Realizing the goals

Issues to deal with locally

- Extensive geographic area coverage
- Disparities in size between Sections
- Differences in cultural viewpoints
- Geopolitical issues
- Disparities in wealth between Sections
- Limited officer turnover
- English as a second language

Not: one size fits all What works in one Section might not work in an other Section



Basic building blocks for each Section

- Maintaining continuity of Section activities
- Regular planning of activities
- Supporting volunteers through training
- Encouraging volunteering through recognition
- Using available tools effectively
- Understanding Governance

- Engage in partnerships with other associations, geo units and industry
- Promote IEEE in your local community

- Show responsible planning and management of resources

Some best practices (from 2010 survey)

- Update Section web site regularly monthly
- Have annual Awards program
- Conduct annual social event with Section members
- Conduct joint events with other professional (non-IEEE) organizations
- Conduct events with students; include students and / young members (GOLD) in all activities
- Personal contact with members via telephone, email and welcome notes
- Get member feedback via Section survey
- Section self assessment to establish annual goals and deliverables (topic for the GeoUnit Operations Support Committee)

- Let your report show your vitality

- Inform us about your best practices
- Do not hesitate to tell us your points of concerns and topics that should be discussed in the future
- In general: Concentrate on the vitality-related success factors mentioned before



- Do not report on Section officers (p.21), membership data (p.45) and meetings data (p.46); I will take care of that.
- Important: Sections should check the roster regularly for correctness and report their meetings as soon as possible at *scs-officer-report@ieee.org*.

Sections shall prepare a one-page summary about such (vitality-related) things as:

1. Highlights from the past

- Noteworthy events organized by your Section or its Chapters
- Regional and global events hosted by your Section
- Milestone ceremonies

2. Future activities

- Noteworthy events organized by your Section, its Chapters or its Student Branches
- Regional and global events hosted by your Section
- Milestone ceremonies
- ...
- **3. Best practices**
- **4.** Points of concern/Topics for future discussion
- 5. Miscellaneous
- Awards and other signs of recognition
- Distinguished Lecturers programs
- National Society Agreements
- New Geographic Units (Chap, AG, SB, SB Chap)





Concentrate on vitality-related success factors

- Show how you engage your Members, Chapters, Student Branches, and Affinity Groups
- Show how you engage in partnerships with other associations, geo units and industry
- Show how you promote IEEE in your local community
- Show how you embrace new technology opportunities
- Show the programs that reflect your section's strengths and interests
- Show your financial stewardship (i.e. responsible planning and management of resources)
