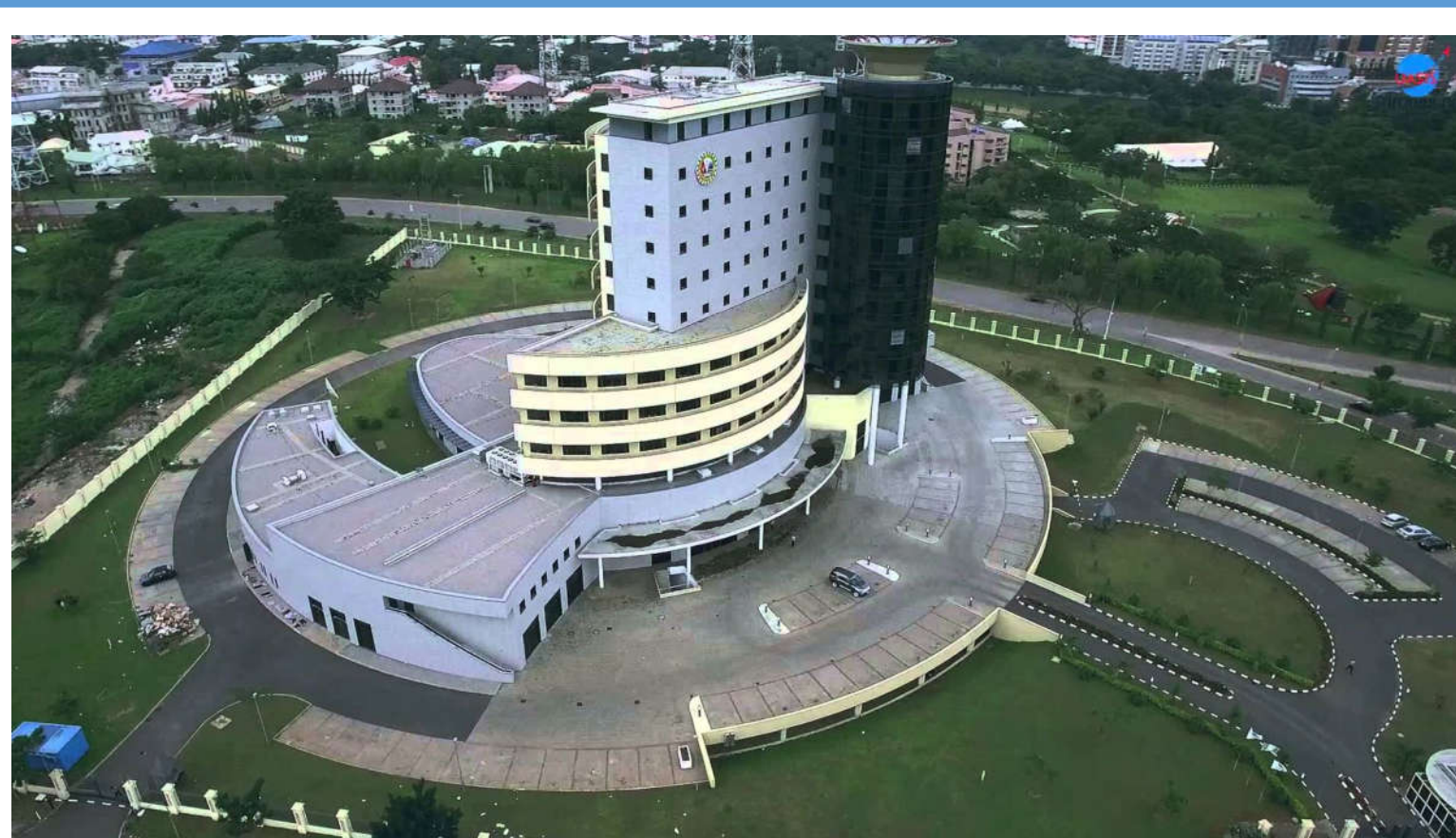


IEEE Nigeria Section actively participated in the Nigeria Energy Forum 2018.

The Nigeria Section had successfully conducted Teacher in Service Programs in 2018.



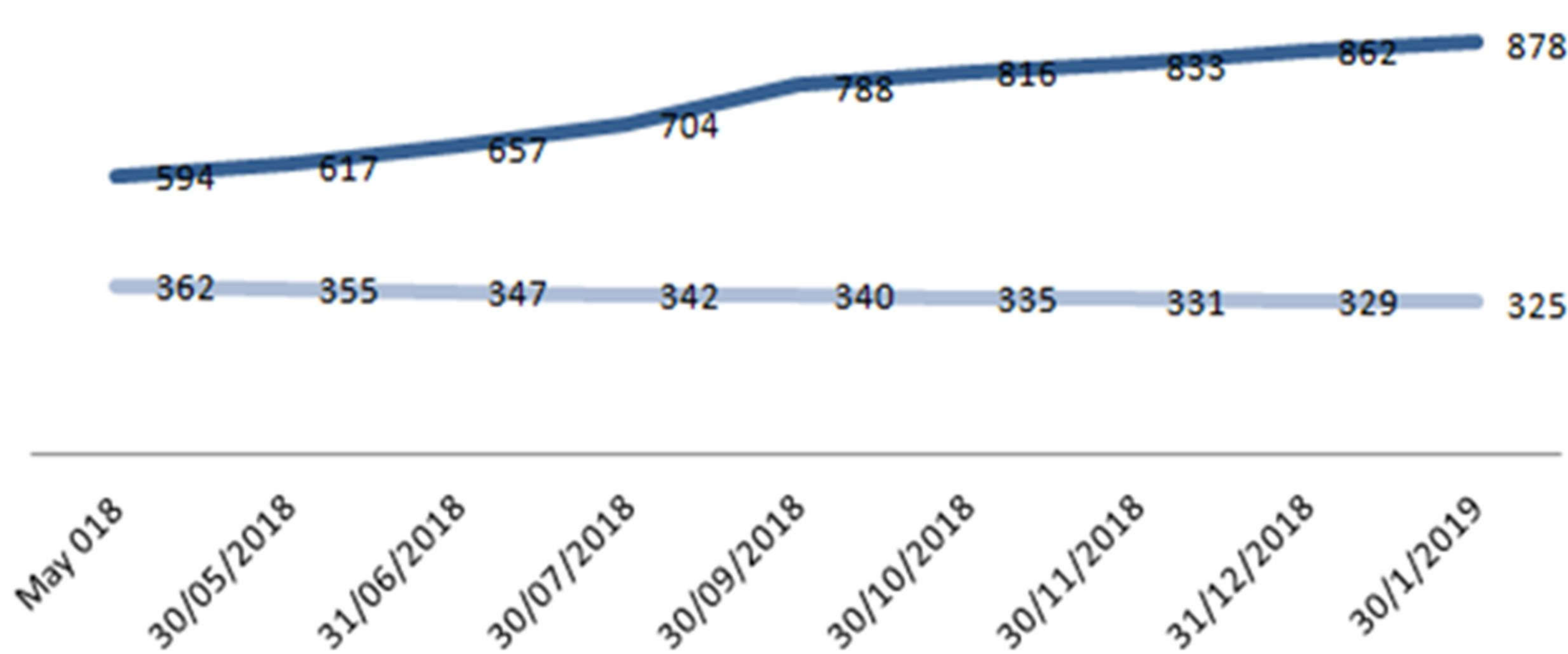
Visit Nigeria The Land of diversity
