Marko Delimar, Region 8 Director gave a tribute to Dr. Roger Pollard who unfortunately has passed away on 3 December 2011 while serving as the Secretary of IEEE and a member of the IEEE Board of Directors, and a moment of silence was kept in his memory. He went through the SWOT analysis of our Region and said that some challenges and opportunities have been tangled and progress has been made. He then introduced the members of the committee; he stated its mission and vision, went through some key facts and characteristics, talked about some recent Conferences and activities. He then pointed out some challenges for the future. He gave an overview of last year's events, introducing the new Sections and Subsections in our Region and he also mentioned the upcoming events. He talked of the establishment of Section officers' term limits. Then he went on giving the key challenges of Region 8: Africa, Cooperation with European agencies, and Conferences.

317. IEEE President's Address

Gordon Day IEEE President said that IEEE Region 8 is very important for IEEE. This can be seen by the IEEE HQ participation in this meeting and it is also a sign of IEEE's globalization. Some of the bigger Sections of IEEE are based in this Region and it covers the largest geographic area. He is committed in supporting our Region and one of his priorities is IEEE and European Union relations, the Brussels office and the Standards advancement in the area. Also he would like to support and help our members from our Brussels office. He is very much in humanitarian activities in IEEE and especially in Africa and urged members to support these initiatives. He believes that as an organization we should push more to bring technology throughout the world, working together with UN, Unesco and other organizations. They are also working to help members in all parts of our Region with different projects because Region 8 is very diverse and he invited everybody to talk to him about their individual needs.

316. Message from the Executive Director

IEEE Executive Director **James Prendergast**, gave a brief update of IEEE activities. He said that we should be very proud that our membership has reached the record of 426 thousand members together with a society membership increase. 2011 *Xplore* usage has hit a new high and conferences are also doing very well with better quality than before. Major initiatives are now going on in IEEE: IEEE Business Platform (IBP), IEEE Conference Exchange (ICX) and Integrated Content Project (ICP). He then talked of the Analytics/SAMIEEE Deployment Plan. He finished by giving the IEEE Five Year Aspiration: By 2016, IEEE will be the global provider of choice, and #1 in customer satisfaction, for services and products that empower people to discover, develop, and deliver technology. We will achieve this by:

- Delivering a best-in-class user experience by aggressively leveraging technologies
- Increasing nimbleness, speed to market, and operational efficiencies
- Driving high employee engagement and leadership excellence
- Creating new opportunities for member and customer engagement
- Ensuring our long term future through increased financial growth, strength & stability

314. MGA Report

MGA Managing Director, Member and Geographic Activities, **Cecelia Jankowski**, presented the main MGA activities and her main thoughts for the MGA strategy for 2013. She gave some member statistics and then she presented some new products like IEEE TV, Volunteer Desktop, memberNet and Center for Leadership Excellence. She stressed that MGA is truly focused on the member and not on the membership. An update was given on all the functions and future plans for MGA. She also talked on the legal status of the IEEE Sections and all the efforts that are being made at the moment with the hiring of a special legal counselor to help the Sections. In Region 8 some Sections are going to become blocking entities for handling reasons: Switzerland, South Africa and Dubai. The Sections will be individually contacted for further processing.

315. Section Reserves

MGA Managing Director, Member and Geographic Activities, **Cecelia Jankowski**, presented the main idea on the Sections reserves policy of MGA. The main reason for this new policy is for MGA to be able to cover some of the financial losses from the Sections reserves. MGA will be contacting all the Sections and let them know what the situation is according to the criteria that were decided. Hopefully no cash will be taken from the Sections. The rules for this policy could change in the future.

304. Region 8 Strategic Direction

Jozef Modelski, Past Region 8 Director and Strategic Planning Chair gave his vision and mission of Region 8 and the key steps needed to realize them. He gave the primary challenges for the Region.

302. Secretary's Report

Secretary **Costas Stasopoulos** gave an account of the Region 8 meeting in San Francisco. He mentioned that the web pages of the Sections are very important and that some Sections do not have a web page. He thanked all Region 8 Committee members for their support and cooperation, and also George Michael, the Electronic Communications Coordinator.

303. Treasurer's Report

Brian Harrington, the Region 8 Treasurer, gave the Present Financial Position of the Region. The financial results for the year 2011 show to a large extent the volatile nature of the financial environment in which Region 8 is operating. The Region realized a largely balanced result. However, as Region 8 trades USD currency to buy local currency to finance its operations, it is sensitive to exchange rate fluctuations. As at the 31st December, 2011 there was a loss in the Net Worth of the Region as compared with the start of year which was equivalent to \$24,620. Further progress was made on cost control. He concluded that the performance of the Region 8 finances is steady under uncertain market conditions.

305. Section Development and Vitality

Martin Bastiaans, IEEE R8 Director-Elect explained what Section Vitality is. The goal is to increase member engagement, improve relationships with and between members, increase operational efficiency and effectiveness, enhance collaboration with other business units and increase membership. He talked of Section size and the average Section size in our region, the rejuvenation of the Section's ExCom, the vitality and the Section reporting. He then gave some guidelines on how to reach these goals and some success factors for vitality.

308. Technical Activities

Saurabh Sinha, R8 V/C Technical Activities, started by giving an overview of the webinars and other activities that took place during the last few months and the outreach towards chapter chairs and conference organizers. Then he presented the Chapter Coordination Subcommittee (ChCSC), the Conference Coordination Subcommittee (CoCSC), the R8 Conference Activities Subcommittee, Educational Activities Subcommittee (EASC), Industry Relations Subcommittee (IRSC), the Standards Coordinator, the TAB "Committees" Liaisons and the Technical Publications Coordinator. For each of the Subcommittees he gave detailed information on the past and future events and activities highlighting their success and pointing the direction they should go in the future.

309. Conferences

Carl Debono, R8 Conference Coordinator, gave a presentation on the Conference Coordination Subcommittee and of its key events during the past months. The past and the future conferences were seen and analyzed.

320. Standards

Steve Mills, President of the IEEE Standards Association, talked about the changing International standards paradigm. The traditional model is well known and is based on geographic and political borders. Now we have the emergence of a complementary model which is market driven and is borderless. As an example he gave the Internet. He ended by saying that standardization like markets is borderless. The Standards Association should move to a bold strategic direction; embracing a new, more nuanced, dual-model international standards paradigm. IEEE should be seen as an international organization with strong global participation and should be irresistible to the standards community.

319. Pre-University Activities

Liz Burd, Chair PECC, talked about the IEEE SC2011 recommendation number 5 (To encourage interest in pre-university students in engineering careers) and how they have responded to it by starting a monthly publication for students ages 14-18. She then talked on the IEEE SC2011 recommendation number 1, to develop a comprehensive long-term strategy to increase the number of next generation youth pursuing science and engineering careers and how they will address the issue.

306. Member Activities Report

Ali El-Mousa, R8 V/C Member Activities started by introducing the GOLD team and gave the key facts and activities of the group. He urged everybody to create a GOLD affinity group. He stressed that having different activities in local level for GOLD is a key issue in having satisfied members. Then he presented the Professional Activities team giving their goals and plans. They organize activities to enhance members' careers in soft skills, management, communications and others. Professional Activities team can help members in these changing times in gaining new skills and in job looking. The Membership Development team was presented where local activities and personal contact are very important. Member retention is a key word here. He then gave some member statistics and information on e-membership. He talked about Life Members, their activities and future events. He continued with the Women in Engineering and their activities. There are many WIE affinity groups and many events have been happening. He then presented the R8 website team and gave information on the new R8 web site which is under development. He then gave some information on the Region 8 News.

306a. GOLD

Saima Kaissi, GOLD Activities Chair, gave a general overview of the GOLD growth, activities and events. She urged the section chairs to establish new GOLD Affinity Groups. Then she talked of the future activities and especially of the GOLD Congress to be held in Madrid in July.

306b. Membership Development

Dirk Van Hertem, Membership Development Coordinator, talked of the IEEE Region 8 Membership retention and recruitment. He gave some vital statistics for 2012; he also talked of the recruitment efforts and results, and he gave the outreach strategy for arrears recovery. Finally he urged the Section Chairs to help in member recovery.

321. Workshops

Ali El-Mousa, R8 V/C Member Activities gave the guidelines for the workshops. R8 OpCom identified the following issues:

- 1- Identify the top two good and two bad section practices that sections in Region 8 are engaged in.
- 2- How do sections perceive member engagement and what are the top two best practices or activities and how do they pursue that? Also try to find the bad or negative issues related to this.

3- Discuss issues to do with the public visibility of IEEE within the sections and what activities and practices can be done to enhance it.

318. IEEE 2013 and Beyond

Peter Staecker, 2012 IEEE President-Elect, talked of Strategic Planning and the old and new model. The new model involves scenarios to set Strategic directions and make opportunistic experiments. He talked of the trends that change our strategy: Open Access is changing from threat to reality, Education: the virtual classroom, social media and dynamic social networks will disrupt, membership model, impact of the Cloud (big data) on content distribution, companies like *Factual*, *Northern Lights* redefining the business of data mining and knowledge, standards development migrating from politically driven to global business/technology-driven.

Our approaches to our current businesses can change. He gave the *knowledge business* – with 6 complementary and synergistic segments:

- Standards
- Publications
- Conferences
- Education
- Membership
- Public Imperatives

What are the next steps?

We have to define directions (goals) for the future, take actions that move towards goals, follow/encourage other activities within IEEE that have strategic purpose/value, develop and refine an approach for subsequent years.

313. President-elect Candidates' Debate

Eva Lang, the host of the President-elect Candidates' Debate, presented the two candidates, **Roberto de Marca** and **Tariq Durani**. After a brief introductory speech, they answered in turn questions that were put forward by the R8 committee members.

310. Call for Nominations

Jozef Modelski, Chair of the Nominations and Appointments Subcommittee, stressed that the mission of the Region 8 Nominations and Appointments (N&A) SubCommittee is to identify qualified candidates for the elected and appointed positions of Region 8 and its Subcommittees. The positions that they were looking for are:

R8 2013-2014 Treasurer (two years commitment)

R8 2013 Vice Chair, Member Activities (one year commitment)

Elections will be held during the Fall 2012 R8 Committee Meeting.

307, 307a, 307b, 307c. Student Activities, Student Branch Congress, Student Awards, Student 50th Anniversary Activities

Elias Nassar, R8 V/C Student Activities started by introducing all the members of his team and gave the goals of his committee. He stressed the important issue of communicating with student members and the efforts made towards this direction. He then gave an overview of Student Membership in R8, he presented the student activities that took place in 2012 and upcoming events like the SPC 2012 in Madrid and others. He invited the two President Elect candidates to come to Madrid where a debate will also take place. Then he invited **Jorge Pacheco**, member of the SBC 2012 organizing committee to talk about the Student Branch and GOLD Congress Madrid 2012. He talked of the preparations and the program of the Congress that will take place on July, 25 to 29 in Madrid, Spain. He urged the Section Chairs to encourage their Student and GOLD members to attend the Congress. **Simay Akar**, Student Branch Coordinator, Liaison to TA gave some information on the Region 8 50th Anniversary Student Event. **Jef Beerten**, Student Awards & Contests coordinator talked on Student awards and Student Professional Activities and **George Paunovich**, Student Paper Contest Coordinator talked of the student paper contest. **Elias Nassar**, talked on Electronic Communications for Students and then he asked the Section Chairs for their help in order to promote the student activities. **Jorge Soares**, Student Representative asked several Section Chairs (Benelux, Germany, Greece, Lithuania, Serbia, Portugal, UKRI, South Africa), to talk about their Student activities through an interactive process.

311. 50th Anniversary Activities

Kurt R. Richter, IEEE R8 Jubilee Book Coordinator showed the editorial board for the Jubilee Book and he then explained the details on the Web-based Book on the Printed Book, on the R8 News – Special Issue and of the Anniversary Celebrations. He also explained the progress made with the oral history project. He urged the Section Chairs to make their inputs to these projects. He finished by giving some information on the creation of the Region 8 archive. **Martin Bastiaans**, IEEE R8 Director-Elect, mentioned of the special brochure that was made for the 50 year anniversary. He then presented 4 different dates (in 1962 and 1963) that can be considered as the birth date of Region 8. He then said that the celebrations of the 50th anniversary are not over yet but they will continue with various events until the next Spring meeting of Region 8. He also urged the Sections to celebrate locally, as well.

312. Awards

Charles Turner, the Awards and Recognitions Subcommittee Chair, explained why awards and recognitions are important in IEEE, how to generate awards activities and an Awards awareness program and how to begin the process in each Section. He also urged the participants to propose candidates for various awards.

Marko Delimar and **Costas Stasopoulos** presented awards to Italy and Greece Section chairs for exemplary service in hosting the IEEE Region 8 Operating Committee Meeting in Rome, Italy and in Athens, Greece respectively and to the UKRI Section chair for hosting the 96th IEEE Region 8 Committee meeting in London, United Kingdom.

321. Workshops

Ali El-Mousa, IEEE Region 8 Vice-Chair, Member Activities gave a summary of the results of the workshops in the 4 topics with the help of Greece Section chair **Athanasios Skodras** and the Lebanon Section chair **Ghassan Shaban**:

Best Practices for Sections:

Sponsor and involve student branches in section activities including organizing a student day

Organize competition to recognize best student branch, best chapter, best thesis, and presenting them for regional and global IEEE awards

Having IEEE booths in all conferences to promote IEEE membership development

Bad Practices for Sections:

Having no effective communication and no proper activities within the section

Lack of diversity in most ExCom's e.g. lack of a good mix of different academic campuses, industry, age, gender and not having new blood

Offering free benefits e.g. membership, conference fees, etc.

Not changing inefficient officers

Not updating the website regularly

Best Practices for Member Engagement:

Motivating members by helping them improve their professional capabilities e.g. writing and presenting technical papers

Recognizing members during annual gatherings and other events (Awards, Media presence, e-publicity) e.g. members who have been elevated to the grade of Fellow

Collaborating with other Local Technical Societies and Industry in organizing events

Milestone ceremonies

Use of social media like facebook to allow members to express their views

Best Practices for IEEE Visibility:

Organizing events that touch community concerns and showing the role of IEEE in tackling these issues

Having IEEE get involved in pre-university programs that are done at community service level

e.g. EPICS TISP, Science fairs

Getting Local Authorities and Industrial Figures to be involved in IEEE activities

Ali said that the detailed results will be posted on the internet and that feedback to them will be appreciated.

322. General Discussion

Pilar Molina stated her general concern concerning the Sections reserves and the new rules of MGA. **Marko Delimar** temporarily handed over the chairmanship to **Martin Bastiaans** in order to be able to answer the question and state his personal opinion. He said that Sections should participate in the profit and loss of IEEE. He said that more involvement of the Sections should be encouraged in the future and better communication between Sections and MGA should be encouraged. **Nihal Sinnadurai** suggested that MGA should delay the implementation of the new policy for one year in order to give time to the Sections and their Chapters to adjust to the new reality and use their reserves for the benefit of their members. As a Section they do comply with the rules but if you add the reserves of the Chapters then they go above it. **Marko Delimar** said that he will bring the subject to the MGA board. He said that Sections are responsible for their Chapters. He continued by saying that this new policy is not made in order to punish the Sections but it was made in order to make IEEE more operational and business like. He urged the Sections to use their reserves for the benefit of their members. **Okyay Kaynak** said that as a member of the MGA board he agrees that this is a decision that had to be taken and it moves us into a more unified IEEE. **Peter Farkas** said that this new rule has retroactive effect which is not fair for the Sections. **Marko Delimar** took the responsibility to talk to MGA on better communication in both ways. **Jan Haase** made a suggestion to limit time of presentations during Region 8 meetings and give more time for discussion and exchange of ideas.

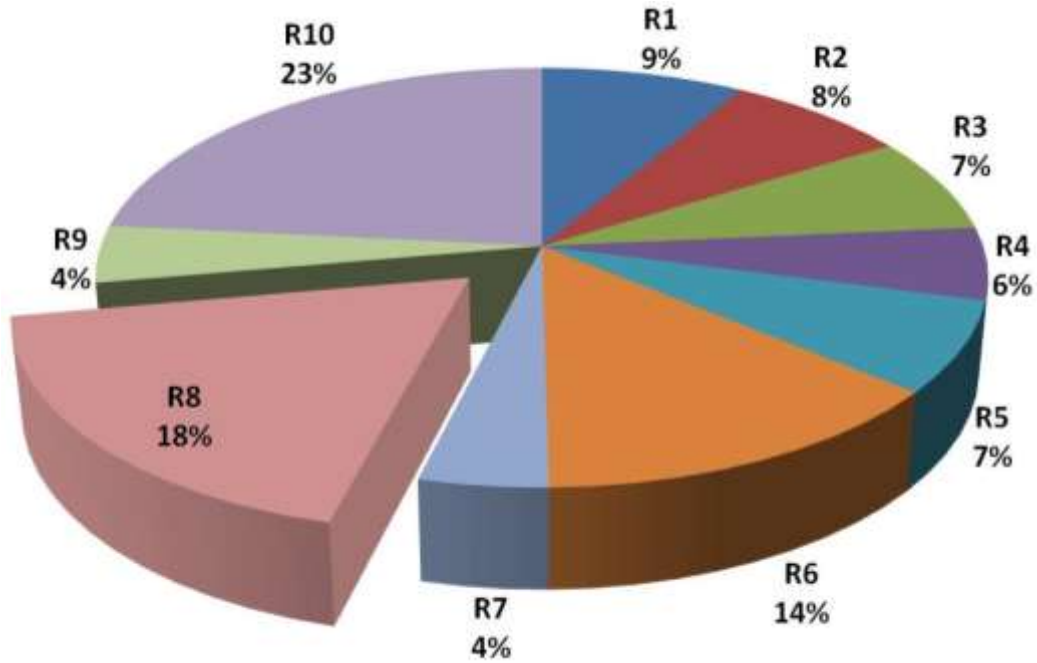

Officer's Term Limits

During the 25 June 2011 meeting the MGA passed the following motion:

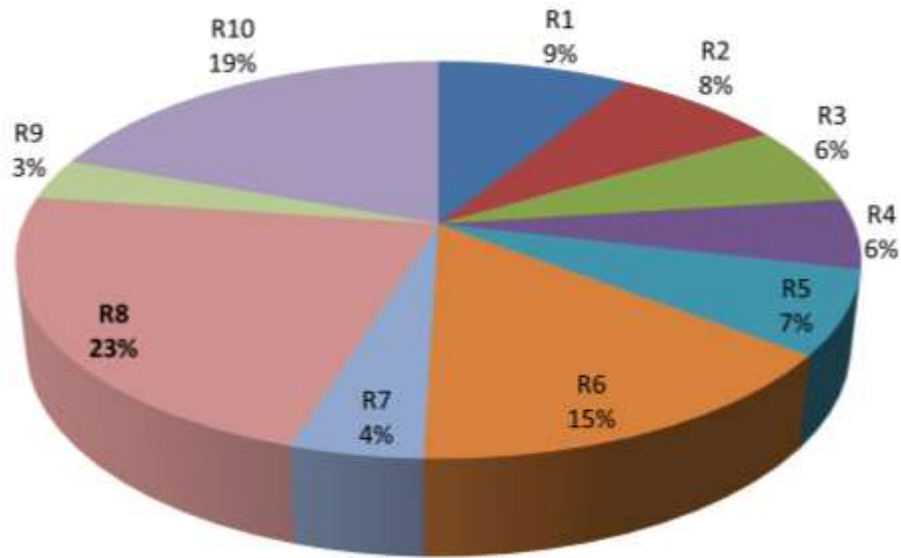
1. All Section officers must be elected. This election can be conducted annually or every two years. An individual may serve two consecutive terms of office.
2. A lifetime term limit shall be established for Section officers. An individual shall not serve in a position for more than 3 terms (i.e. 6 years) provided there is at least a one term break.
3. The MGA Operations Manual to be revised to incorporate text which explains how an individual may be removed from the position and how an individual can be suspended from office.

Region 8 is under obligation to strictly enforce the officer term limit rules. This item will be discussed in the Region 8 Committee in an executive session.

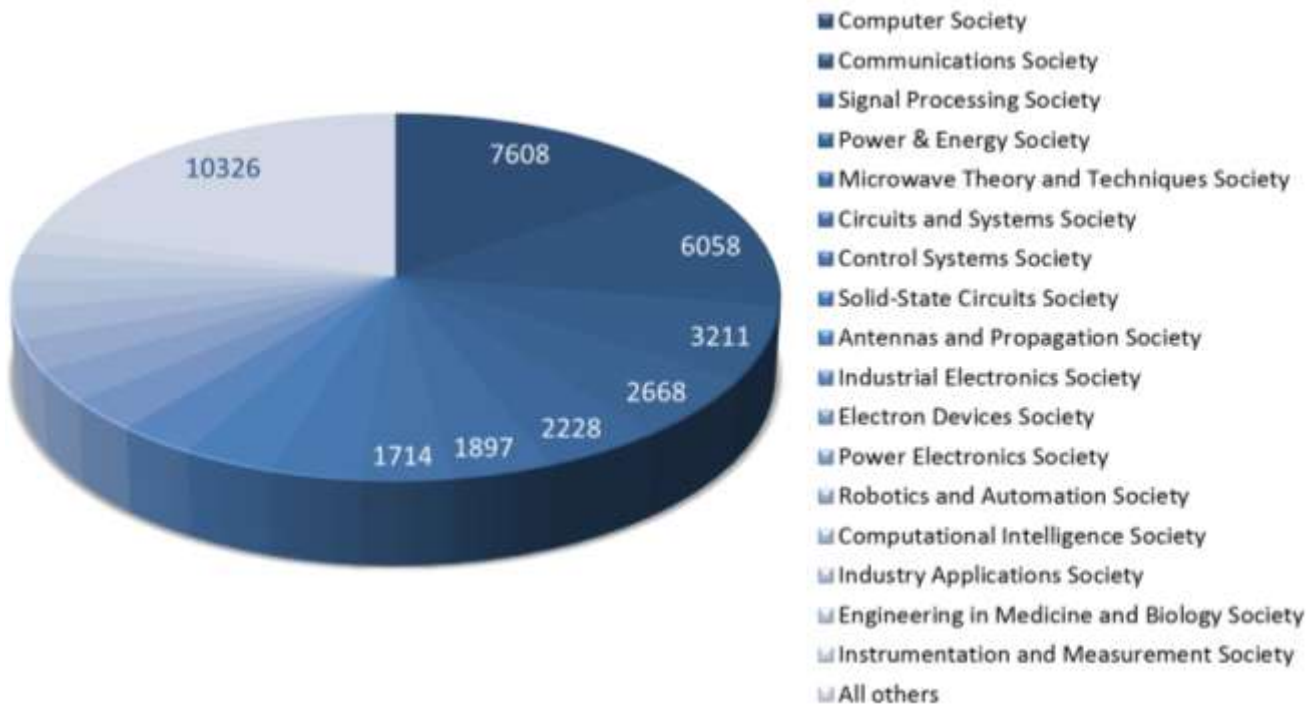

As R8 VC for Member Activities, I am responsible for planning, leadership, and guidance for activities relating to IEEE Region 8 members, including the areas of membership development, admission and advancement, affinity group programs (GOLD – Graduates of the Last Decade, WIE – Women in Engineering and Life Members), communication, history and professional (non-technical) activities. The R8 subcommittees looking after the affairs of each of the above areas were quite busy since our last meeting in Berlin. Perhaps, the main focus was intensive preparation for the R8 Student Branch Congress which took place in Madrid, Spain during the period of 25-29 July 2012. This time the number of attendees broke the record with 400+ coming not only from R8 but also from as far away as Central America and the US. This gives a clear indication of the prestige and reputation this congress has built through the years.

The SBC is a major event in R8 which brings together various GOLD and student members from across the region to meet, interact, discuss, learn and have a good time. It is really one major place to fulfil member interconnect and interact advantages offered by the IEEE. This year, the R8 GOLD team was heavily involved in the preparation and general organization of the sessions specifically the ones to do with GOLD. I attended several of these sessions and was delighted with the level of attendance and satisfaction. Also, for the first time in SBC, the R8 Professional Activities team was directly involved in the event as they also organized and supported several sessions that dealt with soft skills, management and leadership training and product design perspectives. I ended up replacing one of the trainers as she could not attend at the last minute for personal reasons. This allowed me to gauge again the level of interest and appreciation attendees have for such skills. I can confidently say that specifically under the current economic climate, such topics are very sought after and I highly encourage section chairs and geo unit leaders to take advantage of the activities and services provided by the R8 PA team.

The various subcommittee coordinators were asked to submit their expanded individual reports about their activities. You can find these reports on the Tallinn meeting web page. Additionally, a shorter version of these will be distributed during the R8 committee meeting for convenience.

Some brief comments about the subcommittees:

Membership Development (MD)

R8 MD is responsible for coordinating the information flow and all MD activities between IEEE and the sections, in order to facilitate membership development initiatives and events in R8 sections.

In late September the MD team held a special workshop for section and geo units MD officers. The session took place during the weekend of 22-23 in Leuven, Belgium. It consisted of full day sessions of training and interaction between the attendees and the MD team. A special session was held to explain and demonstrate the new SAMIEEE database tool that is used to easily retrieve member info and details which helps in section and geo unit management, event planning and general MD evaluation. I hope that we will be able to continue with such sessions despite the expense because it is felt that it highly motivates and helps MD officers and thus will have a positive impact on sections. I highly encourage sections and geo units to support their MD officers and facilitate the attendance of such workshops in the future.

Total IEEE membership as of end of August 2012 stands at 393,226 with an increase of 1.9% from last year for the same period. Region 8 membership stands at 71,282 with an increase of 1.8% over last year for the same period. R8 has a retention percentage of 72.8% for this year.

Professional Activities (PA)

Professional activities include all activities which are of interest to an IEEE member regarding her/his career and can enhance her/his non-technical professional skills. This includes, but is not limited to soft skills trainings, psychological and sociological issues within the business world as well as economics-related topics. In these times of economic uncertainties, it is strongly felt that it pays to add value to our members through engaging them within the sphere of PA.

R8 PA activities took center stage during the SBC 2012 in Madrid. Three parallel sessions with upward of 100+ participants from several sectors attended these sessions. The feedback was excellent and the PA subcommittee received several requests for holding similar events at section level. Already several are planned in the near future. I encourage section officers to make contact with the PA coordinator during the Tallinn meeting to discuss the possibility of holding such sessions in their sections.

Graduates of Last Decade (GOLD)

Graduates of Last Decade (GOLD) is the group of IEEE members that have completed their first academic degree within the last 10 years. The GOLD program has been established to provide the framework and tools for the sections' use in retaining recent graduates.

The Region 8 GOLD committee's task is to create awareness of and to promote GOLD programs in the Region for the identification and development of IEEE volunteer leaders and members. The committee acts as an active promoter, resource, and liaison for sections and branches to generate and support GOLD activities

The R8 GOLD team has been very active also during the SBC in Madrid as a large number of GOLDies attended. Several sessions were organized covering different subjects of interest given by world class invited speakers. I took part in several of these sessions and can report that they were very successful. It engaged the participants and there were many interesting discussions and Q&As. Currently, the R8 team also is taking a leading role for the IEEE Day 2012 in October. A quick look at the IEEE Day celebrations map shows a high level of participation from across the globe.

I highly encourage the sections to fully support their GOLD officer as obviously GOLD activities are essential for section growth and member engagement.

Women in Engineering (WIE)

The mission of IEEE WIE is to facilitate the recruitment and retention of women in technical disciplines globally. The R8 WIE coordinator engages section WIE affinity groups and coordinators and offers advice and support for local WIE activities. In addition, she administers the yearly Clementina Saduwa Award and represents the region in the IEEE WIE committee. Note that the IEEE Women in Engineering (WIE) is the largest international professional organization dedicated to promoting women engineers and scientists.

2.2 Other Awards and Contests

2.2.1 IEEE Student Enterprise Award (2012 Deadline: November 15)

The IEEE Student Enterprise Award, with funding from corporate partners and individuals, was created by the IEEE to support Student Branch projects. Up to US\$ 1,500 in funding is available for project proposals developed by teams of IEEE Student Members from Student Branches established at over 1 400 universities and colleges around the world.

2.2.2 IEEE Darrel Chong Student Activity Award (Deadline: on-going)

This award serves to change the mind set of our student groups from being number-driven to become value-driven and acknowledge exemplary student activities around the world. The eventual goal is to improve the quality of the activities and foster knowledge sharing among students. Ultimately, the initiative is targeted at improving student membership growth. This will encourage and motivate students to continue to innovate and implement meaningful ideas. Submissions are welcome throughout the entire year; decisions are made once a year during the MGA SC meeting. Activities submitted after 16 November will be judged the following year.

2.2.3 IEEEExtreme 24 hour Programming Challenge (held in October each year)

This 24-hour programming contest has proven to be a good instrument for membership drive and member satisfaction. In 2011, 4 Region 8 teams ranked in the top 10!

2.2.4 IEEE Presidents' Change the World Competition

The award recognizes students who develop unique solutions to real-world problems using engineering, science, computing and leadership skills to benefit their community or humanity. The winners of the 2012 IEEE Presidents' Change the World Competition will be honored during the official IEEE Honors Ceremony in June 2012.

2.3 Region 8 Student Paper Contest

Once every year, each IEEE R8 Student Branch (SB) may hold and organize a local Student Paper Contest (SPC) under its own responsibility. The winner(s) of each Student Branch Contest may compete for the Region 8 Contest, held within the Region 8 limits. A SB may submit one paper per every 100 SB IEEE members or part thereof, with a maximum of three papers per SB. 3.2 Emailing

The SAC team sends out bi-monthly email newsletters to all students and graduate students in Region 8. The newsletters contain announcements on upcoming deadlines, programs and awards as well as any news and benefits relevant to the target audience.

4 Ongoing Programs and Activities

4.1 Twin Student Branch Program

The Twin Branch Program was established in April 2009. Registered student branches can then agree to become twins. The relationship between twins is free-form, but branches are expected to be exchange information, supporting documents and ideas, and also organise joint activities. The program helps promote activity among the branches in the Region and jump-start recently established branches. The program is currently suspended and being redefined. A re-launch is expected to take place in time for the SBC 2012. In parallel, a funding proposal is being prepared for submission to NIC.

4.2 Travel grants for students at IEEE technical conferences

The Region 8 Voluntary Contribution Fund is not just intended for members, the fund helps also needy students to attend technical conferences (limit \$ 1000 per person in a lifetime). Students attending technical events or conferences may receive a travel grant to the conference. In 2010 six students received funding (total of \$4500) to travel to conferences and four so far in 2011 received such funding.

4.3 EPICS-in-IEEE

EPICS-in-IEEE is a program that organizes university and high-school students to work on engineering-related projects for local humanitarian organizations. Projects that are within IEEE's fields of interest should address one or more areas of interest: education, access and abilities, human services, and environment. 4.4 Teacher In-Service Program (TISP)

The Teacher In-Service Program (TISP) enables IEEE Volunteers to share their technical expertise and demonstrate the application of engineering concepts to support the teaching and learning of science, mathematics, and technology disciplines. IEEE offers training workshops for its members on how to facilitate in-service programs for local teachers to help them introduce hands-on engineering lessons to their students. These lesson plans are aligned with education standards and can easily be used in the classroom. For 2012/13, TISP workshops are being organized in Czech Republic/Slovakia and East Africa. Furthermore, a TISP training workshop is being organized during the R8 SBC in Madrid, Spain.

5.2 SBC 2012

This year, Madrid was the host city of the 8th biannual IEEE Region 8 Student Branch and GOLD Congress (SBC 2012), the flagship student and GOLD event in the region. Following on the footsteps of London (2008) and Leuven (2010), the 2012 edition had a special flavour to it, this being the 50th anniversary celebration of Region 8.

The congress managed to attract around 400 attendees (up from 215 just 4 years ago), 300 of which student members from all corners of Europe, Middle East and Africa. However, the list also included the Regional Student Representatives from Regions 2 and 10, as well as 24 attendees from Region 9. We were happy to welcome IEEE Past President Moshe Kam, IEEE President Gordon Day, IEEE President-Elect Peter Staecker and the entire Region 8 OpCom, as well as many other global IEEE volunteers and staff. The already legendary multi-cultural evening once again lived up to its reputation. With participants from 53 different countries, the diversity was everywhere and, by some accounts, you could even call it overwhelming. Diversity could also be found in the congress program, with a mix of technical, non-technical and IEEE topics thrown in. The attendees had the opportunity to ask their questions to the next Region 8 Director in the Director-Elect Candidate debate, and to be rewarded for their volunteer efforts in the SAC/GOLD award session. Perhaps most important, though, were the ample opportunities for networking and exchange of experiences which took place around the clock. Congratulations to the SBC Madrid team for an amazing event and thank you to those who attended. To all readers, hope to see you at the next one! **Thanks to all the Sections who funded the travel of their SB officers to attend the congress.**

The Vice-Chair: Technical Activities works with standing coordinators/subcommittees: chapters coordination, conference coordination, education activities, standards, industry relations and two adhoc coordinators: technical publications and future directions towards providing an oversight on technical activities of the *geographical unit*, IEEE Region 8.

Over the past year, we have introduced a new tool towards interacting with our volunteers at the “grassroots” level, i.e. our counterparts at the section level. WebEx, which is supported by an InterCall facility, is now somewhat more popular, but more socialization and training is still required. Through InterCall, the audio portion of a WebEx “webinar” is accessed, and for a few countries in Region 8, a toll-free number is provided. For many other countries, audio access is gained by using Google Phone or Skype to call the US based toll-free number for InterCall.

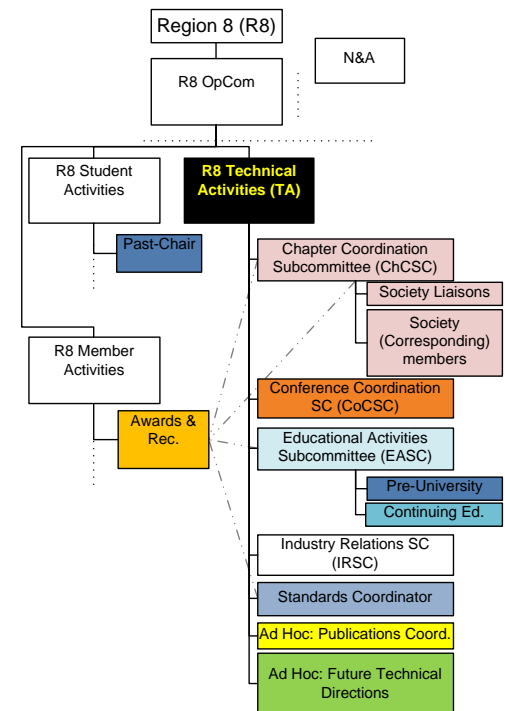
The **chapter coordination subcommittee** (ChCSC) has held both in-person and web-based chapter chairs meeting (CCM), where we have identified the opportunity for sections to establish some 500 new chapters in Region 8. While the opportunity to develop new chapters exist, it also remains important that the existing chapters are active, and well-supported. Through vTools, section chairs are reminded to monitor chapter activity and provide support where possible. The connectivity of the Region 8 ChCSC too various societies and councils could be of assistance where dormancy may start to prevail or already prevails.

The **conference coordination subcommittee** (CoCSC) has progressed towards attracting more events for technical and financial co-sponsorship. Support for conference bids for large “flagship” conferences (such as ICC 2017) has been provided to chapters in our region. The CoCSC has also held a webinar on financial issues, including managing of conference insurance and taxes. The new mechanism of conference registration using ICX (IEEE Conference Exchange) is now in place: http://www.ieee.org/conferences_events/conferences/organizers/conf_app.html

Traditional Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for technical co-sponsorship is now automatically generated and coordinated.

The **educational activities subcommittee** (EASC) pioneers our pre-university works (PUW), continuing education (CE) and university activities. Through the recent sponsorship for translating the TryEngineering portal into Arabic, an interest to organize a Teacher In-Service Programme (TISP) supported by local volunteers in the Gulf and North Africa, is being developed. This would be the first TISP in Arabic, and could go a long way towards developing the “active” learning component for our educators in the Gulf area. The EASC interacts regularly with IEEE’s Educational Activities Board (EAB) and new opportunities are regularly identified in this way. An interest towards developing informal museum exhibits, for instance E-Scientia, is another PUW. With the identified interest in CE for our members, the CE coordinator has recently arranged a distinguished lecture (IEEE Vehicular Technology Society), as a webinar. The webinar had been well attended, and was of interest to both industry professionals, but also to graduate student members (GSMs). The approach could be useful for emerging researchers and doctoral students seeking to identify research gaps. University activities, including accreditation activities, move forward in the Gulf area, North Africa, East and Southern Africa. The approach is to “follow the volunteers,” and work with national or local engineering councils and professional societies and assist in formation of local accreditation committees, who could with training, support academic programme accreditation in their local geographical areas.

The **industry relations subcommittee** (IRSC) has held a number of meetings and interactions towards finalizing documentation for the Region 8 industry awards for industrial professionals and companies. The IRSC has also finalized the role of the section-level industry relations officer (IRO), as well as providing a summary of the roles. The roles were discussed through a region wide webinar, and the resulting recording has been circulated to those who could not attend. A mechanism for regular feedback from IROs has also been established through IEEE Fluid Surveys (<http://ieee.fluidsurveys.com/surveys/R8/iro-semi-annual-report/>).



The **standards coordinator** works closely with IEEE-Standards Association (IEEE-SA) and the IEEE-SA & EAB joint Standards Education Committee (SEC). In cooperation with the mentioned entities, cooperation with our flagship conferences such as EnergyCon, workshops towards “demystifying IEEE standards,” have been held. Smaller scale or similar sized events are being planned for EuroCon’13 and Africon’13. SEC and PUW have worked together to generate an early interest among pre-university students on IEEE standards. Similarly standards activities have been held at university level, and for industry professionals. The IRSC and the standards coordinator have worked together towards promoting the standards workshops at conferences.

The **adhoc coordinators** for publications and future technical coordination have renewed the linkages with IEEE Sales and Marketing towards developing access to the IEEE / IET electronic library (IEL) and future technical areas, respectively. The approach has started to deliver in some areas, for instance, in France, but slower in other areas. Another area of interest is to develop IEEE Xplore further by including local/regional publications of high quality.

As this is the final report of the Vice-Chair of Technical Activities, the Vice-Chair *extends hearty thanks to all Region 8 committee members*, for kind support over the period of 2011-2012. The Vice-Chair, together with adhoc and standing committee chairs/coordinators will work with the new team for 2013/4 and ensure a smooth transition.

Awards & Recognition Subcommittee (A&RSC)

Following the Region 8 meeting in Berlin in March./April, the committee reviewed the status of the awards for which it is currently responsible.

1. **The 2012 Region 8 Volunteer Award** was won by Michel Henry Carpentier of the France Section. The certificate will be presented at the Section meeting later this year.
2. There were no nominations for the **Outstanding Section Award**, newly introduced this year. This was especially disappointing because it had been hoped that the winner would go forward to the Global MGA contest. The committee resolved to re-double its efforts next year to stimulate some nominations.
3. The **Clementina Saduwa** and the **GOLD Awards** had been successfully completed this year. The GOLD award was presented at SBC in Madrid in July.
4. Three new **industry relations awards** had been developed by the Industry Relations Committee and would be inaugurated later this year.

The A & R website has been re-designed by Jef Beerten. Comments on its appearance and functionality would be welcomed. The overall aim was to provide complete information about all Region 8 awards, as well as links to other IEEE awards (such as those managed by EAB, MGA, and Corporate Activities)

The intention is to recognise outstanding individuals for their contributions to society, through science and technology, in industry, academia, and in public service. This proposal is still under consideration.

At the presentation by the Chair at the Region 8 Committee meeting in Berlin, it was emphasised that more needed to be done to make members more aware of the significance and the value of awards, especially in a volunteer-led organisation such as IEEE. The best place to begin this process is at Section level. The committee's goal is to have an Awards Officer/Co-ordinator appointed in every Section of the Region. Currently, fewer than half of our Sections have Awards Officers. We ask all Sections to give this goal their top priority.

Martin Bastiaans had compiled a complete list of award winners from Region 8 since its formation in 1962. This will be posted on the R8 website and the Global History Network.

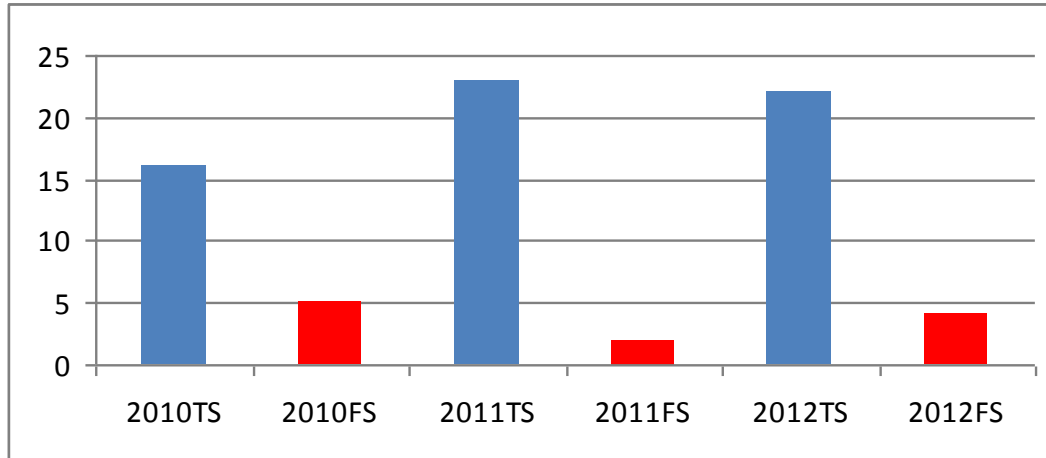

Educational Activities Subcommittee (EASC)

EASC activities are divided into three areas. The areas are Pre-University Activities, Continuing Education Activities and Accreditation Activities. The detailed accomplished and planned activities for the 2012 are detailed below.

Pre-University Activities (Sohaib Qamar Sheikh, Coordinator)

- A new (Sub-)Sub-Committee called Pre-University Works was approved to increase and streamline activities in the region. The team will be responsible for promoting public relations (PR) support for pre-university activities being organized or planned and coordinate with global Pre-university Education Coordinating Committee (PECC), a *standing committee* of the IEEE Educational Activities Board (EAB). The committee includes Sohaib Qamar Sheikh (R8 Pre-University Activities Coordinator), Yasemin Baser (Turkey Section), Muhammad Mustafa (Jordan Section) and Joyce Mwangama (South Africa Section). They will be responsible for promoting activities in Europe, Middle East and Africa respectively, liaison with the Region 8 student activities committee (SAC) and support & empower pre-university activities all over the region

Teacher In-Service Program (TISP)

- A 2nd TISP presentation was organized in Tunisia on December 19, 2011. The activity was well received by the attendees
- A TISP workshop was successfully organized on March 21, 2012 in Toulon-Var University, Toulon, France. The workshop was organized by the IEEE Tunisia section, IEEE Education Society (ES) Tunisia chapter, the HANDIBIO laboratory, and participants of the 2nd Tunisian TISP Workshop in cooperation with the Research Groups on Intelligent Machines (REGIM Lab.), the IEEE Region 8 Educational Activities Subcommittee, and the IEEE Educational Activities Board (EAB). The workshop had 24 participants and received excellent feedback.
- A 3-hour TISP workshop is being organized during the R8 Student Branch Congress being held in Madrid, Spain from 25-29 July, 2012. The workshop is part of the Education Track at the congress which is completely being coordinated by the Pre-University Works Committee (PUW).
- TISP Workshop requests have been received from the UAE Section, Ministry of Education, Bahrain, and for the ME-SBC due to be held in Lebanon next year. All requests have been forwarded to the EAB staff to initiate preparatory teleconferences.

Engineering Projects In Community Service-in-IEEE (EPICS-in-IEEE)

- An EPICS application was submitted by the GJU Student Branch, Jordan in April, 2012.
- EPICS applications for projects in Sweden and Palestine are complete and will be submitted in the next month.
- An E-notice regarding the program is in the process of being sent to all R8 members with the help of EPICS High Administrator. The aim of the E-notice is to make members in our region aware of this program.

2. Webinars on our Education portals and Humanitarian activities will be organized in August and October respectively.

Outreach Efforts

PUW committee has continued its outreach efforts with events and direct member outreach.

1. As mentioned in the report earlier, an EPICS E-notice has been dispatched to all IEEE members in Region 8.
2. To increase social media outreach, we have created facebook and twitter pages, and are maintaining them actively.
3. An outreach event was organized at the Jordanian SBC to reach out to the student members in the section. This action resulted in one EPICS application being sent from the section. Our Middle East Coordinator, Muhammad Mustafa, can be seen in the picture below presenting about our programs to the participants.
4. PUW organized an event called 'Why Engineering?' for 50 students from few of the most prestigious schools in UK including Eton College, Langley Academy, Beechwood School and Slough & Eton College on June 26, 2012. The talk was followed by a competition where teams of students had to build a Robot Arm from regular craft supplies. The robot arm lesson was taken from TryEngineering.org where more than a 100 different lessons are available to make learning more practical and fun for students. This session was kindly sponsored by R8 Technical Activities and Slough & Eton College.

IEEE R8 Student Branch Congress, 2012

PUW is completely responsible for organizing the Education Track and two non-technical workshops at the congress due to be held in Madrid, Spain from 25-29 July, 2012.

Below are the details of the workshops,

Education Track:

1. Teacher In-Service Program – A 3 hour long workshop is organized for 30 participants and includes 3 components
 - a. Pre-University Activities overview by Liz Burd, Chair PECC.
 - b. TISP lesson on tall tower by Fabio Domingos, IST Student Branch TISP team
 - c. Pre-University R8 Focus and Updates by Sohaib Qamar Sheikh, R8 Pre-University Coordinator
2. Contributing for education innovation: The fall of the chalkboard – A 1.5 hour workshop on a new project by Rui Costa from the IST student branch which aims to provide students with a new methodology to study more effectively through videos and online exercises. Details about this project can be accessed at <http://82.102.6.169/~academic/en>. The website is currently a prototype and will be launched completely during the congress.
3. Engineering for Change – A 1.5 hour workshop by Adrian Pais, VC Humanitarian Activities on how students can get involved in social projects to increase their practical knowledge and contribute to their society.
4. TryComputing.org Session – A 15 min session sponsored by IEEE CS to advertise the TryComputing portal and their education related programs.

Non-Technical Workshops:

1. Two 1.5 hour long workshops on EPICS will be delivered by Moshe Kam and Sohaib Qamar Sheikh. PUW Coordinator for Africa, Joyce Mwangama will also be present to give a case study of an EPICS program she was involved with in the past.

Partner with other IEEE pre-university programmes, including mentoring programmes such as IEEE Student-Teacher and Research Engineer/Scientist (STAR). STAR developed within EAB due to historical reasons, however as of 2012, WiE is now part of the member and geographic activities (MGA) board. The activity may be coordinated irrespective of its administrative position within IEEE.

Appointments to higher level committees: as per a proposal by the pre-university coordinator in Dec. 2011, Maciej Borówka, Kraków, Poland has been nominated to serve on the global *EPICS-in-IEEE* committee.

- **TryEngineering** (www.tryengineering.org)

TryEngineering was translated to seven languages. Last year, it's translation in Arabic was initiated with Saudi Aramco. IEEE Saudi East section and EAB providing support. The translation has been completed and it was launched Feb.17, 2012.

Continuing Education (CE) (Niovi Pavlidou, Coordinator)

- A webinar on the IEEE's Continuing Education (CE) - Technical English Programme (TEP) was organized on 10 January 2012. The organizing team was comprised by Saurabh Sinha, IEEE Region 8 Vice-Chair: Technical Activities, Steve Welch, Director of CE, Educational Activities Division (EAD), Niovi Pavlidou, IEEE R8 Lead Volunteer for CE (Educational Activities Subcommittee (EASC)), and Burt Dicht, Director of University Programs, Educational Activities Division (EAD).
- The web-based seminar was offered to relevant officers in Region 8: Section Chairs, Chapter Chairs, Region 8 EA officers, the Chapters Coordination Subcommittee (ChCSC) and several interested (invited) members in the Region. The duration of the webinar was one hour, the lectures and discussion slots as a whole. The slides, supported by the recording of the webinar, are available from the IEEE Region 8 (Technical activities, Educational activities) website.
- The event was organized on WebEx facilities and the attendance has been improved in relation to the last CE event (a general online Blackboard discussion on CE). Based on the obtained experience some new proposals for future events are now being considered.

- Further, a sub sub-committee on Continuing Education R8 has been established with the participation of Dr. George Papadopoulos to boost the CE activities in Region 8. As a first initiative a webinar on Electric Vehicles is considered in the near future.
- A webinar is planned on 03 July 2012 at 3 pm (United Kingdom) time. The webinar is intended to all members of IEEE Education Society in R8 and to the Section Chairs of R8. Topic: Fuzzy Logic Systems in Educational Assessment Speaker: Riyadh BESBES, PhD, educational supervisor for secondary schools in Tunisia
- Another webinar is planned on the same date 03 July 2012 at 4.30 pm (United Kingdom) time. The webinar is intended for members of IEEE Vehicular Technology Society in Region 8 and to the Section Chairs in Region 8. Topic: Introduction to Electric Vehicles Speaker: Vladimir Katic, IEEE Serbia and Montenegro Section
- These topics were discussed and initiated at the R8 meeting in Berlin

Accreditation Activities (Bakr Hassan, Coordinator)

- The Gulf Accreditation Sub-Committee held number of teleconference meetings discussing the proposal for establishing a GCCC Accrediting Organization for Engineering, Computing & Technology. A workshop was conducted on March 29, 2012 in Berlin to discuss the draft proposal. The workshop was attended by key people from the accrediting agencies in the Gulf attended as well as several IEEE volunteers from EAB and R8. More teleconference meetings are planned to finalize the proposal. Further meetings are planned with NCAAA in Saudi Arabia and other accrediting agencies from the Gulf.
- Accreditation works moves forward in the Southern/Eastern African area.

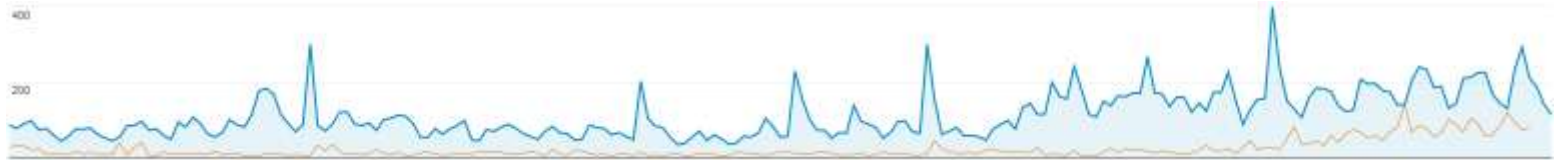

We are always accepting new articles so feel free to let us know of what your Section is doing so that we can let the whole Region know.

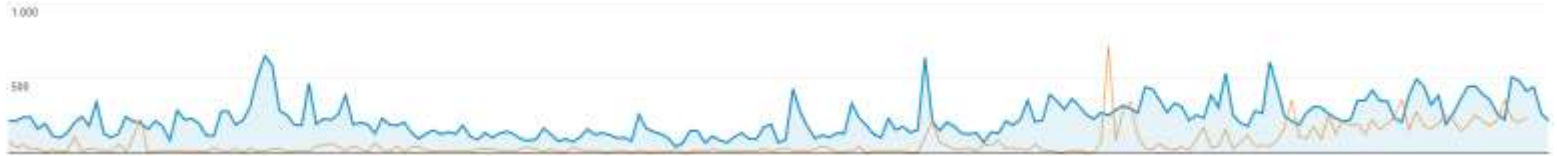
Statistics:

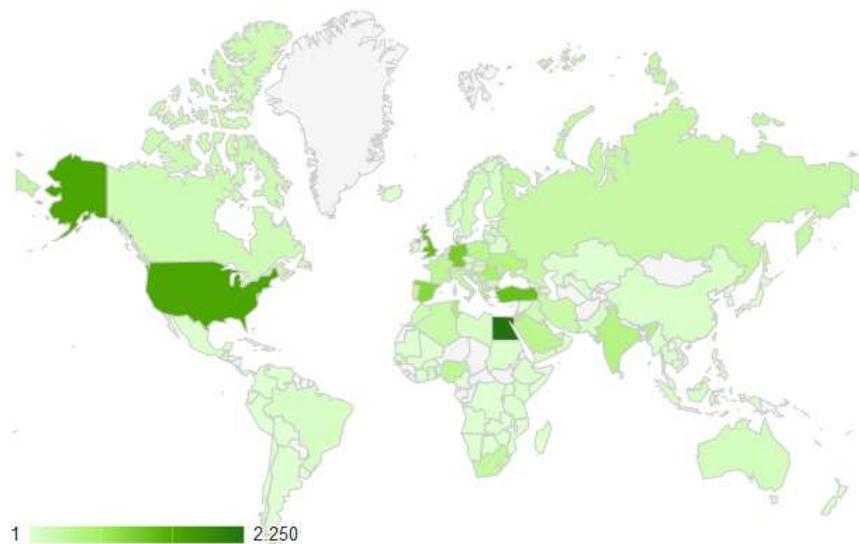
Visits

vTools abbreviation stands for "Volunteer Tools". vTools simplify the administrative tasks to our volunteers via use of online tools, reduce time spent managing activities, and assist in member development.

vTools are developed and made possible by IEEE volunteers. The toolbox simplifies administration by offering web based software, reduces time spent managing activities, and assists in member development.

Currently available tools:

- **vTools.Meetings** – tool for managing section and chapter meetings. Officers can create meeting announcements with no dependence on webmaster availability and show them on your website. Members and the public may see and register for the upcoming meetings.
- **vTools.WebInABox** – wizard to assist officers generate simple section websites in an automated fashion with no dependence on webmaster availability.
- **vTools.Voting** – tool to allow members submit votes in their Section officer elections online.
- **DimDim** – a Web Conferencing service to Geographic Organizational Units for online meetings, webinars, training, demos and presentations.
- **vTools.StudentBranchReporting** – tool for collecting and searching reports submitted by student branch volunteers such as annual plan and report of activities.

- **FluidSurveys** - a Survey tool available to MGA Board members and MGA Board Committees as well as Region and Section EXCOM officers. Tool can be used to quickly create online surveys using intuitive interface and distribute them via Email, Web link, etc. Collected results can be easily analyzed and graphical reports can be shared with others.

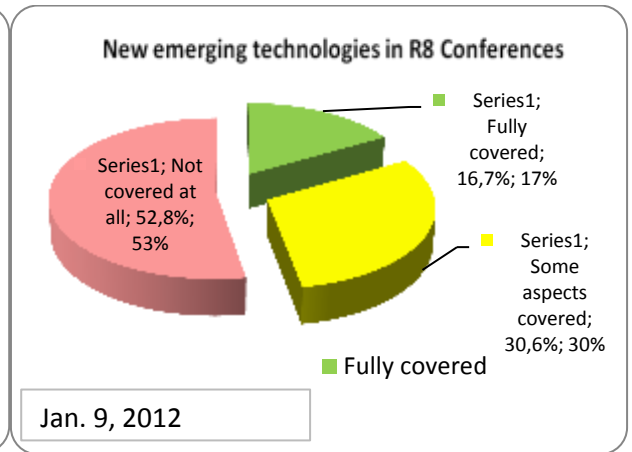
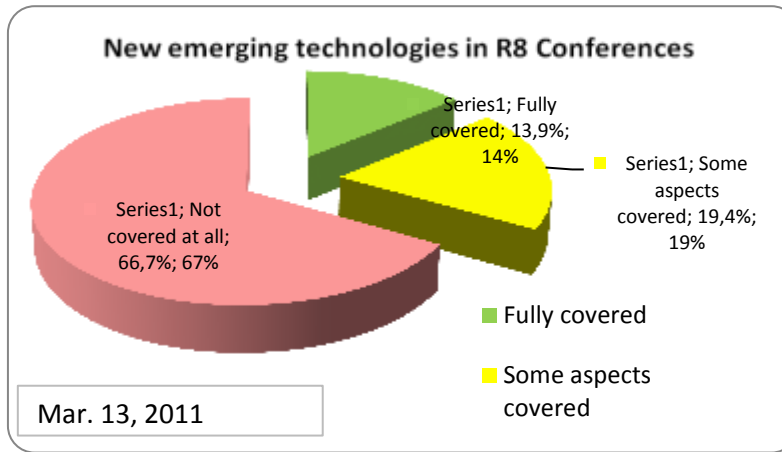

The new emerging technologies have improved their participation in comparison to previous report (March 13, 2011). Their share in topics of R8 conferences has risen to from 13.9 % to 16.7 % (see to pie charts below). However, there are no additional information since March 2012.



Still, it can be concluded that the new emerging technologies are not well covered in the R8 conferences. Such case can have effects on actuality and attractiveness of these conferences. Therefore, the ad hoc coordinator will work with the Conferences Coordination Subcommittee (CoCSC) towards promoting these new areas of work.

c) Education: FDC topics are not present in the program of the EASC. The EASC met in Berlin (30 Mar. 2012) and it was concluded to organize a WebEx conference on one of the FDC topics

d) Industry relations: The IRSC is active in some new fields, especially dealing with Energy - Renewable energy.

e) Standards: There is opportunity to get involved, but no visible activities (other than in the Smart Grid area) in FDC topics so far.

Industry Relations Officer: Summary Roles and Responsibilities

The Industry Relations Officer (IRO) is a position that is created within each section to strengthen the relationship between IEEE and the Industry. IROs play an important role in understanding the industry needs and work closely with industry professionals to address their requirements and promote IEEE activities, products and services.

Goals & Objectives:

The goals of the Section Industry Relation Officer (IRO) are to:

- Bridge the gap and enhance relationships between industry, academia/research, government and the IEEE
- Influence the industry to support the engagement of their professionals in IEEE activities to benefit for its products and services
- Develop IEEE membership in industry and strive towards a balance between academic and industry volunteers / members within an IEEE geographical unit / section.
- Promote the IEEE Region 8 awards for corporate and corporate IEEE members.

Scope:

The scope of IRO duties is summarized as follows:

1. Identify industry needs by conducting section-level surveys as appropriate
2. Promote IEEE to industry by informing them about IEEE benefits and its available products and services.
3. Highlight the benefits of joining IEEE to industry professionals
4. Create & maintain a database of companies and contacts
5. Encourage networking between IEEE members in industry and academia
6. Establish synergy among academia, research and industry
7. Convince IEEE to position its products & services better towards industry's needs
8. Promote members and volunteer's involvement with industry and community-at-large
9. Cooperate with Section, Chapter and Student Branch representatives in developing contacts and relationship with the industry and community
10. Interact with IEEE entities and subcommittees (SC) such as R8 IRSC, chapters and other neighbouring sections with respect to industry related activities.
11. Support IEEE local, regional and society/council conference activities by encouraging conference organizers to introduce industry tracks/sessions as well as continuing education programmes for industry professionals

Functions:

IRO functions can be summarized as follows:

1. Ensure that the section establishes and maintains contacts and links with local industries, national/sister societies and other organizations.
2. Provide guidelines and support to the Section, Chapter and Student Branch representatives and others as required
3. Distribute information regarding IEEE activities
4. Identify local needs in order to allow IEEE to adapt its offerings of standard – and/or tailored products and services.
5. Facilitate development of tools and materials to communicate with local industry and community-at-large
6. Recruit and promote volunteers from industry
7. Promote Continuing Education programmes and other local events with industry
8. Support local conference activities within councils/societies or sections
9. Conduct periodic visits to major industries and provide presentations as necessary to promote IEEE activities
10. Provide two reports annually to the IRSC Subcommittee.

Other Activities:

1. Partner with other national/regional professional societies to exchange information about events and strengthen collaboration between these professional entities.
2. Team-up with national computing, societies working in [IEEE designated fields](#), project Management and research centres.

IEEE membership is still rising, and this over all membership grades (except for associate membership). However, the rise has been considerably lower than in previous years. This is due to multiple causes. First of all, the retention rate in February was considerably lower than before. This means that a higher percentage of the members of 2011 did not choose to renew for 2012. Furthermore, the decline in the US continues, with strong losses in higher grade membership (excluding GSM). Lastly, the recruitment is lower compared to previous years (also in Region 8), possibly through the crisis.

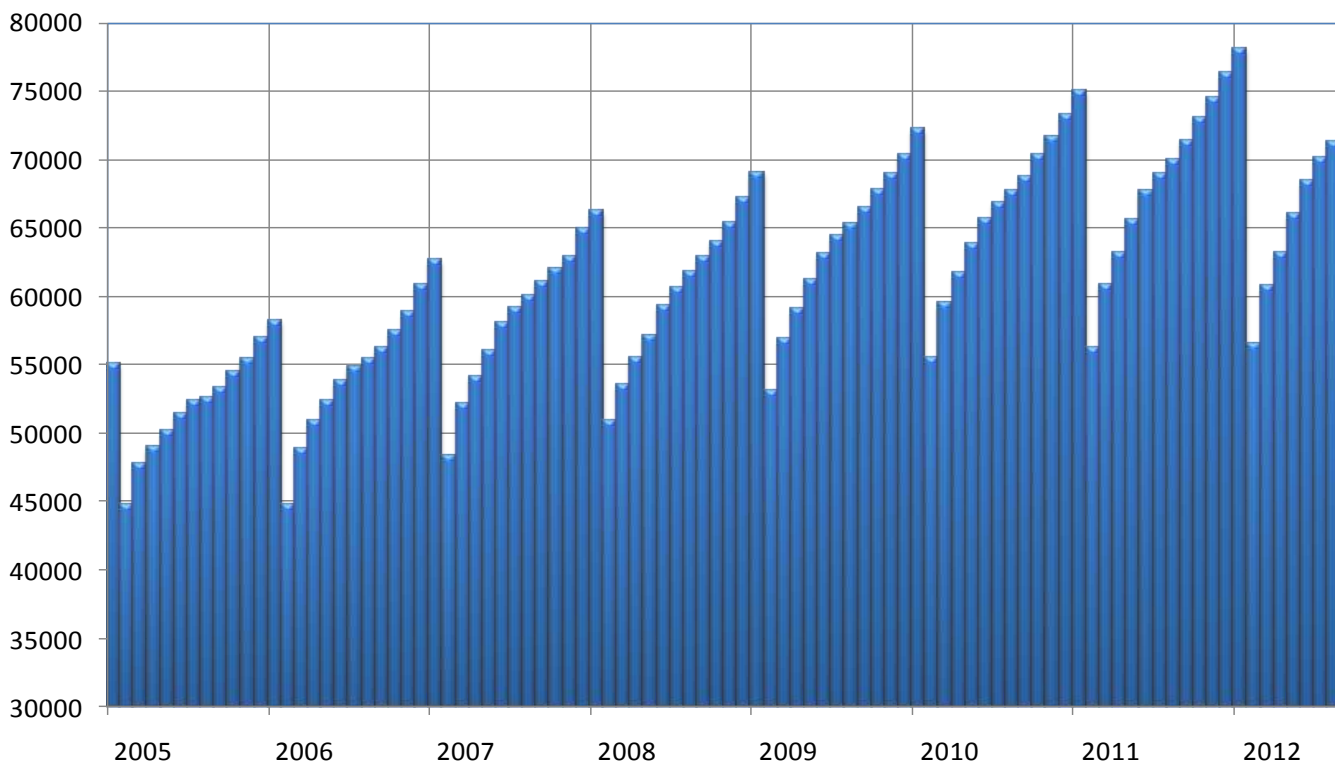
Regions 7 to 10 achieved an increase in membership. Regions 1 to 6 didn't.

Membership status in the Region



At the end of February, those members that did not renew are removed from the membership lists, and become "members in arrears". Each year a considerable part of the membership base decides not to renew its membership. This effect is compensated with a significant number of new members, compensating for our loss. This year, the drop was considerable and more than in previous years, and the membership numbers in March were lower than the year before. Together with IEEE headquarters (and more specifically through the help of Nick Lehotzky), the IEEE R8 MD team has contacted the larger sections to tackle this problem. Region 8 had the highest number of sections participating, and from our point of view, this activity was a

success. In the meantime we have recovered from that situation, but our growth is still considerably below previous years. As can be seen in the staircase (ZigZag) graph above, we are still gaining overall, with a long term growth.

As the new membership year has started in the middle of August, it is now time to start recruiting new members. Start with the members in your vicinity: your company, local university, your next (IEEE(?)) conference,...

More than counting members

Membership development is also more than just counting the numbers, it is also about informing the members about the possibilities within IEEE (making optimal use of their membership) and helping them (or the volunteer) through the difficult task of wading through the abundant information that is available online.

The membership development officer is also looking at the career path of the member: from student to GOLD to member and senior member and maybe even fellow. Many of our members are in the wrong category, often through lack of information.

Update of MD team activities after Berlin

MD presented itself at the SBC and Gold conference in Madrid. MD committee member Antonio Luque discussed the problems and opportunities of membership development as well as the available tools during the GOLD track.

Together with the GOLD team we have been organizing an associate member upgrade campaign which resulted in a significant upgrade of associate members to regular member.

We would like to upgrade about 500 members to senior members in 2012. We achieved our goal in 2011, and try to get the same...

2. STRATEGIC PLANNING

MAJOR GOALS

The PASC team has set three main goals set at the begging of the year:

- Increase the understanding and the extent of Professional Activities within Region 8
- Establish a program of Professional Activities for Region 8
- Professional Activities should provide a place for interdisciplinary collaboration and networking

SPECIFIC GOALS

- Publicize the Professional Activities by written material and different electronic media
- Coordinate Professional Activities in sections through local Professional Activities leaders
- Providing support and expertise to sections, chapters, societies and student branches within the region (e.g. Professional Activities materials)
- Establish active contacts with other committees within IEEE and other institutions (e.g. JCI)
- Organization of annual Professional Activities Summit.

3. REPORT

ACTIONS TAKEN

In 2012 actions were conducted in order to increase the level of activities and the understanding within the region:

1. Sections contacted to organize events to increase the level of activities within the region. Several workshops successfully planned for autumn-winter this year with organization of local PA volunteers.
2. In July Professional Activities Summit held within the program of SBC 2012 in Madrid, Spain. Three parallel workshops attracted volunteers at the half-day event (report will be published in R8 News).
3. Sections contacted to propose new PA trainers/speakers to increase the available volunteers and PA topics in Region 8.
4. Established active contacts with other committees and IEEE bodies, e.g. IEEE Professional Communication Society.
5. Maintenance of a web page with details on PA activities and contacts.
6. PASC Presentation was delivered by Emilio Corchado at SBC 2012 to student and GOLD members of the Region 8.
7. PASC Presentation at Sections Congress 2011 was recorded as a webinar this summer and will be available for online viewing. Best practices in the area of professional activities in Region 8 were presented by Matej Zajc, PASC chair.

REPORT ON PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES SUMMIT WITHIN SBC 2012 MADRID

PASC organized under the frame of SBC 2012 three interesting and successful workshops with the aim to prepare attendees for their workplace and improve their views for future career enhancements, giving the opportunity to develop project management and leadership skills.

On Thursday, there were a presentation addresses to all the participants importance of professional activities and to introduce the Saturday's Professional Activities track. It was very successful with an energetic and active audience, where several questions and discussions were hold.

The subjects and speakers were:

- Margaretha Eriksson (presented by Ali El-Mousa): Effective Communication and From Idea to Product
- Han van Loon: STARS Thought Leader workshop
- Byron Soulopoulos (JCI): Take back control of your own future

The great audience was based on enthusiastic volunteers, including students, gold members and senior members. There were around 100 participants. Their enthusiasm and whole-hearted engagement made the three workshops fun and rewarding for all of us. The feedback from the attendees was pretty good, and a clear sign of it was great participation. It is worthy to emphasize the fact that several Student and Gold Sections representatives contact the PASC in order to organized similar events in their countries.

Several possible improvements in the organization of the event were highlighted and will be considered in the organization of next event.

4. PLANS FOR 2012 AND STATUS ON THE TARGETED GOALS

We have several continuing activities:

- PA volunteers in Sections:

Communication with sections to appoint a PA volunteer in each section. Currently, there are 27 (out of 56) sections that have a volunteer for Professional Activities listed.

- Formation of a database for Region 8 approved speakers and workshop organizers.

PASC is setting up a web page that would put together information about PA events and PA trainers/presenters. During the process of creating the PA Summit program several new PA speakers were promoted and will be available in future events.

- Continue the Professional Activities workshops

Collaboration with other committees is initiated to plan common PA events, e.g. Professional Communication Society, and JCI.

PLANNED ACTIVITIES

The Region8 Professional Activities plans to:

- Increase the visibility of PA within the region through written material that includes information about Region8 PA, workshops organization, etc.
- Organize smaller regional Professional Activities Summits next year to train the future trainers in Region8 and to increase the number of volunteers involved in PA.
- Provide an updated PA Handbook manual to guide organization of PA events in sections.
- Continue with implementation of the Thought Leadership Program and similar programs in Region 8 with organization of pilot events.

Continue to collaborate with SEC to utilise the 'Standards Education Speaker's Bureau' in R8 which is similar to the existing Distinguished Lecturer program run by societies.

A one hour IEEE R8 webinar will be held on demystifying standards.

A keynote on the importance of standards will be provided at the UKRI section meeting on 22nd March.

The Denmark section, in cooperation with the Standards Education Speaker's Bureau (SESB), has arranged a lecture at Aalborg University (AAU) on the 28th March to be given by the speaker that will be in Denmark to provide the Grid Smart Grid Seminar and workshop.

mobile@all symposium, Munich

At the request of the IEEE-SA public relations team, identified a speaker on standards and regulations in respect to mobile communications for the mobile@all symposium being held in Munich on the 28th of June.

COMPLETED

ENERGYCON 2012

The IEEE-SA is providing an IEEE Standards booth at the conference as well as a 2 hour session with three speakers on IEEE Standards-Related Activities and Trends in Smart Grid. In addition an IEEE-SA International Standards Program staff member is also attending the meeting.

Speakers have all been identified and content developed, all funded by IEEE-SA.

London Student Branch Standards Education Workshop

This will be a one day demystifying standards workshop held on 18th September. This workshop will be the pilot for a new addition to the workshop program, a 'simulation' of a 'consensus building task'. The task will have to follow rules similar to that a standards development meeting would operate and as well as being educating, it is hoped it will be more engaging to the participants than the normal presentations.

Speakers have all been identified and content under development, funded by IEEE Standards Education committee.

Other opportunities

In addition the above I will continue to look for other opportunities to cooperate with the SESB.

Budget

In most of these cases the speakers are funded by the IEEE Standards Education Speakers Bureau and the facilities by the conference organiser or local section. The one exception may be EnergyCon 2012 which may require some contribution depending on how large of a standards presence is desired.

Standards education

Goal

Provide educational content about IEEE standard, both about the process, for example the inclusion of patented technology in standards, and also about the various standards themselves. (Collaboration with IEEE Standards Education Committee (SEC))
Encourage IEEE R8 students and faculty mentors to apply for IEEE SEC mini-grants program to help with graduate and capstone design projects with an industry standards component. The IEEE then publishes the results as a Student Application Paper. (Collaboration with Student Activities)

Status

Provide educational content

This is being provided mainly through standards tracks at major IEEE R8 conferences and other events (see above).

Student Application Papers

The next deadline for Student Application Paper mini-grant applications is 15th March 2012 so I will target promoting the next deadline of 15th June 2012. I'll do this through the IEEE R8 Standards web site, IEEE R8 news and working with the Student Activities. In addition a MoU was signed with Microsoft to jointly promote and fund this program in sub Saharan Africa which should also be promoted.

CEN CENELEC ETSI joint WG on standard education

With the assistance of the IEEE Brussels office, attended a meeting of the CEN CENELEC ETSI joint WG on standard education to provide an overview of the activities of the IEEE Standards Education Committee.

Budget

Strategic Planning Committee

We need open and timely communication, consensus building, quick response to new technology opportunities, imaginative problem solving and efficient use of resources - building a truly transnational IEEE that satisfies present needs but has a bold vision for the future.

(Key issues – similar as presented in the Spring Report)

Key steps to realize the Region 8 Mission

- Provide a platform for coordination, motivation and interaction among R8 units
- Provide a link between the Region and other IEEE organizational units
- Work to achieve smooth and effective operations in different countries
- Recognizing cultural differences, and effectively cooperating with national societies and other organizations
- Expand IEEE presence and activities to new geographic locations in R8, particularly in Africa and Middle Asia
- Promote the transnational nature of IEEE within the Region and the Institute

General remarks

- Strong support for the IEEE HQ initiatives and programs in Africa and Europe
- Strengthening cooperation with industry and national/regional organizations
- Strengthening IEEE leadership through engagement of Society Presidents and Division Directors (technical leaders) in Regional committees (as well as regional volunteers in the "global IEEE")
- Cooperation and synchronization of Region and the "global IEEE" activities (not only MGA, but also TAB, PSPB, EAB, IEEE-SA, etc) - providing more and better results

Future Region 8 structure

- There is a need to engage with the European Commission on behalf of our EU members in the Region to influence policy on regulation, education, etc.
 - It may be more influential for IEEE as a transnational entity to talk to the EC than multiple national societies.
 - This is not a reason to sub-divide the Region, but we should create a mechanism, taking advantage of the new office in Brussels, to represent our EU members to the EC.
- Investigate unifying some very small Sections (could undertake more activities, viability of Chapters)

Region 8 Committee Meetings

Region 8 Committee should continue the face-to-face meetings twice per year, as at present (while the Region can afford it). The face-to-face meetings build community and allow members to share their experiences. Because a large proportion of the committee changes annually, members benefit from two meetings per year.

Cooperation with industry

- Improve communications and networking with the industry at all levels
- Enhance IEEE Image within the industry as well as IEEE members image
- Provide Complete IEEE focused packages to various industry sectors.

Cooperation with national and regional Associations and Organizations

- IEEE Region 8 should encourage cooperation rather than competition with regional and National Societies
- IEEE Region 8 should work with IEEE Societies to discourage them from holding major events in parts of Region 8 without first making contacts with the local Section, Chapter and, where appropriate, National Society.
- IEEE R8 should investigate charitable foundations and European Commission schemes to ascertain whether any are appropriate for cooperation.
- IEEE R8 should strongly support cooperation between IEEE SA and relevant EU Committees as well as other regional organizations.
- IEEE R8 should support cooperation between professional organizations in Region 8 and relevant technical IEEE Societies.

Goals and status

The major tasks assigned to the IEEE R8 ad-hoc Publications coordinator for 2011, with the current status as of the second quarter of 2012, are summarized below.

Goal 1) IEEE Xplore access increase

Coordination with the staff to create roster of contacts

Overview

As the position has been created this year, there was no background material for it, so a roster of appropriate contacts with the IEEE Sales and Marketing staff had to be created

Status

Completed as a result of in-person introductions during the London meeting (March 2011) of the Region.

Reach-out to Section chairs

Overview

The position should be known to section chairs, and we should start fruitful interactions with them (who are the ones who know their local reality best). In some cases, the Section Chairs are not necessarily the “most interested” person, and therefore a wider outreach has also been done, but the Section Chair has been kept in the loop (where possible).

Status

Completed. Contact emails sent with description of position and request for simple information (as a means to check that email was received and read) in Q1 2011. Limited feedback from the chairs has been received. Follow-up has generated several subtasks, see below.

Reach-out to members

Overview

Given the very limited feedback received by reaching out through Section chairs, we drafted a short email to R8 members to get their interest into creating consortia. We may follow with a questionnaire to get important feedback on how to help penetration of IEEE Xplore (more formally known as: IEEE/IET Electronic Library (IEL)) in the region. The short message has also been publicized through the Region 8 News. A further article on development of the programme is planned for a next issue of R8 News.

Status

Email was drafted and reviewed by coordinator, staff, VC-TA, R8 Director. The email went out in Q3 2011, and a database of volunteers was collected and analyzed with (limited) feedback from IEEE Professional staff.

We organized a WebEx follow-up seminar held on May 12, 2012.

We worked with the staff on the case of France, where several calls and teleconferences were held leading to possibilities in getting other research institutes (such as Supelec) to get Xplore access.

Next steps for Q3 2012 are:

- Work with other select groups in particularly responsive Sections (in particular Egypt, maybe Ukraine) for fostering national consortia; we will start with a WebEx meeting with each, and maybe a follow-up local meeting

Getting in touch with national and sister societies to help penetration of IEEE Xplore access

Overview

The idea is to help IEEE Sales and Marketing broker deals with national/sister societies and orders to get their members access to IEEE Xplore at conditions tailored to the specific Sections.

Status

Chairs have sent limited feedback/contacts on this. Contacts are currently being developed (but still in a very early stage unluckily, working our way through layers of very slow organizational hierarchies):

- Italy: the “Consiglio Nazionale degli Ingegneri” or CNI (the national body of engineering, which is a chartered profession in Italy) is currently in a wider struggle with government on the laws of the profession, and unresponsive on our subject.
- Algeria: no success in reaching out to the National Administration of Scientific Research (<http://www.nasr-dz.org/contact.php>) which is the entity that can broker us a deal for the universities there. The Chair of the Algeria Subsection, prof. Khezzar, is working with Paul Canning through other directions.
- Malta: no results in reaching out to Chamber of Engineering.
- Russia NW: Russian Association for Engineering Education (www.raee.ru) should be the right way to get in, the Section chair is trying to help by figuring out the right contact inside.

Helping staff on specific tasks to improve access to IEEE Xplore

Overview

I have worked on a case-by-case basis with the staff to help foster cooperation with local volunteers on the ground

Status

An early task was to help Sales and Marketing staff identify appropriate contacts for Algerian institutions and universities. While unsuccessful on the Xplore side, this spurred the formation of a subsection in Algeria.

I helped P. Canning get in touch with the Lithuania section to organize a consortium there.

I helped P. Canning getting a local speaker from the UKRI section for a seminar.

With the help of the staff, we got a special agreement in place to allow our Italian members to use their IEEE publications for a nationwide assessment of research which could turn into a PR disaster for the Xplore platform.

I also helped with the University of Malta request to join the Italian consortium to access Xplore.

Goal 2) Acquisition of publications from sister and national societies

Collecting names and contacts for relevant national publications to include in IEEE Xplore

Overview

The idea is to help IEEE Publication Services and Products Board (PSPB) acquire interesting peer-reviewed journals or proceedings from national societies to further enrich IEEE Xplore and make it even more relevant at R8 level.

Status

Chairs have sent VERY limited feedback/contacts on this. Unluckily, even when publications were identified (e.g. Proceedings of the IEEE Russia North West Section; South African Institute of Electrical Engineers Africa Research Journal, <http://www.saiee.org.za/arj>), the processes within the “wider” IEEE has been slow. Funding has however been supported by the IEEE Foundation for this process, and it is likely that the proposals relating to the abovementioned journals will be discussed at an upcoming meeting series (Feb. 2013): IEEE Publication Services and Products Board (PSPB).
