# **IEEE – HKN MERGER**

#### What is IEEE-HKN?

#### – First honor society within IEEE

- An Honor Society is an organization, within a specific academic discipline, that:
  - Recognizes excellence among peers
  - Recognizes students who excel academically or as leaders among their peers
- Formed on 1 September 2010 following a merger between IEEE and Eta Kappa Nu Association (HKN)
- Dedicated to encouraging and recognizing excellence in the IEEE-designated fields of interest
- Membership consists of students, alumni, and other professionals who have demonstrated exceptional academic and professional accomplishments





# **Why IEEE-HKN for Students?**

- Membership in IEEE-HKN recognizes a student's academic achievement, as well as his/her potential as a leader, both in school and in their professional careers
- IEEE-HKN will have programs that explicitly identify and encourage young potential leaders while they are still undergraduate students
- IEEE-HKN will recognize and organize faculty leaders and outstanding young practitioners
- Having a category called IEEE-HKN Member can be a powerful inducement
  - Maintain retention of Students, or Graduate Students, as members of IEEE after graduation
  - IEEE's only categories of honor recognition for regular Members is Senior Member and Fellow





### First Steps to Establishing a Chapter

- University/College must offer undergraduate or graduate degree programs leading to a first professional degree in an IEEE-designated field of interest (typically Bachelor of Science, or Bachelor of Engineering, and in some areas Master of Science or Master of Engineering)
- All programs must meet the requirements of a recognized regional or professional accrediting agency
- Department Chair, Dean, School Chancellor, and other appropriate administrators must support formation of a chapter on campus
- A minimum of eight (8), and no more than 20, eligible students must be identified to establish a new chapter, submit specific paperwork, and become charter members of the chapter



A Faculty Advisor to the chapter must be appointed



- Who is qualified for membership?
  - Students pursuing courses leading to a first professional degree in an IEEE-designated field of interest and who have completed
    - At least <u>one-third of the degree requirements</u> and who have a cumulative scholastic rank in the upper fifth of their class
    - <u>One-half of the degree requirements</u> and who have a cumulative scholastic rank in the upper quarter of their class
    - <u>Three-fourths of their degree requirements</u> and have a cumulative scholastic rank in the upper third of their class





designated fields of interest

- Who is qualified for membership? (cont'd)
  - Graduate Students who have graduated with a first professional degree from a school of recognized standing and possess the same scholastic and other qualifications required for undergraduate candidates
  - Faculty members whose principal areas of professional interests fall within the IEEEdesignated fields of interest
  - Professionals who have done meritorious work in an area that falls within one of the IEEE-

#### Other requirements

- Candidate shall be a member of IEEE or join simultaneously at time of induction
- Induction fee in 2011 is USD 50.00
- Induction fee in 2012 is USD 60.00
  - Includes 1-year FREE membership to Student Members and Graduate Student Members
  - Includes 2-year subscription to The Bridge





- What must be submitted to establish a chapter?
  - A written statement (letter) in support of the formation of the new chapter on campus
  - A statement (letter) detailing the IEEE Technical Fields of Interest degree programs at the University





- What must be submitted to establish a chapter? (cont'd)
  - A letter (petition) signed by the charter members to form the chapter
  - A Notice of Election of Officers Form listing the interim chapter officers and Faculty Advisor responsible for chapter formation and subsequent operation <u>http://hkn.org/pdfs/notice\_election2010.pdf</u>





- What must be submitted to establish a chapter? (cont'd)
  - A New Member Requisition Form listing charter members' contact info and graduation date
