UKRI Section Hosts Region 8 Committee

Scotland's magnificent Capital City of Edinburgh played host to the Region 8 Committee from 31 August to 2

September 2001. The canny Scots used their influence with a Higher Power and provided some excellent weather for the event.

For those unfamiliar with the city, the dominant feature is undoubtedly the imposing Edinburgh Castle. The Old Town is commonly taken to be any part of the link that stretches from the Castle to Holyrood Park, along the Royal Mile. The New Town stretches north of Princes Street, from which there are magnificent views of the Castle.

As a break from the serious business of the Region 8 Committee on Saturday evening, the delegates were taken on a conducted tour of Holyrood Palace. The guides provided a wealth of information of Scotland's romantic and turbulent past. After this the delegates were regaled at a Civic Reception, which was hosted most graciously by the Deputy Provost of the City of Edinburgh, Councillor Marion Morton. In her pre-dinner address Councillor Morton warmly welcomed the delegates, and humorously suggested that the world famous Edinburgh Tattoo was in honour of the Region 8 Committee, as were the fireworks, which would round off the Tattoo. Director Levent Onural replied on behalf of the delegates, and expressed their pleasure at being in Edinburgh.

On the Sunday evening, a formal dinner was hosted by the UKRI Section at the Castle. In grand Scottish style, the delegates were welcomed by a bagpiper in full regalia. It is difficult to imagine a more magnificent setting. The views from the battlements of the Castle of the city below and the sea beyond are breathtaking to say the least. The delegates were again taken on a conducted tour of a few of the many fascinating features of the Castle, starting with the Great Hall. The highlight of this all too short tour was undoubtedly the opportunity to view the Emblems of State of Scotland. The dinner itself was an opportunity for delegates to renew friendships, and to cement new ones. The two generous Sponsors were Scottish Enterprise, and Electronics Scotland. Tom Hammons, Chair of the UKRI Section, in turn welcomed the delegates on behalf of the Sponsors.

Three well organized and attended technical visits were arranged on Monday 3 September, to BAE Systems and Edinburgh University, to AGILENT and Heriot Watt University, and to Cruachan Pump Storage installation operated by Scottish Power on Loch Awe. The latter visit included seeing some of Scotland's most beautiful countryside with a short break at Inveraray on the return. Again the weather was excellent on these trips.

The UKRI Section is to be congratulated on their organization for the Region 8 Committee Meeting and the superb func-

Section and Chapter News

From the Chapter Coordination Committee (CCC)

Motto: The local chapter activities are the most important key to membership growth, improvement of society image and realization of globalization process.

Region 8 has the highest number of chapters of all the regions and the formation of the new chapters is still going very well. There were 307 Chapters in R8 at the beginning of September 2001 and 14 of them were newly established during the first 8 months of this year. The Societies with the highest number of chapters are

Russia (24), UKRI (21), Poland (19), Germany (17) and France (16). Many Chapters in Region 8 have increased their activities and their mixture of technical meetings, workshops and conferences offer something for all members, whether they work in industry, academia or government.

Some Societies in R8 have many Chapters, e.g. MTT - 36, COM - 34, ED - 34, AP - 28, SP - 25, CAS - 25, C - 25, PE - 25 and LEO - 22. Most of them are very active in organizing Chapter Chairs meetings in conjunction with the main Societies' conferences in Region 8. Since 1996 an annual Divisions I and IV Region 8 Chapters meet-

ing has been held. This meeting grew as a joint MTTs/EDS initiative to promote chapter formation and particularly to promote participation in Eastern Europe and the former Soviet Union countries and in the last year it was transformed into a biannual event (the next one will be held in September 2002 in Milan, in conjunction with EuMW'02).

In 2001 two Societies decided to organize Chapter Chairs meetings in Region 8: *ComSoc Regional Chapter Chairs Congress* - June 11-12, Helsinki in conjunction with International Communication Conference ICC'0 (report by Jacob Baal-Schem in this issue);

MTTS Chapter Chairs Meeting – September 23, London in conjunction with European Microwave Week EuMC'01 (report will be presented in next issue).

An informal meeting of SP-S Chapters will be held during the ICIP Conference, in Thessaloniki October 09, 2001.

R8 Committee has approved a few motions allowing stronger financial support for chapter activities:

- chapters can receive from Region 8 financial support for some of the conferences and workshops (organized by the chapter) – applications should be sent to the R8 Conference Coordinator (Tariq Durrani, e-mail: durrani@strath.ac.uk) at least 6 months in advance
- chapters in low-income Sections can receive additional financial support (particularly for new initiatives) if they do not receive enough support from Societies – applications should be sent to the R8 Chapter Coordinator (József Modelski, e-mail: modelski@ieee.org)
- Region 8 will encourage and support holding a Chapter Chairs meetings in conjunction with the main conferences held in the Region by their Society
- Region 8 will provide financial support for Chapter Chairs/ Representatives to participate in the Chapter Chair meeting and attend the Conference.

One of the results of the meetings in Seville and Edinburgh is the decision to organize in Region 8 the competition *"The Best Chapter of the Year"* in the two categories:

- for "Junior" Chapters (established after January 01, 1996)
- for "Senior" Chapters (established before January 01, 1996)

The evaluation criteria are based on:

- the technical activities (e.g. conferences, seminars, workshops and technical meetings); the educational activities (e.g. tutorials, short courses, lecture series, Distinguished Lecturers Program)
- the level of membership advancement and recruitment
- other activities (e.g. public relations activities, competitions sponsored by chapter);

Section Chairs will receive *Nomination Forms* before November 30, 2001, and

they can nominate one chapter in each category. Submissions should be made before February 28, 2002. The winners for the year 2001 will be announced during the R8 Committee Meeting in Budapest, April 20-21, 2002.

Communications Chapters Chairs meet in Helsinki

All Communications Chapters Chairs of Region 8 (Europe, Africa and the Middle East) were invited by the Communications Society to a two-day Congress held in Helsinki, Finland, during ICC 2001. The Society covered their travel and accommodation expenses and 27 out of 34 Chairs participated in this important event.

The Congress participants were welcomed on Monday, 11 June 2001, by the Communications Society President – Roberto de Marco and by Region 8 Director – Levent Onural, who both stressed the importance of Technical Chapters of Societies in IEEE activities. The Congress was chaired by Trevor Clarkson, Chairman of the EAME Board of ComSoc and Chairman of the UKRI Communications Chapter.

The Helsinki meeting was actually the third meeting of Communications Chapters Chairs in Region 8. The two former meetings were organized by Region 8 and held in London and in Florence. At the Helsinki meeting, the Region 8 Committee was represented by Director Levent Onural, Chapters Coordination Committee Chair – Josef Modelski and Communications Chapters Coordinator – Jacob Baal-Schem.

Most of the Congress was devoted to getting acquainted with the services available to Chapters – both from the Society and from the Section and Region. ComSoc President-elect Celia Desmond (who becomes Society President on January 1, 2002), presented an overview of the Communications Society, the second largest Society in IEEE, with over 51,000 members worldwide – 20% of whom live in Region 8. Celia, Trevor, as well as vice-Presidents and officers of ComSoc introduced the par-

ticipants to support available from the Society to its Chapters – grants to attend Conferences, Distinguished lecture tours, Chapter funding for activities, free periodicals and more. Carole Swaim, the ComSoc staff person who diligently organized this event, provided information on how to contact Officers and staff in ComSoc.

Region 8 Chapters Coordination Chair Josef Modelski emphasized the Chapters activities in the Region in his presentation. Chapters are the focus of technical activities and of Conference initiation and are getting strong support from the Sections and the Region. ComSoc Chapters Coordinator Baal-Schem mentioned that the number of ComSoc Chapters has grown to 34 (from 13 in 1993 and 26 in 1999) and that ComSoc membership in the Region has grown from 10% of total membership in 1985 to the actual 20% of total Communications Society members. We have in the Region 25% of all Chapters of the Society. These Chapters are very active and have held Seminars and Conferences in Hungary, Russia (including the Internet Conference in Moscow) as well as participated in Regional Conferences. Several National Societies have sister agreements with ComSoc. All these activities are performed in close cooperation with the Communications Society.

Several sessions were devoted to preparing recommendations on future programs, and provided additional opportunities for interaction and discussions among the participants. Among the recommendations: Show the value of ComSoc for professionals and students; ComSoc to provide a certification program for engineers; set up a mechanism to bid for a Conference at the Chapter site; joint Chapter activities (for example, inviting another chapter for a visit); organize local workshops at Regional Conferences; provide incentives to retain volunteers etc.

Helsinki RCCC was certainly an important event and will definitely foster the activities of Communications Chapters in IEEE Region 8.

Germany

On June 29, 2001 the German chapter of IEEE PES awarded the prize for the best diploma thesis for the second time. The prize winners are Mr. Wilko Krass, Erlangen, and Mr. Hagen Schmoeller, Aachen. Mr. Krass studied electrical engineering at the University of Erlangen-Nuernberg and wrote his thesis at the chair of electrical energy supply directed by Prof. Dr.-Ing. G. Herold. The title of his excellent diploma thesis was "Subsynchronous Resonances." Mr. Schmoeller's excellent thesis is titled "Optimal Load Dispatch in Hydrothermal Energy Supply Systems considering Market Environments" and has been prepared at the Institute of Power Systems and Power Economics at the RWTH Aachen, University of Technology, which is directed by Prof. Dr.-Ing. H. J. Haubrich.

The prize was sponsored by ABB and SIEMENS and the award took place at SIEMENS in Erlangen, Germany. Members of the Executive Committee of the IEEE PES German Chapter as well as representatives of ABB and SIEMENS joined the ceremony.

The prize will again be awarded in 2002 when SIEMENS will alone sponsor the prize. It includes DM 5000, which is expected to be spent for a visit to the next IEEE PES Summer Meeting. In this message I would like to briefly report about the "know-how" of the Tomsk Student Branch. To share information about IEEE activities in Siberia and the Tomsk SB an e-mail list has been created. Its URL is <http://subscribe.ru/catalog/tech.siberia/>

The e-mail list is intended for Russian-speaking participants, because our main problem is attraction of new members, especially students. By means of our list the participants regularly receive the information on scientific conferences, programs, research grants, and news of the Tomsk Chapter and Student Branch. The main emphasis is laid on information about IEEE benefits and where to publish students' scientific papers.

We are receiving many letters from students and scientists who are interested in IEEE activities and IEEE membership. Today there are more than 1000 list subscribers, and 60% of them live outside

Russia. This shows the great opportunities the Web provides for the description of IEEE activities in the Siberian region and growing interest in the IEEE. We are sure that the list promotes our activities very well.

At present the "subscribe.ru" service is the best holder of more than 2000 e-mail lists in the world. The service "subscribe.ru" (and its English version "felist.com") allows the maintainer of an e-list to receive a profile of subscribers with generalized statistics from questionnaires, which each subscriber fills out. Statistics of our list shows that there are about 40 percents of subscribers related to radio engineering and electronics. Half of the subscribers are between 18 and 25 years of age, 17% are women, the third part holds an M.S., and only one tenth another scientific degree.

We have named our virtual e-list "Siberian Section of IEEE" in a hope that our activity will promote the creation of a Siberian Section. There are no doubts that the list has established and enhanced new contacts between participants, and increased IEEE membership by means of Siberian savvy resources.
