## 2. Meeting in London March 25<sup>th</sup>, 2011

44 people attended including 23 society representatives. We had a detailed presentation of IEEE vTools and 8 representatives made a presentation that was the opportunity for fruitful discussion. Some important points have been discussed. Roger Pollard, past VP (TAB) and Candidate for IEEE President – 2013 also lead an active discussion at the meeting in London.

# 2.1. Chapters identification

We could have a map with a list of all chapters in each section, with direct link to their website and e-mail address of the chapter chair. One can increase the local collaboration among chapters/societies.

It is important to have a good communication with chapters. Some chapter chairs never answer. In order to keep a better contact with the chapters, it is wiser to have several contact names for each chapter.

The constituency of the chapters is an interesting datum (students, GOLD, retirees, academics, industry).

The ChCSC undertakes to further communication with IEEE staff in Piscataway to identify future opportunities for new chapters, and to establish relevant links with society representatives, in a way to expedite this process.

#### 2.2. Communication with the chapters

Chapter meetings are a good tool to remain in touch with the chapters. Chapter chair training is important, in particular from SAMIEEE and vTools.

#### 2.3. Help to the chapters

Societies give annual subsidies to chapters. The application deadline may be different according to the society. Many societies complain because few chapters ask for *additional* subsidies. Societies also give subsidies for special events organized by the



chapters. The Distinguished Lecturers program is a nice tool for the chapters. Societies may contribute to the travel expenses to attend the CCM.

## 2.4. Duties of chapters

Chapters must communicate with its members (mailing list, e-notice), with the section and with the society. Chapter chairs must not forget that they must be related both to the section and the society. The region, via it's ChCSC, provides oversight to the referred operation.

Chapters must promote IEEE and the society. They may use membership development material that is available from IEEE.

Chapters must promote member elevation (engage members to apply for seniormember and find nominators for fellows).

Chapter web news allows members to be informed of the chapter activities.

Every year, the chapter must remind its member to renew.

The chapters must identify the member needs. The needs are different from the technical meetings.

#### 2.5. Suggestions to chapters

Chapters may organize their own awards.

IM has a chapter development program. IA organizes a chapter web contest.

Technical activities may be common to several chapters. It could be in cooperation between chapters of different societies in the same section or of different sections in the same society or both. The Region also provides chapter awards, and the process for 2012 will be an online application (to be distributed following the meeting in San Francisco).

#### 2.6. New chapters

Section should help to the constitution of petitions. Some societies give a new chapter support. AdCom members and DL should attend the first meeting of a new chapter.

# 3. Chapter chair meeting in Bucharest June 29<sup>th</sup>, 2011

The meeting was locally organized by Dr. Mihala Albu and Prof. Nicolae Tapus.

There were 26 attendees from Romania, Germany, Serbia-Montenegro, Italy, Israel. Some chapter chairs could not attend but sent their presentations from Morocco, Tunisia, Poland and Sweden.

The presentation of the rights and duties for chapters has been greatly appreciated. The Region 8 ChCSC website provides a link to additional training material. Many questions have been asked and many of them need to contact officers from Region 8 and MGA. The questions will be written in detail and forwarded to the right person. Among the questions: conference sponsorship, reviewers' evaluation, distribution of the rebates between the sections and the chapters.

All the participants have been invited to send a short summary of his speech. A detailed report and an article in Region 8 news will be written.

#### 4. Continuous action

It is clear that one of the best way to keep in contact with the chapter chairs is to answer their questions as soon as they ask. The ChCSC chair has his e-mail open for any request.
