- 5) It was challenging to secure funding for events in a timely manner, hence leading the affinity groups and student branches struggling to hold events
- 6) SIGHT: We see great opportunities here but need more guidence oh how to make best use of SIGHT in Kenya Section and Student Branches.eg Region 8 Funded training of members who will run affiliate groups so that the society may have a defined structure.
- 7) More support in accessing materials from IEEE worlwide like trainings and webnars. More support in getting speakers for public lectures.
