Committee Goals

Progress against goals since the last report

- Conducted strategy development sessions with the 2023 committee to develop goals and KPIs.
- Our member Sally Musonye participated in a global WIE webinar to celebrate 25 years of IEEE WIE. The event was organized by IEEE Turkey Section Students on 16 December 2022.
- IEEE WIE International Leadership Summit (ILS), Egypt The Summit was held in Cairo, Egypt on 21-22 November 2022. The session was well attended and featured successful female leaders from Egypt. Region 8 WIE was represented by our 2022 Chair Maria Alexendra-Paun.
- Collaboration with Region 8 PEASC and IEEE EAB to promote IEEE STEM Summit (6-10 December 2022, Global) and Diversity & Inclusion in STEM (22 November 2022, Portugal).
- 2022 Chair Maria Alexendra-Paun represented Region 8 WIE in the fall Region 8 meeting(October 2022).
- Co-organized a Technical Paper Writing Preparation Workshop on 31 October 2022 with R8 SAC and Africa Council.



- Below is a summary of the membership growth of WIE:
 - 1) Figure 1 illustrates R8 WIE membership by month over from Jan 2021 to Feb 2023. YoY growth is up by 9% in Feb 2023.

Points of Concern

- The number of IEEE WIE members is low even in high revenue countries, as the total number of female members is also low. Not all of them are IEEE WIE members.
- There are still 20 sections that do not have a Section WIE AG. We hope that such WIE AG groups can be created in the future.
