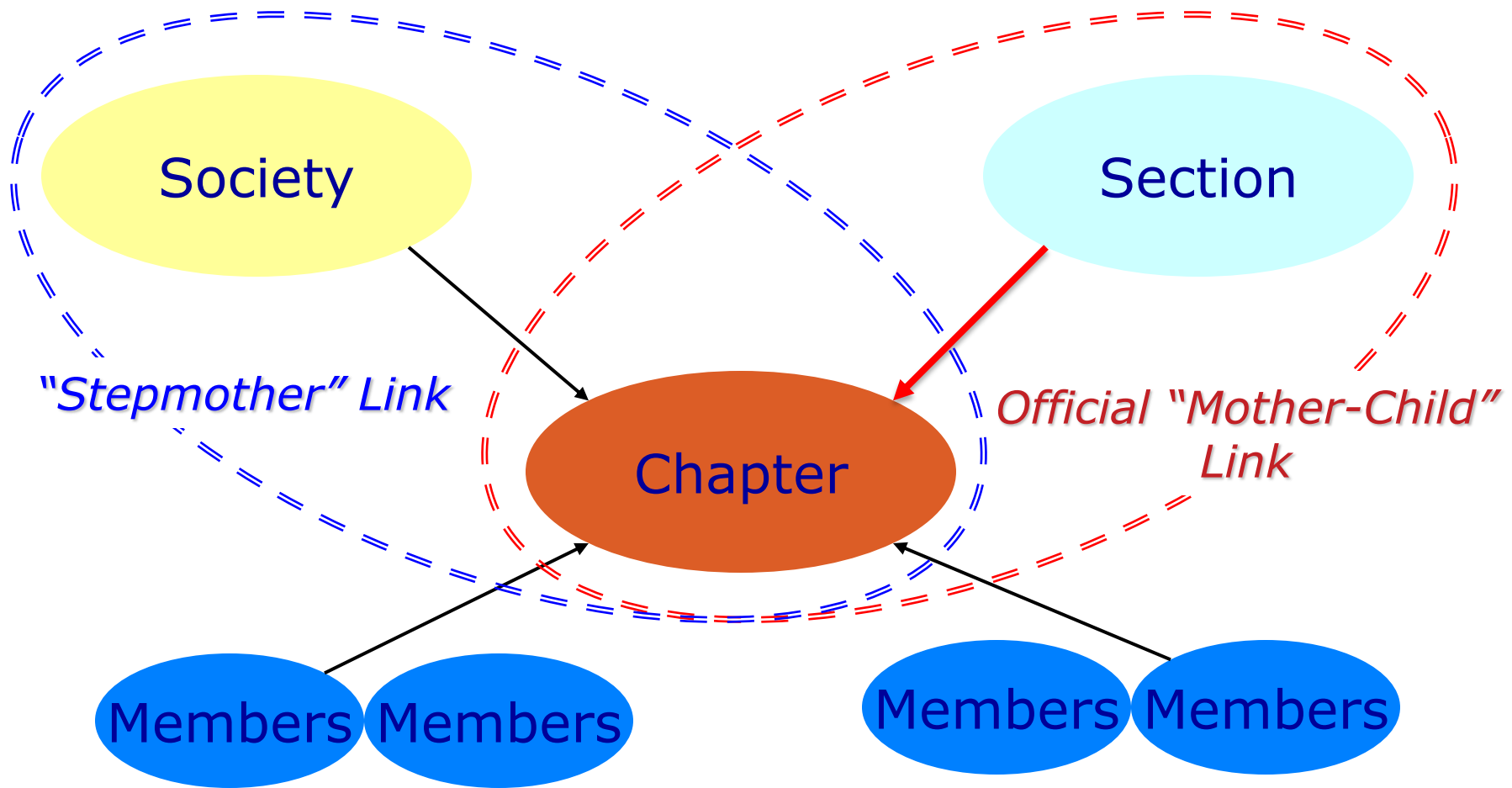

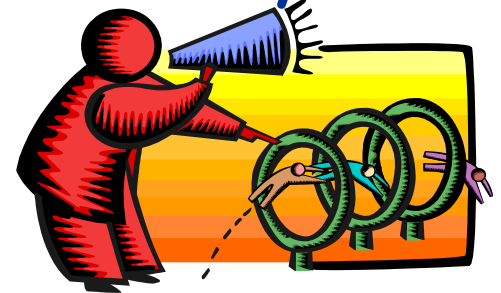


IEEE Section-Chapter-Society Triangle



What is a Chapter for?

- Provide services to local members
 - Bring information and knowledge
 - Be a Place for Networking
 - Be a “safe” Leadership Training Ground
 - Represent members interest at the Society



😊 *Chapters are where everything happens and activities meet the members*

Chapters have two “Parents”

- **Section** (primary responsibility for Chapters)
- **Society** (support and technical activities)
- In a healthy family both parents share in raising the children
- But... sometimes the two parents are not on speaking terms
- Sometimes the Chapters are like 'orphans'
- This can lead to delinquent behaviour!!!
- Chapter's health depends on both “parents” being present and supportive
 - Sections allow interaction with the local community
 - Societies facilitate interaction within a given FOI
 - Networking and membership growth draws from

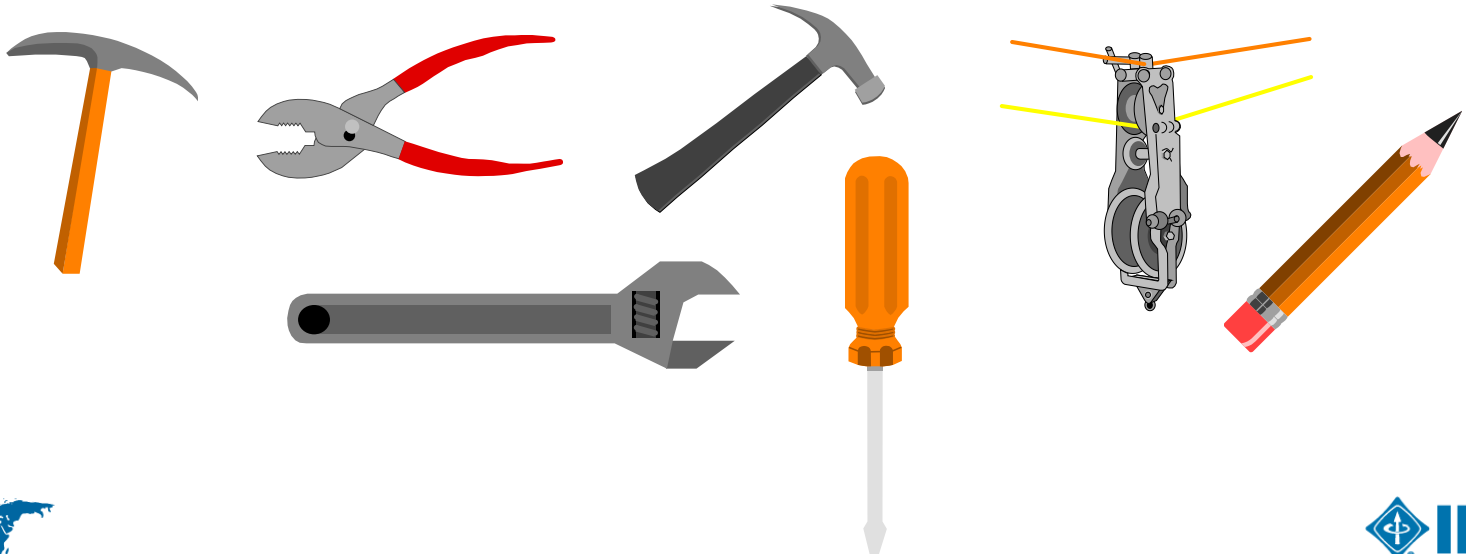


Why should the Section Care about (it's) Chapters?

- **Member Development:** Increased Networking and Technical activities for Members
 - Lectures, Workshops, Social and Professional events
 - Resource for hosting Society Symposia/Conferences
- **Membership Development:** Activities draw potential IEEE & Section members
 - Especially where IEEE is not well-established
- **Leadership Development:** Resource for potential Section leadership
 - Most Section Leaders evolved from their Chapter activities
- **Visibility and Outreach:** Increased visibility of the Section
 - Its structure - its publications - its meetings

Activity... Activity... Activity...

- **Technical Meetings**

- Facilitate/support technical meetings: The Core of Chapter activity

- **Visit and participate in chapter meetings**

- Outreach to the members
- The chapter feels the "parent cares"

- **Invite Chapter leaders to Section meetings**

- Make them welcome and encourage active participation

- **Distinguished Lecturers**

- Encourage chapters to make use of service, when available
- Facilitate joint meetings with talks of interest to several chapters
- Maintains ties with the Societies/Councils



Activity... Activity... Activity...

■ **Section-wide Socials**

- "Get to know" and "ice breaker" events
- Opportunities for cooperative events

■ **Organize wide-interest activities**

- Humanitarian/Community activities, Science Fairs, Competitions...
- Senior-member nights

■ **Cross-Section-Chapter activities**

- Cultural/technical knowledge transfer and sharing with other sections' or other societies' chapters
- Joint events with different sections and chapters

■ **Organize "Society Showcases"**

- Form new chapters in your Section
- "Win-win" for Section, Society and Chapter



Chapter Interactive Leadership Training Workshops/Camps/Retreats



- Train and Mentor the Chapter Leadership

- Soft skills improvement
- Leadership responsibilities
- Resources and Contacts
- Finances
- Membership development
- IEEE structure and operations

- You are training them for future IEEE roles in the... Section

- Hold Section-Chapter "get together-s"

- Socializing helps
- Exchange best practices
- Complain...



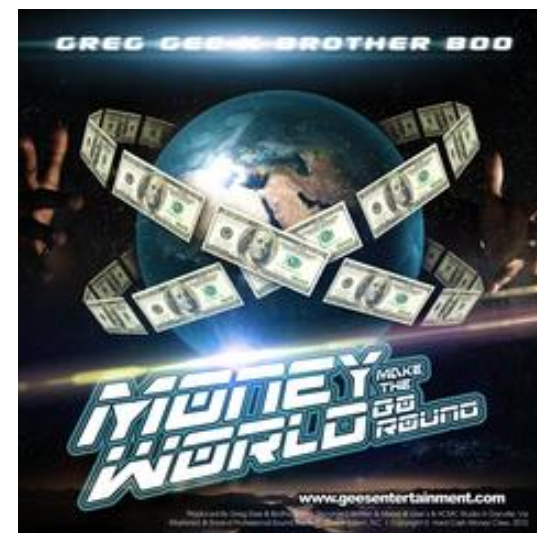
Chapter Reporting...

- The first sign of a chapter in trouble is when you receive no reports for a long time...
- **If you did not report it – you did not do it...**
- **Reporting is essential!**
 - The Section needs to know – to submit annual returns to IEEE HQ – otherwise they do not get the Section Rebate!
 - IEEE HQ needs to know – to judge if a unit is active or inactive (inactive units may be dissolved)
 - The Society needs to know – That is where the technical activities stem from...
...but typically more interested in technical details
 - Do not assume that if you tell just one part of IEEE, the other parts will find out!
 - IEEE HQ has many databases (with lots of obsolete, conflicting or incorrect data)



Chapter Funding

- **Money makes the World go around...**
 - Running chapters requires funding (surprise!)
 - Sections are the first financial resource for its chapters
 - Set a simple process for chapter funding
 - An excellent training for chapter officers:
 - Budgeting
 - Financial responsibility
 - Reporting and book keeping



Chapter Recognition



- Recognition NEVER HURTS!
 - Create a Section-wide Chapter of the Year Award
 - Present it in a nice ceremony
 - Publicize in the Region 8 Newsletter!
- Recognition NEVER HURTS!



Chapters' Section in Section's Newsletter



- **Communications ARE important**
 - Sharing successes
 - Exchange DL information
 - Publicize meetings
 - Publicize chapter successes
- **Chapter visibility within the Section and Beyond!**

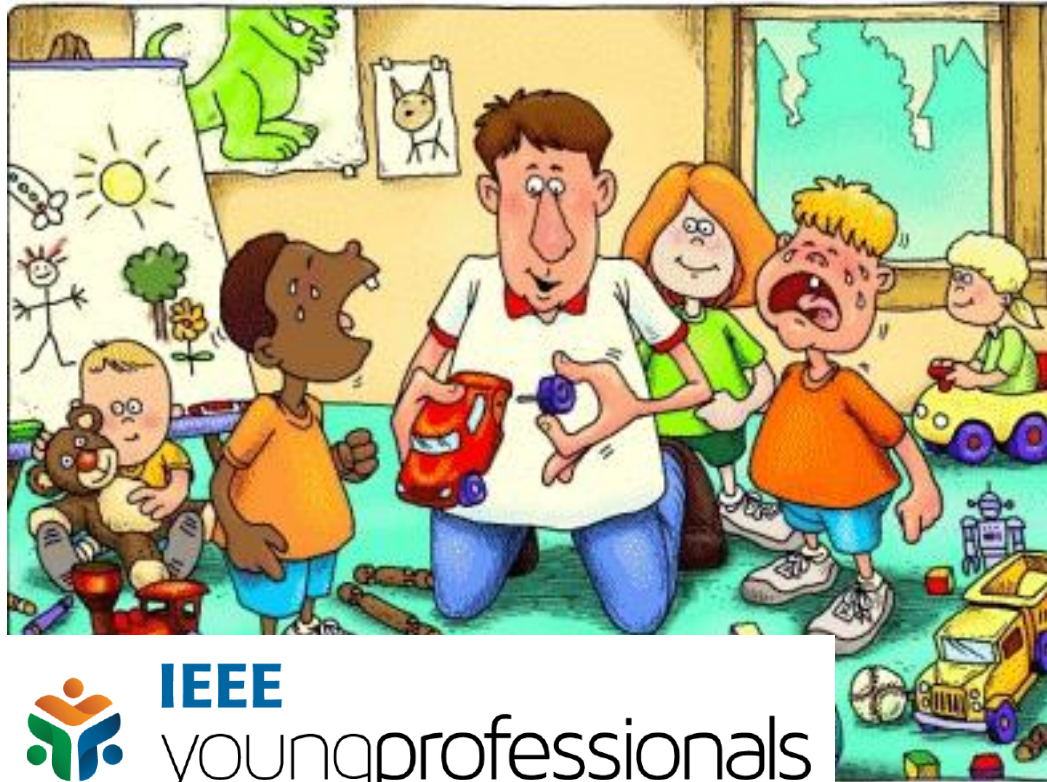
