Committee Goals

To achieve our mission, we have developed a comprehensive set of goals and KPIs which encompasses Regional activities, support for Section activities, strengthening Student Branch AGs and recognizing dedicated volunteers.

Progress against goals since the last report



- Conducted strategy development sessions with the 2024 committee to develop goals and KPIs.
- Award nomination increased by 90%.
- WIE membership increased by 50%
- Our social media followers increased by 50% and we created a new WIE account on LinkedIn.
- Organized STAR program at EUROCON 2023.
- Our member Ana Margarida represented R8 WIE at the HISTELCON 23 virtually on 8th september..
- IEEE WIE International Leadership Summit (ILS), Morocco The Summit was held in Ifrane, Morocco on 16-17 November 2023. The session was well attended and featured successful female leaders from Morocco. Region 8 WIE was represented by our member Ala Chalghaf.
- IEEE WIE International Leadership Summit (ILS), Uganda The Summit was held in Kampala, Uganda on 16-17 June 2023. Region 8 WIE was represented by our member Sally Musonye.
- Myself and the past chair Maria Alexendra-Paun represented Region 8 WIE in the WESYP Switzerland on 15-16 September where we had a panel discussion presented by 4 Female leaders.
- ASYP 2023 congress on 27-29 July 2023 at Baze University, Nigeria. WIE hosted a panel discussion with 6
 representatives from industry in Nigeria, IEEE WIE section chair, and Sudan sub-section. The committee was
 represented by our member Sally Musonye.
- AFRICON 19-22 September 2023 in Nairobi, Kenya.WIE had a keynote session at the pre-conference and conducted 2 panel discussions in the main event featuring key leaders from industry and academia from Africa. The backgrounds included engineers, scientists, telecommunication and science teachers. The panels were moderated by the WIE Kenya chair and section chair. Sessions were facilitated by our member Sally Musonye.
- 21 June 2023- The participation of our member, Roua Touihri, as a speaker in the virtual conference organized by the WIE affinity group of the IEEE Esprit Student Branch which offered a valuable opportunity to share her professional and academic journey, as well as her role as a woman in the fields of technology, research, and innovation. Our member also actively engaged in sharing insights and responding to inquiries to promote our activities and programs.
- Below is a summary of the membership growth of WIE:
 - 1) Figure 1 illustrates R8 WIE membership by month over from Jan 2021 to Feb 2023. YoY growth is up by 9% in Feb 2023.

Points of Concern

- The number of IEEE WIE members is low even in high revenue countries, as the total number of female members is also low. Not all of them are IEEE WIE members.
- There are still 20 sections that do not have a Section WIE AG. We hope that such WIE AG groups can be created in the future.
