In its November 2021 meeting, the IEEE Board of Directors has revoked Milestone #46 (originally entitled *Marconi's early wireless experiments, 1895*, and later renamed to *Early Swiss wireless experiments, 1897*, with an updated citation), which was located in Salvan, Switzerland.

The total number of dedicated Milestones in Region 8 (.xlsx) is currently 59, with 61 plaques located in 18 Sections: UK and Ireland (20); Italy (9); Germany (6); Benelux, France (4); Israel, Poland, Russia (Northwest), Spain, Switzerland (2); Croatia, Denmark, Hungary, Norway, Serbia and Montenegro, South Africa, Sweden, and Ukraine (1). Note that France and UK and Ireland have one Milestone (#44) in common, with different citations on the plaques, and that one of the Milestones in Poland (#205) has a duplicate plaque in Germany.

In addition to the actual Milestones, there are 2 Special Citations: one in Serbia and Montenegro (Belgrade) and one in Germany (Paderborn).
