2. <u>IEEE Milestones Program</u>

- The IEEE Milestones program honors significant technical achievements in all areas associated with IEEE (see IEEE Bylaw I-104.11). It is a program of the IEEE History Committee, administered through the IEEE History Center.
- **IEEE Milestones** recognize the technological innovation and excellence for the benefit of humanity found in unique products, services, seminal papers and patents. Milestones honor the achievement, rather than a place or a person.
- Milestones are proposed by any IEEE member, and are sponsored by any one or more IEEE Organizational Unit(s) (OU) such as IEEE section(s), society(ies), chapter(s) or student branch(es).
- **Special Citations** recognize events or institutions which although not technical achievements as defined by the Milestone Program have contributed to the profession. Examples might be: museums or archives with substantial holdings pertaining to the history of electrical engineering and computing, the holding of a seminal conference, or the formation of a technical society.

- The total number of dedicated Milestones in Region 8 (.xlsx) is currently 59, with 61 plaques located in 18 Sections: *UK and Ireland* (20); Italy (9); Germany (6); Benelux, France (4); Israel, Poland, Russia (Northwest), Spain, Switzerland (2); Croatia, Denmark, *Hungary*, Norway, Serbia and Montenegro, South Africa, Sweden, and Ukraine (1). Note that France and UK and Ireland have one Milestone (#44) in common, with different citations on the plaques, and that one of the Milestones in Poland (#205) has a duplicate plaque in Germany.
- In addition to the actual Milestones, there are 2 Special Citations: one in Serbia and Montenegro (Belgrade) and one in Germany (Paderborn).

3. Engineering and Technology History Wiki

The <u>Engineering and Technology History Wiki</u> (ETHW) is a wiki-based platform that allows IEEE members and Organizational Units to collaboratively <u>preserve and share</u> their history. ETHW hosts the <u>Milestones</u>, <u>Oral Histories</u>, and <u>Archives</u> programs, and also allows IEEE members to contribute to Wikipedia-style topic articles or to preserve their own <u>First-Hand Histories</u>.

Celebrating achievements in IEEE's fields of interest

The IEEE Milestones program is one of the most visible ways IEEE celebrates the profession. It is a program of the IEEE History Committee, administered through the IEEE History Center. IEEE Milestones recognize the technological innovation and excellence for the benefit of humanity found in unique products, services, seminal papers and patents.

Milestone plaques are mounted in publicly-accessible places such as University Campuses, Railroad Stations, Public Parks, Historic Buildings, and Corporate Buildings. They are seen by hundreds of thousands of people every day.

- Milestone proposals can be submitted by any member (even a student member) on ethw.org, sponsored by any IEEE organizational unit
 - Obtain the sponsorship of an IEEE Organizational Unit (Section, Society, Council, Chapter, etc.) that will pay for the plaque(s) and ceremony – Endorsement by the appropriate Section is required
 - Obtain the permission of the owner of the site where the Milestone plaque will be mounted
- An advocate is chosen to review proposal and assist proposers
 - Ensures sufficient citations and references to support the claim
 - Helps develop a concise and accurate citation
 - Recommends IEEE History Committee action on proposal
 - Advocate must be member or former member of the IEEE History
 Committee
 IEEE | Region

- Review by experts and approval by the advocate, including the wording of citation
- Approval by the Milestones Subcommittee in case the proposed citation contains the name of a person
- Approval by the IEEE History Committee
 - IEEE History Committee votes whether or not to recommend IEEE Board of Directors final approval
 - If the History Committee recommends approval, History Center staff submits proposal to the Board of Directors for final action
- Approval by the IEEE Board of Directors
- Milestone dedication ceremony

IEEE Milestone dedication ceremony

- Dedication ceremonies are in the hands of the sponsoring IEEE Organizational Unit. May be as elaborate or simple as desired
- Opportunities for local press, corporate, and political involvement, and high visibility for IEEE
- IEEE President and/or VIPs often attend. Do not forget to invite a representative of the Region (Director, past Director, History Activities Coordinator, ...)
- The approval process takes about 12-14 months, depending on History Committee and Board of Directors meeting schedules
- Proposers should allow time to plan the dedication ceremony and to cast plaque(s) — Plaques take 9 weeks to cast
