e-mail open for any request.

Collaboration with IEEE EAB staff on setting up a webpage for the new members and investigating programs, benefits and activities for this age group.

Member benefits will include an online e-Zine (monthly).

- Support and empower Pre-University Activities all over the Region
 - TISP Saudi Arabia (20-22 April 2011) successful implementation about 200 IEEE volunteers and school teachers were trained. A follow up training (TISP presentation) to certify 60 teachers was done May 24-25 2011. School teachers will be training other school teachers in September 2011. The Ministry of Education in Saudi Arabia will be evaluating this project with the help of IEEE EAB.
 - o TISP Scotland (14-15 March 2011)
 - TISP remains active in South Africa. EAB will do a follow-up on activities in Zambia (TISP held in Zambia in Sept. 2010). In the pipeline is a proposal for a TISP in Uganda in 2012.
 - Following from Zambia, attendees from Tunisia have also hosted TISP presentations (March 2011) there; EAB has provided a rebate for material costs for the activity. The event is held in cooperation with IEEE entities, including the IEEE Tunisia Section.

TryEngineering was translated to seven languages. This year, it is being translated into Arabic. Saudi Aramco is providing the funding and IEEE Educational Activities Board (EAB) is providing the logistic support. The Arabic translation is expected to be finished by September 2011 (60% is already translated).

Interaction with global level PECC:

Liz Burd, IEEE's Chair (Pre-university Education Coordinating Committee (PECC)), was invited to the previous R8 Committee Meeting held in London. Discussions on how to break the programs on global level down to Region 8 were conducted.

Continuing Education (CE) (Fotini-Niovi Pavlidou)

- Regular communication with Steve Welch and Jill Bagley, IEEE Staff for Continuing Education. Further communication will be established at the Section's Congress: we request interested parties to visit the booth for "Educational Activities."
 - An invited talk will be arranged with IEEE standards personnel in Greece or the broader Balkan area. It will be broadcasted online (planned for September).
 - A workshop to promote the IEEE eLearning library will be organized in Greece. It will be hosted elsewhere via a webinar (planned for September).

Accreditation Activities: (Bakr Hassan)

With regards to accreditation activities, the Region 8 EASC works with IEEE Committee on Global Accreditation Activities (CGAA), a standing committee of the Accreditation Policy Council (APC), IEEE Educational Activities Board (EAB):

Project#1: Accreditation of Computing Programs in South Africa

Meeting summary (adopted from CGAA Meeting of 1 March 2011):

Sinha presented the context of the South African accreditation agency, Engineering Council of South Africa (ECSA), where he mentioned that ECSA currently addresses accreditation requirements in the fields of Engineering and Technology, but is in-view of expanding the approach to include accreditation of certain computing programmes. Sinha also noted a recent ABET accreditation for an informatics programme at the University of Pretoria. The Computer Society Chapter of the IEEE South Africa Section, started dialogue during and after a 2010 visit by Kam (in his role as IEEE president-elect), towards considering bringing the accreditation notion relating to Computing towards ECSA and/or alternative bodies in the South Africa. The mentioned chapter is co-working with other organizations, including SAICIST, BITF, etc.

Project#2: Southern & Eastern Africa

Meeting summary (adopted from CGAA Meeting of 1 March 2011):

Eastern/Southern Africa. Saurabh Sinha reported that a workshop about collaboration among relevant academic and professional organizations in eastern and southern Africa took place on 21 May 2011, Manzini, Swaziland. Some eight (8) engineering councils/bodies partook at the meeting: an overall vision for long-term accreditation (incl. mutual recognition was established). A concept paper is being developed to survey the status of accreditation for engineering, computing and technology programmes. The IEEE Board of Directors supported Ad-Hoc on Africa Activities was represented by the Chair of the Ghana Section.

Meeting summary (adopted from CGAA Meeting of 1 March 2011):

A position paper outlining the potential goals, operating structure, and activities of a Gulf Region accrediting organization is has been completed. The paper, and a draft cover letter, were intended for use by work group members in discussions with officials from existing government-affiliated accrediting organizations in the region. The paper was already sent to some accreditation officials in the region.

 Feedback is awaited from the concept paper and a working group is being put together (under leadership of Bakr Hassan).

Cooperation with other IEEE organization:

EASC is cooperating closely with the IEEE Educational Activities Board (EAB), the IEEE Education Society and others.


Statistics:

A monitoring tool has been installed on our websites. Using the Google(TM) Analytics feature here are presented the statistics were obtained over the period from the 1st of March 2011 to the 1st of August 2011. Over this period, 21,200 people visited the website and 43,200 pages were viewed with our homepage almost hitting 25.00% of the traffic with more than 10,000 page views. On an average visit, a user looks at 2.05 pages, and stays for about a minute and a half.

vTools abbreviation stands for "Volunteer Tools". vTools simplify the administrative tasks to our volunteers via use of online tools, reduce time spent managing activities, and assist in member development.

vTools are developed and made possible by IEEE volunteers. The toolbox simplifies administration by offering web based software, reduces time spent managing activities, and assists in member development.

Currently available tools:

- vTools.Meetings tool for managing section and chapter meetings. Officers can create meeting announcements with no
 dependence on webmaster availability and show them on your website. Members and the public may see and register for
 the upcoming meetings.
- **vTools.WebInABox** wizard to assist officers generate simple section websites in an automated fashion with no dependence on webmaster availability.
- vTools.Voting tool to allow members submit votes in their Section officer elections online.
- **DimDim** a Web Conferencing service to Geographic Organizational Units for online meetings, webinars, training, demos and presentations.
- **vTools.StudentBranchReporting** tool for collecting and searching reports submitted by student branch volunteers such as annual plan and report of activities.
- **FluidSurveys** a Survey tool available to MGA Board members and MGA Board Committees as well as Region and Section EXCOM officers. Tool can be used to quickly create online surveys using intuitive interface and distribite them via Email, Web link, etc. Collected results can be easily analyzed and graphical reports can be shared with others.

A. GENERAL INTRODUCTION

This report is intended to cover the period April-July, 2011. All items highlighted in this report reflect changes to the prior report produced in March 2011 that covers the period October 2010 – March 2011.

The Industry Relations Sub-committee (IRSC) is part of the Technical Activities and is intended to strengthen the relationship with industry by addressing industry requirements for the purpose of fostering better collaboration between IEEE and the industries within R8.

IEEE Region 8 has initiated several initiatives to support the industry such as the Energy Initiative; Industry Continuing Education (ICED) Program as well as the introduction of the new EnergyCon conference. The continuing education and conference activity is held in collaboration with the Educational Activities Sub-committee (EASC) and Conference Coordination Sub-committee (CoCSC), respectively.

IEEE R8 IRSC has focused its efforts in the last several months to introduce new continuing education programs and certification support as well as to support new conferences and symposiums. The IEEE Region 8 Standards Coordinator showed their support to develop specific programs tailored to the industry as well as IEEE Communications Society showed interest in working with IEEE R8 to further their existing certification initiatives. Various Sections showed interest in utilizing the ICED speakers lists that will be developed further as new candidates are introduced

B. IRSC MAIN OBJECTIVES

Among the main objectives of the IRSC are:

- Bridge the gap and enhance relationships between industry, government, academia and IEEE
- Influence industrial organizations to support the involvement of their staff in IEEE activities
- Urge people from industry to join IEEE and benefit from its conferences, products and services.
- Establish and increase contact(s) with industry
- Make industry in Region 8 aware of IEEE
- Advertise and promote IEEE's vision, mission, conferences, products and services to Region 8 industry
- Emphasize mutual benefits and possible cooperation

C. IRSC ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Accomplishments (Oct. 2010 - Mar. 2011)



Energy Initiative: Activities on the Energy Initiative are still ongoing with the main focus in 2010 was to introduce the new EnergyCon conference to region 8. This conference was a major success in all aspects from technical to the overall management of this event. More than 1000 participants attended this conference that was held for the first time in Bahrain during the period December 18-22, 2010. (http://ieee-energycon.org/2010/)

Within this conference IEEE R8 was able to conduct several activities in the same conference venue that reflected positively within our industry. The following were conducted as part of this conference:

- Technical Conference Tracks
- 2. Two days Pre-Conference tutorials
- 3. One Day Standards Workshop (Jointly Organized with IEEE-SA)
- 4. R8 Leadership Workshop
- 5. Women In Engineering (WIE) Forum
- 6. Major Exhibition in IT and Power

Details and lessons learned about this conference will be discussed as part of the CoCSC Meeting that was held on Friday, 25 March 2011.

Another ongoing activity was the creation of special brochure addressed to Energy companies that was completed in April, 2011. Also a list of major Energy Industries within the Gulf countries is currently under enhancements to incorporate new companies along with their main focus areas of interest.

Ahead of the Region 8 meeting (on 24 March 2011), a meeting with the IEEE Standards Association (IEEE-SA) was arranged. The meeting highlighted the role integration of standards education can play for industrial professionals attending IEEE conferences. The particular meeting was co-hosted by IEEE-SA, and the 2011 IEEE-SA President Mills attended the meeting.

ICED Initiative: Industry Continuing Education is considered as one of the main strategic focus for most industries to develop their workforce. IEEE Region 8 realized its importance and has initiated an initiative to support the industry. Various topics of interest have been indentified after consultation with several industries as well as some industry speakers were selected (after careful evaluation) to address some of those topics (refer to the following web link for more details:

http://www.ewh.ieee.org/reg/8/cms/index.php?option=com_content&view=category&layout=blog&id=57&Itemid=400010

Section chairs, society chapter chairs and other IEEE event coordinators can utilize this list to seek services from those Industry lecturers. Funding and request forms were placed online (May 2011) after a successful review by ICED committee members.

Some industry speakers have already presented in the Gulf countries and initial feedback was very positive. It is our plan to capitalize on those speakers and others to support some of the R8 requirements

IRSC Accomplishments (April – July 2011)

Energy Initiative: Activities in this initiative is progressing in several directions. Preparation for Energycon2012 (9-12 Sept. 2012, Florence, Italy) is ongoing and we have identified several industry speakers and tutorials that will be delivered in this conference by capitalizing on the prior success of EnergyCon 2010. Initiated discussions with IEEE Standards Committee during the London meeting to Plan in supporting EnergyCon 2012 similar to the planned activities for EnergyCon2010. This proposal will be discussed with the EnergyCon2012 Organizing Committee to ensure that topics of interest are covered.

Within Saudi Arabia various Industries will be participating in new upcoming events that will be planned in 2012. Various coordination Meetings have already started with our IEEE Saudi Arabia Subsection in Jubail to organize technical as well as educational conferences to be held in Jubail where most Petrochemical industries are located. These events will be supported by the Saudi Arabia Royal Commission in Jubail, IEEE and other bodies who will act as technical co-sponsors of those events.

Certification courses tailored to energy companies will also be established similar to the Wireless Certification course. Meetings with several energy Industries will be planned towards the 4th Quarter of 2011 / 1st quarter 2012 to ensure that all selected courses as well energy industry requirements are being addressed. Standards Courses in various energy related topics will also be addressed during the upcoming planned periods



ICED Initiative: Industry Continuing Education programs will continue to be held in different parts of Region 8. All procedures and guidelines to request Industry Lecturers were posted in region 8 website and being communicated to all region 8 sections. Received several requests and currently in the final stages of identifying one course to be offered in Saudi Arabia and another one in Lebanon. Also Germany section is evaluating the list of speakers as well as we have received request from Iraq section.

Held Meeting (late Apr. 2011) in Saudi Arabia with IEEE Managing Director, Education Activities, IEEE R8 TA Vice-Chair and other members from both education Society, IRSC committee and other invited attendees to discuss Industry requirements for Continuing education programs. Topics of interest were discussed and currently under evaluation by IEEE Education Activities

Also during this period we have started to evaluate establishing an Industry Award whereby selected individuals and companies will receive awards for their active support in bring IEEE closer to the industry.

D. IRSC PLANNED MAJOR ACTIVITIES for 2011

Several activities are currently planned for 2011. To ensure that priority activities are being addressed properly, the upcoming IRSC Meeting/workshops in London addressed key issues related to the industry. The outcome/recommendations of those workshops (March 25, 2011) assisted in shaping IRSC deliverables for 2011 (and will probably impact 2012).

The following are the current planned IRSC major activities for 2011:

- 1. Continue our activities as part of the Energy Initiative and consider request for a new initiative committee (NIC) proposal to expand this effort.
- 2. Capitalize on our success as part of the ICED initiative and start the deployment of industry lecturers in within R8. Finalize the funding procedure and the application request forms.
- 3. Continue the collaboration between IEEE-SA and IEEE Standards Coordinator to support various IEEE events and industry requirements in Region 8.
- 4. Review the possibility of introducing new initiative related to the Environment especially the impact of energy companies on our environment
- 5. Continue collaboration with IEEE R8 Conference Coordination Sub-committee (CoCSC) and insert industry tracks at Regional Conferences as appropriate.
- 6. Explore stronger collaboration with Energy companies in Europe especially in the area of alternative and renewable energy.
- 7. Recruit additional active volunteers and funding as necessary for Region 8 IRSC.

It is envisioned that the role of IEEE R8 IRSC will increase as industry requirements are continuously changing due to new technological development as well as the need for additional services to support the industry. IRSC within IEEE Region 8 will continue to monitor and respond to those changes based on the following focused areas that have been highlighted in the IRSC workshops that was held in London in March, 2011:

- 1. Workforce Development
- 2. Leadership Courses
- 3. Networking forums (Technical and Social)
- 4. Customized Packages for Industry
- 5. Creating Value Proposition
- Establishing Industry Advisory Board
- 7. Creating Industry Awards

Planning for most of the above activities will be started in 2012 but some will be addressed in 2011 such as Workforce development that is currently being done through addressing Continuing education and certifications as well as Creating Industry Awards.

Membership Development Subcommittee (MDSC)

INTRODUCTION

For sections this is usually done via the membership development officer, or the membership development team. However, we feel that many sections underestimate the importance of the MD officer, and many MD officers are only vaguely aware of their responsibilities and the possibilities/tools available to help them in their task. An example is that we get barely any response to emails (even when asking for feedback) and that almost no region 8 membership persons are attending the MD webcasts. We would like to ask all section chairs and MD officers to take MD seriously. MD is more than reporting the membership numbers at the end of the vear...



Deactivated Members - Arrears

IEEE Headquarters in Piscataway have sent out several reminder emails to those members that did not renew. The Region 8 MD committee has sent an email to all members in arrears with a link to a questionnaire asking why they chose not to renew their membership. Results of this questionnaire are presented below.

In the future we should work more in advance by showing more activity in our Sections. We should point out the benefits of membership, especially on the Section level, to encourage members to renew on time (during November, December, January), well before the Service Terminator.




Figure 1: Job description of participants in the questionnaire




Figure 2: Years of IEEE membership

The questionnaire confirmed that over 60 % of those that do not renew are less than 3 years member of IEEE, 1/3rd of the arrears are 1st year members.






Figure 3: Grade description




Figure 3: Reason for joining IEEE

Most members join for publications and conferences, testifying that IEEE in our region is a mostly research oriented organization (as opposed to an engineering association).




Figure 4: Why members did not renew

It is clear from the questionnaire that the average non-renewer was not sufficiently happy with the services that were provided (or might he/she not know of them) or was not able to make good use of IEEE services. Another big reason is a change in career. The personal financial situation is the other main reason for not renewing membership. The economic crisis might play an important role in this factor.

Local activities are essential for membership retention!

We would like to urge all section officials to coordinate IEEE membership promotion at all events in the section and chapters. This will help to make the member and the non-volunteer member aware of all the IEEE activities. For many it is not clear that IEEE is more than just publications and international conferences (or standards). Presenting IEEE in 5 minutes at the beginning of a technical session can make a world of difference.



Rationale: many members have no idea of all the benefits they have (yes, they are "somewhere" on the web) When presenting the IEEE, try to include the different aspects: Technical (societies, publications) and regional (section, student branches and chapters).

E-membership

E-Membership is a new electronic membership to individuals in developing nations.

E-Membership is a paperless membership option with reduced annual base dues. In Region 8 the e-Membership dues are US\$ 63, compared to the traditional membership base dues of US\$ 149.

The new e-Membership option will be offered to both new and renewing professional grade members who live in countries where the per capita Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is under \$15,000, based on data provided by the United Nations. Students and affiliates do not qualify for e-Membership. IEEE membership rates are already discounted for these constituencies, and in fact are less than e-Membership rates.

Section officers in developing nations are encouraged to take the lead on recruitment, and promote the e-Membership option through events and local communications channels.

Member-Get-A-Member Program

The payout for recruited professional members (not students) is 15.00US\$ per member. Recruiters (including student members) have the option of using their reward vouchers to pay for IEEE products or services, including the membership renewal, or they can use the vouchers for a donation to the IEEE Foundation.

Announce and provide information on the Member-Get-A-Member (http://ieee.org/mgm) and Student-Get-A-Student (http://ieee.org/sgs) programs at Section, Student Branch and Chapter Meetings and Conferences. Make it a challenge within your Section to see who will be the best in Membership Development. The reward is more than a 15\$ IEEE credit voucher, it's a bigger organization with better connections into industry and community. If each of us recruited just one new Member, we would double our size in one year!!! But let's increase our membership by 10%. Remember, without Membership Development, we cannot build the IEEE of tomorrow.

Don't Forget - Graduate Student Members Have the Rights and Privileges of Members

According to the IEEE Bylaws the Graduate Student Members shall have the rights and privileges of Members. They can be Section Officers. GS Members are also qualified to sign the petition to establish a new Section – important for new section and new chapter development!

The MD Manual is an essential overview of MD. It includes resources such as the MD calendar and MD checklists. It helps you to coordinate your local efforts with headquarters' programs and processes. 

MD at IEEE Conferences in Region 8

We should continue to use our many conferences in R8 as a platform for IEEE promotion. There should be an IEEE booth or table at the conference with IEEE posters, brochures, magazines and application forms, and a local volunteer hosting the table. Previously we had several successful events at conferences and we are going to continue with the same approach this year.

If your section/chapter is supporting an event (financially?), why shouldn't you have an opportunity to address the attendees during the opening session?

The best way of preparing the necessary arrangements is to find colleagues and friends in our local sections, who are willing to support our promotion events. May we kindly ask you, the Section Chairs and Section MD officers to select conferences in 2011 in your section for promotion, to nominate a volunteer – maybe yourself – and inform us. We will of course work with you and your volunteers to organize the event and get the material shipped from the IEEE staff. Many thanks in advance for your support.

* Special Circumstances

IEEE realizes that economic circumstances may impact some members' ability to pay the full amount of IEEE membership dues. For this reason, the following special circumstance categories have been established. **Special circumstances are not available to Student members and Graduate Student members. Only one category may be claimed in any year.**

Minimum Income Provision: Applicants who certify that their prior year's income did not exceed US \$13,600 or equivalent are granted a 50% reduction in IEEE dues, regional assessment and dues for one IEEE Society and its optional publications. Please submit written certification with application and payment. **Student members are NOT eligible.**

Retired Provision: A retired member, not gainfully employed and not qualifying for Life Member Status, on attaining the age of 62 years, may apply for a 50% reduction in dues and assessments. An individual who qualifies for the IEEE Retired Member category may continue any and all Society memberships held for not less than the 5 prior years. Optional publication fees equal those established for Student members.

Unemployed Provision: A 50% reduction in membership dues, Society dues, other subscriptions and assessments are available to a member or applicant who informs the IEEE Operations Center Office that he/she: (1) has become involuntarily unemployed and is seeking reemployment, or (2) has become voluntarily unemployed for reasons of raising children. A statement of continued unemployment shall be provided with each annual dues payment. In the case of voluntary

Small Sections

The R8 MD Subcommittee initiated a program to increase the membership of small Sections**. We have 56 Sections and 7 Subsections in Region 8. We have large Sections having several hundreds or several thousands of members, but we have also small Sections having even less then hundred members.


At the moment we have 20 Sections having less than 200 professional members (not counting the student and graduate student members). Few of them are new recruits and most of them have been members for years.

** R8 Program to Increase the Membership of Small Sections

The R8 MD Subcommittee initiated a program to increase the membership of small Sections. **We want the small Sections to become bigger and stronger organizations with more volunteers and more activity.**

The best way to maintain and enhance programs and services on the Regional and Section level to our members while holding down or reducing the member cost is to increase the number of members.

Let us try to increase the membership of the small Sections gradually. The goal during the 2011 Membership Year should be to achieve 100 professional members (for Sections having less than 100), 150 members (for Sections having more than 100, but less than 150) and 200 members (for Sections having more than 150, but less than 200 professional members). **To successful Sections in increasing their membership a financial incentive will be provided.**





In order to qualify for the incentive, a Section would have to rise its professional (higher-grade, full dues paying) previous membership level for the current calendar year (using the August membership report as the reference base).

Sections which achieve the goal would receive US\$10 incentive funding for each Professional/higher grade member recruited in that Section during the period September-August above the previous year's total higher grade membership up to 100, 150 or 200 members respectively. "Migrating" members (i.e. members who moved from one region/section to another) would not count.

Transfer would be in a lump sum in the amount determined sometime in early Fall (following release of the August membership report and new membership determination).

Section Incentive Example for a possible case (goal 100 higher-grade members):

Professional/Higher-Grade, Full Dues Paying Members, August 2010: 70 Professional/Higher-Grade, Full Dues Paying Members, August 2011: 108 Professional/Higher-Grade, Full Dues Paying Migrating Members August 2011: 2 Section gualified for the incentive (108-2=106).

Qualifying for Rebate: 100-70=30 Rebate for the Section: US\$ 300.00

Full Dues Paying Members include members using the reduction of dues according to the Special Circumstances.

Milestones:

The membership of Sections can easily be checked every month by the sections themselves. The final results will be known in September 2011.

The program would be for a period of one year, after which it would be assessed and a determination made whether to continue for another year on a permanent basis.

The activity at the Section and Chapter level is of great importance for recruiting and retaining members.

Membership Development is the business of all of us!



2. STRATEGIC PLANNING

Professional Activities Sub-Committee (PASC) is part of IEEE R8 Member Activities. The PASC team is aiming to increase the understanding and acceptance of Professional Activities (PA in short) within Region 8 by providing support and expertise to sections, chapters, societies and student branches within the region.

Professional Activities focus on maintaining and enhancing lifelong employability and career maintenance, while providing advice to and collaboration with public bodies, corporations, NGOs and non-profits to benefit the members, their fields of practice, and the general public, while continuing to promote ethical conduct.

MAJOR GOALS

The PASC team has set three main goals set at the begging of the year:

- Creation of a platform for members where they can learn how to improve themselves as individuals as well as experts in their respective fields. Professional Activities should provide a place for interdisciplinary collaboration and networking.
- Establish a program of Professional Activities for Region 8 and thus increase the value and worth of IEEE membership for all members of Region 8.
- Increase the understanding and the extent of Professional Activities within Region 8 by providing support and expertise to sections, chapters, societies and student branches within the region.

SPECIFIC GOALS

- Continue the Professional Activities workshops with current and new trainers from different regions and new workshop topics. Increase the number of trainers available to PA activities. Establish contacts with local event organizers.
- Improved utilization of technical support for PA activities available from IEEE headquarters.
- Long term plan is to establish a series of PA Summits as a regional events, possibly jointly organized with an existing conference/congress and student/GOLD events.
- Improved PA role and visibility in Region 8: publicize the PA activities by written material and different electronic media.



3. REPORT

ACTIONS TAKEN

In the first half of 2011 actions were conducted in order to increase the level of activities and the understanding within the region:

- Conducted monthly online meetings, and a face to team face meeting in London.
- Formation of a web page with details on PA activities and contacts. Established LinkedIn discussion group with 111 active members.
- Sections contacted to organize events to increase the level of activities within the region. Several workshops already conducted and a number in the planning phase (details given below).
- Sections contacted to propose new PA trainers/speakers to increase the available volunteers and PA topics in Region 8.
- Set of criteria for approving PA events and trainers is in preparation for PA manual update.
- Established active contacts with other committees and IEEE bodies, e.g. IEEE Professional Communication Society.

REPORT ON LONDON MEETING

On Friday March 25 2011 PASC team presented PA activities to Section chairs and other IEEE volunteers.

- 1. This was the first face to face meeting of the committee where each team member presented his area and tasks followed by an open discussion with the team members and the audience in the room. Since several new sections chairs were expected a general introduction to Professional Activities was given.
- 2. As a result we can conclude that presentations and topics that were discussed are relevant and well accepted by section chairs as IEEE staff present in the room. The PASC team activities also included a poster presenting PA plans and goals in Region 8 and handout of PA booklet with additional information and contacts.
- 3. The team is in contact with IEEE staff responsible for PA activities. Several new initiatives for PA events in sections were started and are now in the planning phase. Details are given below.
- 4. The idea would be that sub-committees should meet in closed meetings as well. Such meeting would help the teams to work on open questions that were not resolved with online meetings.
- 5. The PASC team submitted two proposals for the Sections Congress. Details are given below.

During the R8 Committee meeting in London additional activities included:

- Sections Chairs informed about Professional Activities and asked to appoint a PA volunteer in case their section does not have an active volunteer already.
- PA handbooks and poster and PASC meeting to raise awareness and to motivate sections to organize PA events.
- Contacts with IEEE staff, leaders and societies.
- Two initiative proposed for SC by PASC team: Thought Leader program and PA Affinity group creation (details given below).

CURRENT STATUS ON THE TARGETED GOALS

PA volunteers in Sections:

Communication with sections to appoint a PA volunteer in each section. <u>Currently, there are 38 (out of 56) sections that do not have a volunteer for Professional Activities listed on their web sites.</u> Active collaboration of Section chairs is needed. PASC team is asking sections that do not have yet a PA volunteer to appoint a person and report the name to PASC team. For assistance please contact Jan Haase.

• Formation of a database for Region 8 approved speakers and workshop organizers.

PASC is setting up a web page that would put together information about PA events and PA trainers/presenters all around R8 (56 Sections). The action is led by Emilio Corchado.



18-19 of August 2011 San Francisco

Sections that already have appointed PA volunteers are kindly asked to report their activities and best practices as well as to propose speakers/trainers to PASC team. We intend to collect PA activities in your section on promote them on web portal.

Continue the Professional Activities workshops

Collaboration with other committees is initiated to plan common PA events, e.g. Professional Communication Society speaker Hazel Sales at UKRI SBC in autumn this year. For information please contact Urmet Janes.

New workshop formats planned, e.g. Thought Leadership Program in preparation. Draft proposal submitted by Han van Loon.

In 2011 PA workshops were organized by PASC team and corresponding Sections in Kuwait, Qatar, Morocco, several others in the planning phase. New topics requested by the audience such as Technical writing, Knowledge Cafe, etc.

TWO INNITIATIVES PROPOSED BY PASC TEAM

Thought Leadership Program

In similar manner to the Distinguished Lecturer program for technical activities, create a Thought Leader program focused on Professional Activities.

Creation of official Professional Activities Affinity Groups

Affinity Groups (AG) creation would facilitate Professional Activities at section level. Annual budget should be provided within MGA with fixed amount for individual event per Affinity Group.

PLANNED ACTIVITIES

The Region8 Professional Activities plans to:

- Increase the visibility of PA within the region through written material that includes information about Region8 PA, workshops organization, etc. PASC is presenting at Sections Congress in San Francisco.
- Organize smaller regional Professional Activities Summits to train the future trainers in Region8 and to increase
 the number of volunteers involved in PA. Currently we are planning events in Jordan, Saudi Arabia (EAST and
 West) and Spain Sections.
- Provide an updated PA Handbook manual to guide organization of PA events in sections.
- Implement the Though Leadership Program in Region 8 with organization of pilot events.

Given the substantial failure of plan A (reaching out through Section chairs), we are now envisioning a short questionnaire to R8 members to analyse their interest and get important feedback on how to help penetration of Xplore in the region.

Status

Initial planning stage.

Getting in touch with national and sister societies to help penetration of Xplore access

Overview



The idea is to help PSBS broker deals with national/sister societies and orders to get their members access to Xplore at conditions tailored to the specific Sections.

<u>Status</u>

Chairs have sent limited feedback/contacts on this. Contacts are currently being developed (but still in a very early stage unluckily, working our way through layers of very slow organizations):

- Italy: good contacts with CNI (the national body of engineering), which is unluckily paralized due to an electoral issue
- Algeria: trying hard to reach out to the National Administration of Scientific Research (http://www.nasr-dz.org/contact.php) which is the entity that can broker us a deal for the universities there
- Malta: with the help of chair Mr. Micallef trying to reach out to Chamber of Engineering (President of the Chamber, Mr. Saviour Baldacchino, <u>coe@maltanet.net</u>). Involved Paul Canning on the staff.
- Russia NW: Russian Association for Engineering Education (<u>www.raee.ru</u>) should be the right way to get in, the Section chair is trying to help by figuring out the right contact inside.

Algeria access to Xplore

Overview

An early task was to help PSBS staff identify appropriate contacts for Algerian institutions and universities.

<u>Status</u>

Sent out a mailing to selected members in Algeria. Through one of them, we had a suggestion to go through the National Administration of Scientific Research (http://www.nasr-dz.org/contact.php) which is the entity that can broker us a deal for the universities there. However, attempts to get in touch with this entity failed until now.

As a side effect of this contact, renewed interest for forming a subsection in Algeria was showed, and initial contacts were directed to Aleksandar Szabo for follow-up.

Goal 2) Acquisition of publications from sister and national societies

Collecting names and contacts for relevant national publications to include in Xplore

Overview

The idea is to help PSPB acquire interesting journals or proceedings from national societies to enrich Xplore and make it even more relevant at R8 level.

Status

Chairs have sent VERY limited feedback/contacts on this. Contacts are currently being developed only with Russia NW section, which started publishing its own Proceedings as a collection of papers presented by Section members at all kinds of local IEEE events (including the student members conference) and would like to include it in Xplore. So far no mention of relevant national publications has been received.

Goals and status

The major tasks assigned to the IEEE R8 Standards Coordinator for 2011, with the current status, are summarized below.

Conferences and Workshops

Standards speakers and tracks at conferences

Overview

Arrange both individual speakers on standards and/or whole standards tracks at major IEEE R8 conferences as well as speakers on standards for other events within IEEE R8.

Status

Arranged a speaker for the IEEE UKRI Section Student Branch Congress taking place at Queen Mary University in London in early September.

Arranged a 'Demystifying IEEE 802 Standards' track at AFRICON 2011 co-sponsored by IEEE R8, IEEE-SA and the IEEE Standards Education Committee. The speaker will be Jon Rosdhal who is the IEEE 802.11 Vice-chair, and has previously served on the WiMedia Alliance and ZigBee Alliance Board of Directors as Vice President and Treasurer, respectively.

The IEEE Standards Education Committee (SEC) is working with the student branch and professors at Queen Mary University in London to sponsor a Standards Education Workshop in late September 2011. The IEEE SEC is proposing a program that would include a Consensus-Building Exercise in which all workshop participants are presented with a scenario that requires their group to reach consensus. Desire is to have the workshop involve students, professors and practicing professionals from the London area.

Standards workshops for sections

Overview

The local section will provide the logistical support and promote the event to local industry and IEEE members. The IEEE R8 standards coordinator will apply for funding from the IEEE Standards Education Speakers Bureau for the speakers. There may also be some additional limited support available for items such as promotion for the event. It is hoped that the IEEE-SA will support these workshops through inviting participation from local standards bodies however the IEEE-SA is still considering this request.

The format of the workshop would be:

- 1. IEEE Standards (overview, process, participation)
- 2. Segment on chosen technology area (e.g., IEEE 802 wireless, Smart Grid)
- 3. Segment from local standards organizations (contact supplied by IEEE-SA)

The programme, to an extent, is analogous to the distinguished lecturer programme (DLP) from IEEE societies.

Status

Both the Denmark and Benelux section chairs have been contacted by IEEE-SA asking that a Standards Education Speakers Bureau request as they have expressed interest in holding one of these events.

Standards education

Standards education – Student mini-grants program



Overview

Encourage IEEE R8 students and faculty mentors to apply for <u>IEEE Standards Education Committee</u> <u>mini-grants program</u> to help with graduate and capstone design projects with an industry standards component. The IEEE then publishes the results as a Student Application Paper.

Status

Continuing to promote grants through web site, university outreach.

The IEEE is partnering with Microsoft Corporation to pilot joint IEEE-Microsoft Student Application Paper grants for Sub-Saharan Africa. The two orginisations will jointly fund and promote Student Application Paper grants in this geography. This is a pilot extension of the Student Application Papers grant program and looking to expand this pilot approach in other areas of IEEE R8 with other partners.

Standards education – University outreach

Overview

The IEEE SEC has been visiting universities worldwide to meet with faculty and administrators for an exchange of views and data gathering in respect to the inclusion of standard in the engineering curriculum.

<u>Status</u>

University outreach visits occurred in March 2011, with the help of a number of the UKRI members, to Strathclyde University, Durham University, Kingston University London, Imperial College London and Queen Mary, University of London. The visits are now complete and the information gathered from University Outreach will be used to develop a business plan for standards-related university products and services.

Student paper competitions

Overview

Arrange student paper competitions in IEEE R8 with the cooperation of the IEEE SEC.

Status

Made in Egypt Women in Engineering Student Paper Contest

In support of the IEEE Made in Egypt, the IEEE SEC is sponsoring a Made in Egypt WIE Student Paper Contest in conjunction with IEEE Made in Egypt competition for undergraduate students on the subject of 'The use of industry standards in the development of projects for the Made in Egypt competition'. Submission deadline is 5 August 2011, \$500 first prize, \$300 second prize. A minimum of one author must be a member of IEEE Egypt WIE affinity group.

UK and Republic of Ireland (UKRI) Student Paper Contest

In support of the UK and Republic of Ireland (UKRI) Section Student Branch Congress the IEEE SEC is sponsoring a Student Paper Contest for the UK and Republic of Ireland (UKRI) Section. The subject is of 'The interrelationship of the IEEE 802 suite of networking standards'. Submission deadline is 29 July 2011. \$500 first prize, \$300 second prize.

- Need a good reason to change it

Issues for further consideration

- ✓ There is a need to engage with the European Commission on behalf of our EU members in the Region to influence policy on regulation, education, etc.
 - It may be more influential for IEEE as a transnational entity to talk to the EC than multiple national societies.
 - This is not a reason to sub-divide the Region, but we should create a mechanism, taking advantage of the new office in Brussels, to represent our EU members to the EC.
- ✓ Encouraging paired Sections
 - · Well-established Sections partnering with newer Sections.
- ✓ Investigate unifying some very small sections
 - · Could undertake more activities
 - · Viability of Chapters

B. Region 8 Committee

At present the Committee is large and meets face-to-face twice per year.

Pro: The face-to-face meetings build community and allow members to share their experiences.

Because a large proportion of the committee changes annually, members benefit from two meetings per year

Con: Increase in cost if the number of Sections increases

Challenge to find suitable venues for larger meetings

Conclusion

The group supported the proposal that the Region 8 Committee meetings should continue as at present while the Region can afford it.

3 Cooperation with industry

The following areas were identified as key items to be addressed to strengthen such relationship between IEEE R8 and the Industry:

- 1. Define Benefits gained by Industry in establishing relationship with IEEE (Quantify the benefits in \$ value). Some examples include:
 - a. Continuing Education for industry professionals
 - b. Leadership /Soft skills Development
 - c. Research and Development support
- Find ways to reach to the industry (In Road to the Industry).
 In other words what should we do to be accepted by the industry (and not to be considered as a threat to such industries)
- 3. Provide Complete IEEE focused packages to various industry sectors.
- 4. Enhance IEEE Image within the industry as well as IEEE members image
- 5. Improve communications and networking with the industry at all levels
- 6. Involve Industry with major IEEE Activities and Initiatives

Note: It was indicated in the workshop that responsibilities for all actions need to be identified and monitored periodically.





The Industry Relations Subcommittee (IRSC) has also developed a detailed plan for 2011/2012 activities as part of a workshop conducted on Friday March 25, 2011. This plan was presented on Saturday, March 26, 2011 as part of the IEEE R8 Committee main Meeting. The SP workshop findings coupled with the IRSC submitted plans and findings could be used as a main input to our Strategic Directions of IEEE R8.

4 Cooperation with national and regional Associations and Organizations

A. National Societies

National Societies covering the fields of interest of IEEE are very diverse in many respects (multiplicity of Societies; some are very week, but some have legal status with authority to confer registration-status on approved members of the engineering profession; some are formally linked to national governments, but the others are independent, etc)

As an example of the multiplicity of societies that can exist in one country which are of potential interest to IEEE, can be even such small country like Estonia (new IEEE Section): Association for Electrical Power Engineering Estonia, Estonian Electronics Society, Estonian Society for Biomedical Engineering and Medical Physics, Põlva Association of Engineers, Estonian Systems Engineering Society.

The relationship between IEEE and each of the National Societies may be one of cooperation or one of competition. In many countries (mostly European) IEEE has signed MoU's with leading National associations and has established effective cooperation. There are a number of examples in Region 8 of excellent relationships with National Societies in countries with very big and old Sections, e.g. *the Royal Academy of Engineering Societies* in Sweden or IEEE Germany Section and *VDE* have shared office and secretarial resources for many years.

Suggestions:

- IEEE Region 8 should encourage cooperation rather than competition with local National Societies
- IEEE Region 8 has the collective expertise to advise IEEE volunteers in other Regions and IEEE staff about a sensible approach and the avoidance of bad impressions being created by its some transnational initiatives
- IEEE Region 8 should work with IEEE Societies to discourage them from holding major events in parts of Region 8 without first making contacts with the local Section, Chapter and, where appropriate, National Society.

B. Regional Societies and Organizations

There are many regional organizations in different areas of our Region (Europe, Africa and Middle East), but associations of a technical nature dominate in Europe, for example: European Microwave Association (EuMA) and European Association on Antennas and Propagation(EurAAP) with individual membership (over 1000 members); Fédération Européenne d'Associations Nationales d'Ingénieurs (FEANI) - an association of engineering societies with member countries (over 30). Some of them have structure similar like IEEE, some are quite different.

Suggestions:

- IEEE R8 should investigate charitable foundations and European Commission schemes to ascertain whether any are appropriate for cooperation.
- IEEE R8 should support cooperation between such organizations like EuMA or EurAAP and relevant technical Societies (eg. MTT-S, AP-S).
- IEEE R8 should strongly support cooperation between IEEE SA and relevant EU Committees


