

#### **Vice Chair Student Activities**

#### Goals

1. Decentralize the operation of the Student Activities Committee (SAC) into smaller manageable units with a plan to evolve into a standing committee in the future.

**KPI:** Established min of 3 Ad-hoc with Clear responsibilities by Q2 -2023

2. Promote good communication between student members, counselors, and the Student Activities Committee.

**KPI:** 100% dissemination of information as it relates to respective SB, SBC, SB AG leadership using appropriate tools and platforms.

3. Improve student membership experience in the region and promote membership growth, Membership Development initiatives.

**KPI:** Conduct a survey twice a year targeted to student branch leadership and ensure min of 10 training Virtual/In-person to address concerns in 2023.

Reach out to non-active student branches while targeting to improve the active involvement of 20% of non-active student branches while working with student branches to appoint/nominate membership development officers in active student branches by end of the year.

4. Increase collaboration with other OUs YP/WIE/HuAc/ AfI

KPI: Collaborate 100% with YP, WIE, HuaC, and AfI on student-related initiatives year-round.

5. Increase awareness of varieties of Student programs, events, Contests/competitions.

**KPI:** Restructure the content of the SAC website for ease of understanding by end of Q2 while intensifying social media content.

Conduct and complete the student paper contest for 2023 and initiate the 2024 edition of the contest.

6. Supporting xSYP/SYP and making sure the success of the flagship congress.

**KPI:** Work closely with Young Professional AG and provide 100% support to the respective host of the 2023 Cross-Sectional Congresses by providing templates that will aid the success of the congress.

7. Recognize Excellence with Awards

**KPI:** Reach out 100% to qualified leadership of student branches to apply to MGA and Regional awards during the open call while providing content for each category that will aid their application.




Figure 1: Rebate distribution to Sections




Figure 2: Student Year on Year Membership Data






Figure 3: Bar chart showing feedback on Expertise of the trainers




Figure 4: Bar chart showing feedback on General rating of the training




Figure 5: Bar chart showing feedback on Training in One word

5 were held successfully in 2023-2024. The MESYP was held successfully in February 2024 in Jordan. The reorganization of the hosting for 2025 was carried out jointly with the YP team. The call for proposals to host was announced on the 6<sup>th</sup> of October as shown below.

The R8 team successfully evaluated the 2023 season of awards, MGA certificates are electronically circulated by MGA SAC and were presented personally at R8 SYP 2024, in Grenoble France. # R8 Student Paper Contest 2024 and 2025

• The 57<sup>th</sup> edition of the R8 student paper Content (SPC) successfully concluded at the IEEE R8 flagship conference, EUROCON 2024, Porto, Portugal on June 25-27. There were 32 valid SPC papers in 2024 SPC edition, and top 5 papers were selected by an international jury. All five finalists and four jury members were present at the Oral Finals. The finalists presented their outstanding work during a special conference session. Based on two phase results, the jury selected the winners. The SPC awards ceremony took place during the conference gala dinner on June 26.



- The report on SPC 2024 was published on the SAC website and SAC social media, including a video with a testimonial from the winner about his impressions of the contest. An article on the SPC 2024 was prepared for publishing on the SAC website and in some other publications.
- This year, having in mind a big number of submissions, we announced also which papers secured ranks 6 through 10 and sent the corresponding certificates to their authors. Aditionally, we sent the certificates on the participation in the R8 SPC to all other authors.







• A Call for papers for the R8 SPC 2025 was announced on 31 May.



- Promotional activities were carried out regularly.
- A webinar on how to write a good technical paper is organized (speaker: Eszter Lukacs, 7 October 2024). Among others, it is aimed at training students prospective SPC 2025 authors.



• R8 SPC Operations Manual 2024 completed and uploaded on SAC Drive.

#### **Local SPC Events Program 2024**

• Three Calls within the Local SPC Events Program 2024 were announced and concluded. The program is aimed at encouraging and supporting R8 Sections and Student Branches to organize their own local Student Paper Contest events. The first Call was intended for R8 Sections and second and third Call were open for R8 Student Branches.



- Total number of valid applications was 16. Finally, 12 proposals are approved for financing, up to 500\$ for Sections and up to 300\$ for Student Branches.
- The distribution of grants concerning OU type is 6 Sections and 6 SBs. Regional distribution is as follows: 4 Europe, 6 Africa, 2 Middle East.



• The implementation phase is ongoing.

# MGA SAC and Region 8 SAC Awards

- Judging process for the R8 Student Awards has been completed. Almost all SAC members have contributed to judging. Final decisions were made by R8 Award & Recognition Committee.
- Judging of nominations for the MGA Student Awards has been completed for some awards or still ongoing for some others. MGA team coordinates this process, and most of SAC members are involved in judging the applications.
- A very nice Student Awards Ceremony was held at IEEE R8 SYP 2024, Grenoble, France




