## Introduction

The IEEE Region 8 Student and Young Professional Congress (SYP Congress) is the biggest IEEE event for student members and young professionals in Region 8. ## The Job Description

- 5 days
- Summer 2016 (July, August)
- 400+ participants with diverse cultural background

## Submitting a Proposal

The submission is a multi-stage process.

### 1<sup>st</sup> Stage

A first, optional two-A4 page proposal shall be submitted until 15th of April 2015. This proposal should include essential items as: date, location, team, why your SB, ideas for the program, etc. Based on this 1<sup>st</sup> stage proposal, we will provide valuable feedback and suggestions to make your final proposal shine! Please submit first proposal with subject "IEEE R8 SYP First Proposal-<Name of SB>" to [r8sac@ieee.org](mailto:r8sac@ieee.org)

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Stage

The final proposal shall be submitted by 30<sup>th</sup> of June 2015. This proposal will be used to evaluate the ability of the candidate to host the IEEE R8 SYP Congress 2016. The final decision regarding the host of SYP Congress 2016 will be announced on 31<sup>st</sup> of July 2015. All deadlines are firm! Please submit your proposal with subject "IEEE R8 SYP Final Proposal-<Name of SB>" to [r8sac@ieee.org](mailto:r8sac@ieee.org)

## Suggestions for a Great Proposal

- Present your city (history, sightseeing, ...)
- Show that you have a great team that is experienced enough for the job and that members of your team have participated in a previous edition of the Congress
- Show that you have the infrastructure to host the event, which includes:
  - housing
  - transportation + travel options
  - catering (keep in mind the diverse dietary needs)
  - facilities for workshops, panel sessions, ...
  - facilities for social events
  - Include a preliminary schedule
- Show that you have support from local organizations, companies and other entities (e.g., your IEEE section, IEEE chapters, your university, companies, local authorities, sponsors, etc ...)
- Include a budget estimation
- Be innovative and creative

## Rules for Applying to Host the Region 8 Student and Young Professional Congress

1. Proposals must comply with the requirements specified in the call for proposals.
2. The final proposal must not exceed 25 A4 pages. Support letters are not part of the 25 pages and may be added in an appendix.
3. The final proposal must be printable and only the information printable will be used for judging e.g. embedded movies or linked content will not be considered
4. If contestants do publicise their intention to submit a proposal, it must be in a way that makes it clear for an outsider that the final decision is still pending e. g. creating a facebook page entitled “IEEE Region 8 Student and Young Professional Congress 2016 in XYZ” violates this rule, as some people might be led to believe that the SYP will actually be in XYZ. In general Region 8 SAC advises against creating an online presence prior to the final decision.
5. The proposals should and must remain private.

Failing to comply with any of those rules may result in the rejection of your proposal.
