Goals

1. Decentralize the operation of the Student Activities Committee (SAC) into smaller manageable units with a plan to evolve into a standing committee in the future.

KPI: Established min of 3 Ad-hoc with Clear responsibilities by April 2023

2. Promote good communication between student members, counselors, and the Student Activities Committee.

KPI: 100% dissemination of information as it relates to respective Chairs SB, SBC, and Counselors using appropriate tools and platforms.

3. Improve student membership experience in the region and promote membership growth, Membership Development initiatives.

KPI: Conduct a survey twice a year targeted to student branch leadership and ensure min of 10 training Virtual/In-person to address concerns in 2023.

Reach out to non-active student branches while targeting to improve the active involvement of 20% of non-active student branches while working with student branches to appoint/nominate membership development officers in active student branches by end of the year.

4. Increase collaboration with other OUs YP/WIE/HuAc/ AfI

KPI: Collaborate 100% with YP, WIE, HuaC, and AfI on student-related initiatives year-round.

5. Increase awareness of varieties of Student programs, events, Contests/competitions.

KPI: Restructure the content of the SAC website for ease of understanding by end of Q2 while intensifying social media content.

Conduct and complete the student paper contest for 2023 and initiate the 2024 edition of the contest

6. Supporting xSYP/SYP and making sure the success of the flagship congress.

KPI: Work closely with Young Professional AG and provide 100% support to the respective host of the 2023 Cross-Sectional Congresses by providing templates that will aid the success of the congress.

7. Recognize Excellence with Awards

KPI: Reach out 100% to qualified leadership of student branches to apply to MGA and Regional awards during the open call while providing content for each category that will aid their application.

Status

1. Student Activities Committee Update

3 ad-hoc Committee Constituted as follows:

Ad-hoc Committee on Contests, Awards, and Recognitions - Vera Markovic (Chair)

This committee is responsible for the Student Paper contests, IEEE Xtreme Competition, IEEE Duino Competition, R8 Students Awards, MGA Awards, and Other Student competitions in Region 8.

Ad-hoc Committee on Training and Leadership Support - Khaldoun Taktak (Chair)

This committee trains, coordinates, and generates feedback from the student branch Chair, Student branch Counselor, and Student Branch Chapters. Provide orientation to newly formed student branches, Student branch chapters, and affinity groups. Basically, working closely with the respective student branches, and student branch chapters in the Region. Affinity Groups to understand their needs and provide services that meet the needs.

Ad-hoc Committee on New Initiatives - Vildana Hrnjić (Chair)

Responsible to work closely with other OU and committees on student-related initiatives collaboration from Ideation to implementation within IEEE or outside of IEEE on new Initiatives.







2. Student Membership Statistic

Student membership is at **26,302** as of July 2023 which indicates a **2955** increase in the number of students membership compared to July 2022. This trend shows a 12.66% increase in student membership compared to July 2022

This records **122** increase in the number of reports submitted from March 2023 as a result of the extended deadline to 15^{th} April 2023. **58%** Student Branch Annual Plan Reporting **444** submitted plans* **35%** of the Student Branches have not been active

6. Rebate

The rebate distribution has been concluded and shared among the respective beneficiaries. In Region 8, the total potential rebate, including member rebate and allotment, was **\$108,418**. However, the allocated rebate amount was **\$46,768**, leaving approximately **\$61,650** unclaimed due to inactivity by some student branches.

The highest received by a student branch was **\$1,698**, awarded to **ESPRINT Tunisia**. On the other hand, the lowest rebate amount was **\$52**, allocated to Rafik Hariri University Lebanon. A total of **205** student branches benefited from the rebate program. Tunisia received the highest sum among all the countries, with a rebate of **\$13,402**, accounting for approximately **28.6%** of the total rebate distribution.

7. Cross-Sectional Congresses

5 out of 7 Cross-Sectional Congress to be held this year! The Africa Student and Young Professionals Congress in Abuja was held on 27th through 29th, of July with 105 participants. The next cross-sectional Congress is the North Africa Student and Young Professionals Congress in Cairo, Egypt. The Ad-hoc on training and leadership support provide bi-weekly meetings to check on the progress and health of the planning committees.

9. Student Paper Contest

The 55th edition of this prestigious and long-standing R8 student contest final was successfully completed on July 6-7, 2023. The exciting city of Torino in Italy served as the perfect venue, and organizers of the IEEE R8 flagship conference, EUROCON 2023, graciously hosted the final part of this year's Student Paper Contest (SPC).

IEEE R8 Director Vincenzo Piuri presented the FIRST PRIZE in the SPC 2023, which went to **Jonathan Parion** from UCLouvain University, Belgium, for his paper entitled: "Low-temperature admittance spectroscopy for defect characterization in Cu(In,Ga)(S,Se)2 thin-film solar cells". For the SPC first prize winner, there is a cash award of **\$800**, and additionally, his student branch (SB) UCLouvain University SB, gets a special award of **\$250**.

The winner of the SECOND PRIZE, worth \$500, is Jakub Lála from Imperial College London, UK, for his paper entitled: "Coarse-Graining of Molecular Dynamics Using Neural Ordinary Differential Equations", while the third prize and a cash award of **\$200** were granted to **Qihan Yang**, who presented the paper, and his co-authors **Wenqiang Lai**), **Ye Mao**, **Endong Sung**, and **Jiangnan Ye**, all from Imperial College London, UK. The title of their paper is "Knowledge Distilled Ensemble Model for sEMG-based Silent Speech Interface".

The 2023 call for Proposal for the local student paper contest is ongoing and about 20 proposals from Section and Student branches are already approved worth **6000 USD**.

Finally, the student paper contest rules were also updated and approved by OpCom.

10. MGA Awards

The call for nomination for the MGA and R8 awards was announced, to encourage students from our Region to participate, Promotional videos were created to help with the publicity.

Regional Exemplary Student Branch Award – **37 Submissions** Larry K. Wilson Regional Student Activities Award – **20 Submissions** The Darrel Chong Student Activity Award – **14 Submissions** Outstanding Branch Counselor and Branch Chapter Advisor Award – **13 Submissions**
