14 February 1962

Informal meeting of the Inter-Sectional Committee, Europe (4 Sections: Benelux, France, Geneva, Italy).

6 March 1962

Sending of a petition (by the Benelux Section) to the IRE Board of Directors to form a new Region, with its territory based on the European Broadcasting Area (Greater Europe) defined in the Radio Regulations of the International Telecommunication Union.

The **European Broadcasting Area** includes the Western part of the USSR and the territories bordering on the Mediterranean.



24 April 1962

Approval of a new Region (Region 9 = Greater Europe) by the IRE Executive Committee.

24 May 1962

Final approval of this new Region by the IRE Board of Directors.

6 June 1962

Inaugural Regional Committee meeting (12 participants) in Geneva, ITU Building. 6 Sections: Benelux, Egypt (not present), France, Geneva, Israel, Italy.

22 October 1962

Second IRE Region 9 Committee meeting. 7 Sections; new Section UKRI (10-07-1962).



I January 1963

Merger of IRE and AIEEE to form IEEE.

8 January 1963

Re-approval by the IEEE Board of Directors (after the merger): renaming of IRE Region 9 to IEEE Region 8.

22 April 1963

First IEEE Region 8 Committee meeting 8 Sections; new Section Norway (28-03-1963).

4 November 1963

Second IEEE Region 8 Committee meeting 9 Sections; new Section Germany (22-04-1963).



The IEEE Regions

After the merger, USA formed Regions 1-6; Canada was Region 7; Region 8 comprised Europe, Middle East and North Africa; 'the rest of the world' was Region 9.

1966

Region 9 was limited to South America; 'the rest of the world' was now Region 10. When the South Africa and Nigeria Sections were founded (5 August 1977 and 12 January 1978), they were part of Region 10.

June 1981

The whole of Africa (including South Africa and Nigeria) is now part of Region 8; Region 8 gets its present form.
