Size of a Section

'Average' Region 8 Section

- 1,100 Members
(largest ca. 9,000)
(median ca. 500)
(smallest ca. 50)

- 18 OU's
(with ca. 40 members)
 - 9 Chapters
 - 1 Affinity Group
 - 6 Student Branches
 - 1 Student Branch Chapter
 - 1 Student Branch Affinity group



Size of a Section

- With a few exceptions, we see that small Sections show a low activity.
- New Sections shall start as a Subsection; it is then stimulated to grow and become active.
- Transition to a Section is possible when the number of members and the number of OUs reach (typically) 200-250 and 4-5, respectively; Section vitality is the main criterion!
- Existing small-size Sections are stimulated to grow.

Rejuvenation of the Section's ExCom

MGA rules for officer terms

9.4.F.7

- All Section officers must be elected. This election can be conducted annually or every two years. An individual may serve two consecutive terms of office (i.e., 4 years max.).
- An individual shall not serve in a position for more than three terms (i.e., 6 years max.) provided there is at least a one term break.
- Based on these rules, Region 8 has set some conditions to reimburse Section representatives at Region 8 Committee meetings.

MGA rules for elections

9.4.H

- Nominations Committee (no present officers – 9.4.G)
- Call for nominations (6 months before election)
- Receive nominations (5 months before election)
- Gathering of information; selection of 2-3 candidates; ratification by the Section's ExCom
- Slate of nominated candidates (6 weeks before election)
- Possibility for petition candidates
- Entire slate of candidates (2 weeks)
- Secret ballots
- Make sure that all voting members are able to vote.
- Consider to use vTools for electronic voting.

Vitality and Section reporting

- ▣ Let your report show your vitality
- ▣ Show us the things from the past that you are proud of
- ▣ Tell us about your interesting plans for the future
- ▣ Inform us about your best practices
- ▣ Do not hesitate to tell us your points of concerns and topics that should be discussed in the future
- ▣ In general: Concentrate on vitality-related success factors

Section reporting for the R8 meeting

Do not report on Section officers, membership data and meetings data; we will take care of that.

Important: Sections should check the roster regularly for correctness and report their officers asap using vTools or at *scs-officer-report@ieee.org*.

Sections shall prepare a **one-page** summary about such (vitality-related) things as:

1. Highlights from the past

- ▣ Noteworthy events organized by your Section or its Organizational Units
- ▣ Regional and global events hosted by your Section
- ▣ Milestone ceremonies
- ▣ ...

2. Future activities

- ▣ Noteworthy events organized by your Section or its Organizational Units
- ▣ Regional and global events hosted by your Section
- ▣ Milestone ceremonies
- ▣ ...

3. Best practices

4. Points of concern/Topics for future discussion

5. Miscellaneous

- ▣ Awards and other signs of recognition
- ▣ Distinguished Lecturers programs
- ▣ National Society Agreements
- ▣ New Geographic Units (Chap, AG, SB, SB Chap)
- ▣ ...

Section reporting for the R8 meeting

Concentrate on vitality-related success factors

- Show how you engage your Members, Chapters, Student Branches, and Affinity Groups
- Show how you engage in partnerships with other associations and geographic units
- Show - through input from and discussions with your Section Industry Relations Officer - how you engage with industry
- Show how you promote IEEE in your local community
- Show how you embrace new technology opportunities
- Show the programs that reflect your Section's strengths and interests
- Show your financial stewardship (i.e. responsible planning and management of resources)
