CompEuro '92, sponsored by Region 8 and the Computer Society, was organised jointly by the Benelux Section and Delft University of Technology; it took place in the Hague in May 1992. The Conference was attended by over 280 and offered a large selection of lectures, tutorials, and invited and contributed papers. Participants were unanimous in praising the scope and scientific quality of the Conference. There was a strong interdependence between the many fields of Computer Science, prominent among which was logic programming. The research and development community is gradually understanding how computers can act as intelligent agents in a multitude of applications, for which logic programming is providing the necessary basis. Other important topics were:

Logic synthesis using binary decision diagrams, strategic decision analysis, public key systems and packaging systems for high speed high power computing


For Students, By Gözde Bozdagi

Three conferences are planned for the coming months, as announced at the last Region 8 Committee Meeting in May





AFRICON '92

By Dr. Jacob Baal-Schem This, the third All-African Conference, was held in the Ezulwini Valley, Swaziland from 22nd-24th September 1992. The principal sponsors were: the South African Institute of Electrical Engineers, the Foundation for Research and Development, the South African Section, and Region 8. The main themes of the Conference were: Telecommunications, Energy, and Education, all in relation to the requirements of Africa.

An audience of some four hundred was present to hear His Majesty King Mawati III of Swaziland conduct the opening ceremony; the King was accompanied by the full Swazi cabinet and the audience included representatives from some forty nations. Professor Daan van Wyck acted as Conference Chairman, and Professor K. Richter gave the opening lecture. Mr. Meril Buckley, IEEE President, was unable to atend owing to illness; he sent his greetings.

From the two hundred and fifty abstracts submitted, the Programme Committee accepted one hundred and seventy papers; these were presented in two Plenary sessions, six Parallel sessions, fifteen Dialogue sessions and six Workshop sessions.

The Conference proved to be an excellent occasion for establishing contacts between engineers from South Africa, the United States, Europe and African states. The theme of Education and Technology aroused considerable interest among the delegates, especially in view of the modern means now available for the distribution of knowledge.

The enthusiasm of the participants for these Conferences was evident. Representatives from both African and non-African countries were nominated to assist with the organisation of the next AFRICON.

In his closing speech the success of the conference was expressed by Prof. P.W.van der Walt, past Chairman of the South Africa Section: "AFRICON '92 has changed the face of Electrical Engineering in Africa".
