MINUTES OF THE 2ND EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (EXCOM) MEETING OF IEEE-GHANA HELD AT ZOOM CONFERENCE PLATFORM ON 14TH FEBRUARY, 2021

ATTENDANCE

Ten (10) members of the Executive Committee (Ex-Com) were present at the meeting. Intermittently, a few got disconnected midstream from the meeting due to some technical glitches with the zoom conference application but rejoined the meeting till closure.

OPENING

The meeting commenced at 5:15 pm with an opening prayer by **Mrs. Catherine Asirifi. Dr. George Eduful** who chaired the meeting then warmly welcomed members and tabled the agenda for discussion by members.

REVIEW OF PREVIOUS MINUTES

Minutes for the previous meeting were reviewed and the necessary corrections were effected to reflect the true account of proceedings of the last meeting. Mrs. Catherine Asirifi moved for the acceptance of the reviewed minutes and was seconded by Mr. Maxwell Addison.

MATTERS ARISING

Chairman requested Mr. Maxwell Addison to brief the committee on the preparations made so far towards the upcoming ICAST Conference. Mr Maxwell Addision intimated that the programme outline for the ICAST Conference had been prepared and submitted to members for inputs and finalization of conference theme or title. He also indicated that another outstanding task is to get the selected workshop topics finalized. Chairman also asked the proposers of topics for the workshop to make brief presentations to help the committee make informed decision regarding their suitability or otherwise. Dr Joseph Essandoh-Yeddu made a presentation on the topic 'Electrical Wiring for Certified Practitioners' where he proposed that there is the need to settle on a competent Speaker

for the workshop and issues relating to workshop fees. He also proposed that the workshop fee buildup should be finalized to cover either transportation or accommodation or both. **Dr Essandoh-Yeddu** also proposed that sponsorships could be sought from Energy Commission and other industries but IEEE should be ready to sponsor the workshop if the sponsorship parties fail to support.

Chairman indicated that the one week duration proposed for the workshop is long so it should be reduced. Dr Essandoh-Yeddu responded that the workshop could be held for 2 to 3 days and a local speaker will be convenient for the workshop because of Covid-19 travel restrictions. Chairman also raised the point that the wording of the workshop topic as proposed by Dr Essandoh-Yeddu means that the target group would be only Energy Commission certified persons and may not satisfy the purpose of the workshop by reaching a larger audience and rake in the expected revenue. Mrs. Catherine Asirifi intervened that at the invitation of a certain agency she once attended a similar workshop which was open to all and was free. Chairman then requested the committee to critique the topic and come out with a final version that would be more appropriate. He also asked the committee to vet the content of the workshop as presented by Dr Essandoh-Yeddu and make useful inputs.

Ing. Franklin Kumassah was asked by the Chairman to take his turn to do the presentation of his proposed topics. Ing. Kumassah intimated that he is unable to make the presentations with a well-prepared PPT because when he proposed those topics on the Ex-Com WhatsApp platform members could not scale them down to the best three topics as suggested by the Chairman. Nevertheless, he went ahead and made a brief presentation on three topics namely: CubeSat Design and Implementation (launch), Fluorescent Imaging for Agriculture and Galamsey Monitoring, and Traffic Light Systems. Chairman then indicated that the topics presented by Ing. Kumassah would be more suitable for 'Tech-Talks' instead of workshops. Ing. Isaac Boakye affirmed Chairman's position that these topics will be apt for 'Tech-Talks' and intimated that All Nations University has successfully launched Ghana's first satellite. He further indicated that Mr. Mensah Sitti would have affirmed his assertion if he was here. Dr Essandoh-Yeddu suggested that Ghana Space Center should be involved in the Satellite Tech-Talk and possibly pay a working visit to the centre. He believes this will help the students who will participate in this Tech-Talk get first-hand information. Chairman then asked Mr Maxwell Addison to take note of the topics so that he incorporates them into the programme outline.

There was the question of how to make IEEE attractive to members and prospective or interested persons. Mr Maxwell Addison indicated that he had something on paper to share with members. He proposed that there is the need to create a local database of active and non-active members to help map a strategy for reaching out to them. He also indicated that IEEE-Ghana should do periodic visitations to companies and universities to do presentations on IEEE and the benefits one can enjoy as a member. He also said student branches across the various universities are dormant because of unhealthy politics and there is the need to visit and place periodic calls to encourage them to renew their membership and remain active. Welcoming freshers (newcomers) on campuses is another way Mr Maxwell Addison proposed we could use to make IEEE vibrant in the universities. Chairman

suggested that Vtool would be easier in reaching out to members and carrying out outreach advocacies. Mr Maxwell Addison responded that using Vtool in contacting members will look like it is a communication from the IEEE system and it can only be used to communicate with active members. Inactive members will need a local database for contacting. Mr Maxwell Addison also intimated that some do not know IEEE and there is the need to do advocacy and encourage them to join the largest professional organization in the world. Chairman indicated that universities have branches and sought why they have been inactive. Mr Maxwell Addison responded that these student branches are dormant because of unhealthy politics on university campuses. Chairman proposed that WhatsApp platform should be used to reach out to members. Ing Isaac Boakye commended Mr Maxwell Addison for the yeoman's job done so far and suggested that emails should be used to reach out to members. He also recommended that IEEE-Ghana should lobby for a slash in membership subscription fee for students.

2021 IEEE PROGRAMMES

Chairman reminded the committee that Mr. Maxwell Addison and Dr. Essandoh-Yeddu are only tasked to coordinate the preparation of IEEE programmes for the year and members are to provide inputs for its finalization. He therefore proposed that the committee assist in coming out with the annual programme outline with an action-plan. Mr. Maxwell Addison indicated that he had sent a programme outline onto the Ex-Com WhatsApp page to help us develop a detailed programme. Chairman then requested that we have a general programme outline with details and a master plan. To this, Mr Maxwell Addison responded that what he sent onto the Ex-Com WhatsApp page captures what Chairman is requesting. Ing. Felix Akpaglo intervened that we should give ourselves a week to put all the necessary information together to have a complete annual programme with the necessary details. Chairman therefore asked Mr Maxwell Addison to contact the proposers of the topics for the content details to incorporate them into the programme outline.

On the question of assisting interested persons who wish to register with IEEE, the Chairman suggested that IEEE members do so as part of their education. Ing. Isaac Boakye responded by indicating that people are always skeptical about using their bank visa cards to pay for their membership subscription fee. He reminded the committee of an old practice that IEEE-Ghana used to pay for the subscription for members who could not do the payment themselves. He said this method involves one paying into the treasurer's account and calls the treasurer with proof of payment to activate their membership subscription by completing the payment process. He also indicated that the subscription used to be hedged using a certain formula so that any new applicant is given the cedi equivalent to pay into the treasurer's account. Chairman imtimated that payment of membership subscription fee is simple and easier but he was quick to admit that there are challenges members face when making payments for their membership fees. That is, sometimes the payment transactions do not go through. Mr Maxwell Addison supported the position or stance Ing Isaac Boakve took on how to help members register using the old practice or method. Ing. Felix Akpaglo then asked whether those facing challenges with the payment of their subscription fees are in the majority. Mr Maxwell Addison responded that there a lot of people facing this payment challenge and he has had cause to use his visa card for payment for others. Chairman indicated that a bank debit card can be

used for the payment of subscription fee but **Mr Maxwell Addison** averred that IEEE system does not accept debit cards as it is not enlisted as one of the payment choice.

IEEE ACCOUNTS

Ing. Isaac Boakye indicated that transfers are done from one account into the other to prevent them from going dormant. He said one of the accounts attracts a lesser charge when receivables or transfers are done than the other but he is unable to distinguish or differentiate the accounts. Dr Essandoh-Yeddu said that it is safe to keep or lodge funds in forex accounts based in United States. Ing. Kumassah asked about what it entails when an account is aid to be dormant. He further asked whether that meant there is no money lodged in that account. Chairman answered in the negative. Dr Essandoh-Yeddu indicated that accounts a rendered dormant when there are not transactions on that account for some time to check if the account holder is alive. Mr Maxwell Addison told the committee that current accounts attract periodic deductions and even if these accounts are not operationalized for a certain threshold period the deductions will still continue and the accounts may run into deficits. The treasurer, Mr Ebenezer Minkah, briefed the committee that the said account is not dormant per banking terms because we have some monies therein except that there have not been transactions on the account for a while. He therefore promised to provide members with the bank statements of accounts. He also indicated that it is imperative to write to IEEE Headquarters on the said account before any transactions can be made into the account.

ICAST CONFERENCE

Chairman suggested that we defer discussion on the ICAST Conference because a key member working on the conference details is not in attendance.

OTHER MATTERS

Ing. Kumassah proposed that IEEE-Ghana section should partner with the National Science and Maths quize by sponsoring this flagship programme. This partnership or sponsorship will offer us the leverage to give much publicity to IEEE-Ghana section. This publicity will also help introduce IEEE to SHS leavers early enough before they enroll into the universities. Chairman agreed that this is a worthy enterprise to pursue and suggested that we should do publications or adverts in the dailies for the needed publicity. He also intimated that in South Africa for instance all university students are members of IEEE because they value research and know that IEEE can assist them in their research pursuits. Dr Essandoh-Yeddu suggested the need for an IEEE newsletter to advocate the benefits of joining IEEE and share testimonies from members to encourage others to join IEEE. Chairman, then gave each member the opportunity to give their concluding remarks or comments. Mrs. Madina S, Adams said he agreed largely to the issues discussed so far in spite of the interment disconnect she suffered with the zoom platform. Ing. Felix Akpaglo indicated that there is a science gap in solving our problems as a country because students of today are not interested in IEEE unlike South African students. Chairman indicated that in South Africa you are paid about 500 dollars when you publish an article. Mr Precious Asante also proposed that students subscription fees should be reconsidered for a reduction.

CONCLUSION

In the absence of further discussion, **Ing. Isaac Boakye** moved for the close of the meeting and was seconded by **Dr Joseph Essandoh-Yeddu**. The meeting ended at 5:54 pm with a closing prayer from **Mr Ebenezer Minkah.**
