Section Vitality

The last election for the term 2024-2026 was held in October 2023. The elected/appointed officers are listed under the <u>Executive Committee</u> (ExCom) of the section's <u>website</u>. According to the section's <u>bylaws</u>, the next election is foreseen during the last quarter of 2026.

Students

Overall, 6 different student branches (SB) belong to the section.

Only 2 student branches are really active (Linz and Vienna).

The other SBs are somehow active but compared to the pre-pandemic time they organized fewer activities and events. Anyhow, to have a tighter collaboration and information/knowledge exchange between the different groups/branches of the section, the so-called "Stammtisch" idea was born. In addition to the regular meetings of the ExCom, the Officers, and the General Assembly, the section will organize 2-4 informal meetings with section members regularly. Further we organize in the last 2 years a walk following a dinner. This should bring students and members closer together.
