IEEE Region 8 Membership – More than 60,000 !!!

According to the Membership Statistics by **31 December 2006** our Region had **60,856** members. Comparing to December 2005 it is an **increase of 3,903 members or 6.9%.** For the first time we have **more than 60,000 members** in our Region.

Arrears – Most Important Issue for the Moment

The number of arrears in February 2006, after the Service Terminator action, was very high in our Region. To prevent such a situation in 2007 we should take action in advance, especially on the Section level, to **encourage members to renew on time**, well before the **Service Terminator Action on 23 February**. On 2 Feb an e-mail has been sent by Aleksandar to all Sections asking them to take action. The 29 Jan-Pre-Terminator Arrears list, a sample letter and a list of Membership Benefits have been attached. MD officers should frequently **use SAMIEEE to indentify members who didn't renew.** Go to http://www.ieee.org/organizations/vols/samieee/

Look for every member's **last paid year**. Call or send kind letters to members whose last paid year is still 2006 asking them to renew. Show and explain them **the benefits** http://ieee.org/web/volunteers/membership_dev/benefits.html

The Half-Year Dues Period – Action to Start Very Soon

The half-year dues period is a peak recruitment time. It allows people to test IEEE membership for a smaller initial fee. New members pay half-year dues when they sign up from 1 March through 31 August. Services commence immediately upon joining and continue through December 31. A member joining in March receives a bonus of 4 months of extra service above and beyond the six months they are paying for. Member-Get-A-Member Program Gets an Upgrade for 2007

Beginning in September, the payout for recruited professional members (not students) was **raised from 5.00 to 15.00US\$ per member**. Recruiters (including student members) have the option of using their reward vouchers to pay for IEEE products or services, including the membership renewal, or they can use the vouchers for a donation to the IEEE Foundation.

Announce and provide information on the Member-Get-A-Member (http://ieee.org/mgm) and Student-Get-A-Student (http://ieee.org/sgs) programs at Section, Student Branch and Chapter Meetings and Conferences. **Make it a** challenge within your Section to see who will be the best in Membership Development. The reward is more than a 15\$ IEEE credit voucher, it's a bigger organization with better connections into industry and community. If each of us recruited just one new Member, we would double our size in one year!!! But let's increase our membership by 10%. Remember, without Membership Development, we cannot build the IEEE of tomorrow.

Membership in R8 Sections

Some of our Sections like UK&RI, Germany, Spain, France, Benelux etc. have many members. Maybe they should take into consideration the formation of an MD Team with members in different areas/towns of the country to do the MD job more easily. Most Sections are doing well. Get new members and don't loose existing members!

Appoint Section Membership Development Officers!

We all, the members and volunteers in IEEE, should be aware that Membership Development on all levels and especially on the section level is of extrem importance to get more members, new volunteers and more activity.

From the IEEE database I learned that many sections in R8 have not appointed a Section Committee member taking care of Membership Development! We still have more than 30% of Sections in R8 not having MD Officers! As soon as possible these sections should appoint MD Officers willing to do their job with enjoyment and without sparing efforts! In the case you still cannot find a volunteer for the MD Officer job, one of the existing Section officers (chair, vice-chair or secretary) should be appointed and take the job and the responsibility for Section Membership Development. We are asking all sections not having MD Officers to appoint them and send to IEEE their names together with other officer names in the Anual Officer Report Form, so that MD Officer names appear in the IEEE database together with other Section Officers. We need to have an active contact MD person in every Section.

Without Membership Development there is no future for IEEE!
