Best practices:

The IEEE student membership is probably the largest in Region 8, both in total numbers (593), and in percentage (67%). This is particularly impressive with the total population of Lebanon being no more than 4 million. Indeed the students were very active for over ten years before the establishment of the IEEE Lebanon Section. They have received the first prize for their web site for region Region 8 and came in second globally (second to Arizona State University). They have been very active in meetings exhibitions work shops and conferences. AUB (American University of Beirut) have established a yearly student conference with the contributed papers being mostly based on the students final year projects. We would like students from other sections to participate in the conference.



The four student branches in Lebanon are organising the first S-PAC activity by holding a full day workshop at Berytech and industry incubators. Lectures will focus on best business practices for students interested in launching their own business.

Topic to be discussed in Sofia:
