- ▶ The intent of the Lab format is to provide a **live demonstration** of
 - an existing service or product OR
 - how to step through an online process
- ▶ A Lab can run from 10 to 25 minutes
- ▶ Presentation format provides more interaction and opportunity to get selective training on IEEE tools, programs, and products

- ▶ Convey ease of use, ease of access, support resources
- ▶ Augment a Breakout session – for example:
 - IEEE Online Collaboration Experience
 - Breakout session and 2 labs
 - Training Opportunities for Volunteers
 - Breakout session and 3 labs
- ▶ Provide more dedicated time to the topic; not bundled into a formal breakout session which may cover multiple topics
- ▶ Outcome should be to learn and use a tool, navigate a process

The goal is to provide opportunity to learn about a subject that otherwise you would have not had a chance to learn during SC2014

- ▶ **Presentation Format**
 - 5 minutes
 - Up to 20 slides that advance automatically every 15 seconds

MY PROFILE: Part I

The first time you open the app, you'll be brought directly to the My Profile screen.

My Profile can also be accessed via the small cog in the lower right-hand corner of the Home screen.

From here, you will be able to:

- Set your preferences to:
 - "Allow Messages" from other users
 - "Show Email" address in Attendee details
 - "Show Phone" number in Attendee details
- Logout of the application

The Schedule provides a chronological listing, either by Full Schedule or Individual Track, of sessions/events for each day of SC2014. Each session/event displays the following:

- Title
- Date

- Speaker(s) - and button for submitting Q&A
- Link to Session Survey
- Note: Navigation between days is provided via the bottom tab bar

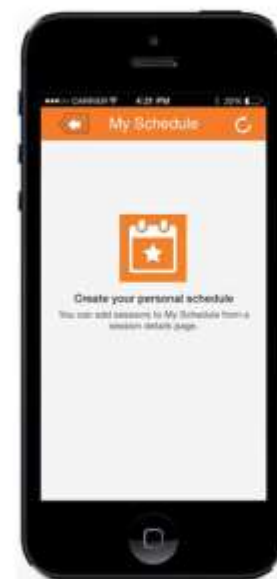

MY SCHEDULE

My Schedule allows users to add a chronological listing of sessions to their personal schedule, plus the ability to edit their schedule and view details of each session added to My Schedule. The My Schedule List displays the following information for each session:

- Start and end time
- Name
- Location



Items are added to My Schedule by selecting the "+" symbol on the session details page listed in the Schedule icon. Items are removed from My Schedule by selecting the "+" symbol again.

If you have not added any sessions or events to My Schedule, a message will appear that says, "Create your personal schedule. You can add sessions to My Schedule from a session details page."

SPEAKERS



The Speakers icon provides a list of speakers in alphabetical order by last name. Each listing includes the speaker's:

- Name
- Title
- Company
- Photo
- Bio statement

You can search for Speakers by:

- Entering the speaker's name or company in the header search bar
- Scrolling through the speakers list
- Tapping the first letter of the speaker's last name along the right side of the screen to locate all speakers whose name starts with that letter



Session Q&A allows you to submit questions to speakers ahead of time. You can access this feature through the Speakers or Schedule icons or directly through the Session Q&A icon!

Session Q&A

What do you want to learn about during SC2014? Did you know you can submit questions ahead of time to session speakers. There are several ways to submit a question:

1. Go to Session Q&A icon and select the session title
2. Go to Schedule icon, select the session title, and tap the Q&A button
3. Go to Speakers icon, select the speaker, then session title, and tap the Q&A button
