- In 2013 both IEEE Computer and IEEE Communications Societies agreed to collaborate with the Publications Dept. in Piscataway
- 123 or 95% of IEEE's 128 Journals & Transactions now done in one department
- Provides consistent user experience with extensive suite of tools for authors and journal editors
- Provides economies of scale that lower per unit costs to all societies using NJ
- Dept. also attracting outside clients

 - Attracted approx. 40 attendees
 - -SII also facilitated outreach efforts with the Ministries of Energy and Health to identify opportunities

Workshop on Technical Standards, Consensus Building

- Held at the University of Strathclyde, Glasgow, Scotland, on 6 March
 - Third time this interactive consensus-building workshop was conducted by volunteers from the IEEE Standards Education Committee and professional staff
 - All-day workshop to promote Standards Education in the engineering curricula and to teach students, professors and working engineers about standards and standards development
 - Topics included the importance of standards to industry, fundamentals of standards development, and case studies on Ethernet Standards



New Style Event: Google+ Hangout on Air (HoA)

- IEEE Standards Association, collaborating with IEEE Global Meetings, Conferences & Events and IEEE Corporate Communications, hosted a Google+ Hangout on Air (HoA) as part of Restoring Trust in the Digital Age campaign
 - HoA was held on 28 January to coincide with International Data Protection Day
 - Topic was "Privacy for the People"; discussion focused on exploring bottom-up collaboration in harnessing global creativity and expertise for privacy innovation and technology solutions and to help advance cybersecurity



Region 8: Middle East and Africa Efforts Ongoing

- MOC signed with Kenyatta University (Kenya) to receive low-cost exhibits developed by IEEE volunteers
- Working with volunteers to plan two Teacher In-Service Program Training Workshops in Dubai and Kenya in 2014
- Participation in e-Learning Africa in Uganda (scheduled for May 2014)
- Partnership proposals with GESCI and iHub (Kenya) pending





Interactive Content Project Approaches 1 Million Articles

- > 970,000 articles converted to HTML as of 16 February
 - Total project goal is 2.3 million articles
 - All journals and transactions to be done by 31 March 2014
 - Interactive Magazines now being loaded
 - Standards to be added in second half of 2014
- Quality remains high only 0.0075% defects
 70 articles with errors out of 928,838 articles as of 5 February
- CrossCheck plagiarism detection expands
 - 93% of Periodicals use CrossCheck (up from 50% in 2012)
 - -29% of Conferences use CrossCheck (up from <10% in 2012)
 - -211,655 articles checked in 2013 up 57% from 135,145 in 2012



Our OA Experiences Almost 1 Year After Launch of IEEE Open

- Quality of IEEE accepted articles is being maintained
 - 39.7% of articles reviewed for the 5 fully OA journals are accepted

Article submissions are increasing

- Increased 23.1% from last report to Board (based on month-end Oct 2013 vs. month-end Dec 2013)
 - 223 new submissions in two-month period
- Collection of Article Processing Charges (APCs) is close to expectations at 93.4%
 - Our bad debt is lower than our experience with Overlength Paper Charges, Voluntary Page Charges, and Reprints, which has a collection success rate of 85% to 90%
 - Waivers are used for invited papers



IEEE Now Considering Future Options for Open Access

- Study shows despite slow uptake in journals there are sparks of support for OA among conferences and standards
 - Report was commissioned by the TAB/PSPB Products and Services Committee
- TAB and PSPB planning Summit meeting for this month
 - Would convene the PSPB Strategic Planning Committee, TAB Ad Hoc Committee on OA, representatives from Standards and Conferences, plus senior members of professional team
 - Summit participants will recommend strategic directions



ICX Phase 1 Stabilization Completed

- Phase 1 Stabilization for ICX completed
 - Necessary to officially retire the Informix database
 - -Completes three-year effort to retire the database
- Provides the backbone of services needed to enable IEEE's conference business to be more nimble and dynamic
