

The Young Scientists Competition will be organized as a part of the MIKON-2010 Conference. Eligible candidates i.e., Students, Ph.D. Students or young engineers, under 35 years of age, must be first authors and they must present their original works at oral or poster sessions during the Conference. In the case of a paper co-authored by an advisor, the latter should sign the declaration – to be attached to the submission – that the work is primarily the one of the candidate.

CONTRIBUTIONS

A complete manuscript in English describing new work in the areas of Conference Topics should be prepared in the .pdf format and submitted following the detailed instructions presented at the conference web page: www.mikon-2010.org by January 15, 2010. Full text of the paper should occupy no more than four (but no less than three) A4 pages including figures, tables, and references.

The submissions will be peer reviewed. All correspondence from the organizers will be addressed to the first author of the paper. Notification of acceptance will be E-mailed by March 15, 2010.

All contributions presented in oral and poster sessions will be published in the Conference Proceedings and CD. As in the previous conferences, they will be later made available to the public through the IEEE Xplore web page. The authors who wish to restrict the publication of the full paper may prepare a two-page summary to be available through the IEEE Xplore.

Advanced negotiations are taking place about special issues of internationally recognized peer reviewed journals in which a selection of MIKON papers will be published after the conference. It is planned that more than one journal will be available to the MIKON authors (depending on the topic of the paper). Please follow the news at the MIKON 2010 web page.
