Dubrovnik Travel Advisory: Your Essential Guide to a Seamless Journey, Including Transfers to Rixos Premium Dubrovnik

I. Welcome to Dubrovnik: The Pearl of the Adriatic

Dubrovnik, often celebrated as the "Pearl of the Adriatic," stands as a beacon of historical grandeur and natural beauty on Croatia's southern coastline. Its designation as a predominantly fly-in destination underscores its unique geographical position, making air travel the most common mode of arrival for international visitors. The city is globally recognized for its magnificent historic Old Town, a UNESCO World Heritage site, which, alongside its spectacular landscapes, contributes to its undeniable charm and allure.

Key Facts: Currency, Official Language, and Climate Overview

Understanding the fundamental practicalities of a destination is crucial for any discerning traveler. In Dubrovnik, these include the local currency, language, and prevailing climate conditions.

Currency: As of January 1, 2023, Croatia officially adopted the Euro (EUR) as its currency, replacing the Croatian Kuna. This transition to the Eurozone simplifies financial transactions for many international visitors. While major credit cards, including Visa, Maestro, and MasterCard, are widely accepted across the city, it is prudent for travelers to carry some Euro cash. This is particularly useful for smaller establishments, local markets, and certain public services, such as public restrooms, which may specifically require a 1 Euro coin. Automated Teller Machines (ATMs) are readily available throughout Dubrovnik, providing convenient access to cash. The recent currency shift means that while digital payments are prevalent, the continued recommendation to carry cash acknowledges that some businesses may still be adapting or prefer cash for smaller transactions, ensuring a smoother experience for the traveler. Official Language: The official language spoken in Dubrovnik is Croatian, a Slavic language. However, visitors need not be concerned about significant language barriers. English is taught as the primary foreign language in Croatian schools, resulting in a considerable number of residents, particularly among younger generations and those working within the tourism sector, possessing the ability to communicate effectively in English. While English proficiency is widespread, making an effort to learn a few basic Croatian phrases, such as "dobro jutro" (good morning) or "hvala" (thank you), is always perceived as a polite and welcoming gesture by locals. The widespread understanding of English significantly enhances the ease of navigation, ordering, and general interaction for international visitors, allowing them to engage more deeply with their surroundings without constant reliance on translation.

Climate Overview: Dubrovnik enjoys a Mediterranean climate, characterized by hot, dry summers and mild, wet winters.

 Hottest Months: July typically stands out as the hottest month, with average temperatures hovering around 25°C (77°F) and daily highs often reaching 85°F. The peak "hot season" generally extends from mid-June to early September, offering ideal

- conditions for beach activities and exploring the city.
- Coldest Months: Conversely, January is the coldest month, with average temperatures around 9°C (48°F) and daily lows dropping to approximately 43°F. The "cool season" spans from late November to late March.
- Rainfall: November is identified as the wettest month, recording an average of 198mm (5.5 inches) of rain over roughly 10.3 days. In stark contrast, July is the driest, experiencing only about 1.0 inch of rain over an average of 3.5 days, making it a prime time for outdoor pursuits.
- Sea Temperature: For those planning to enjoy the Adriatic Sea, August offers the warmest sea temperatures, averaging 25°C (77°F), which is perfectly suited for swimming and water sports.

II. Essential Pre-Departure Information

A successful journey begins long before arrival. Comprehensive preparation, encompassing entry requirements, health and safety considerations, and an understanding of local customs, is paramount for a smooth and enjoyable experience in Dubrovnik.

Entry Requirements and Visa Guidelines

Croatia's integration into the Schengen Area has streamlined travel for many international visitors.

- Schengen Area Membership: As a member of the Schengen Area, Croatia allows citizens of many nationalities, including those from the United States, to travel visa-free for tourism or business purposes for a period of up to 90 days within any 180-day period.
- Passport Validity: A valid passport is universally required for entry. It should generally have at least three months of validity beyond the intended departure date from the Schengen Area and include at least one blank visa page for entry stamps. Maintaining a passport in good physical condition is also advised.
- Required Documentation: Beyond a valid passport, authorities may request additional
 documentation upon entry. This could include a return or onward travel ticket, proof of
 accommodation (such as hotel bookings), and evidence of sufficient funds to cover the
 duration of the stay.
- Upcoming EES (Entry/Exit System): A significant procedural change is anticipated with the European Union's new Entry/Exit System (EES), expected to launch in October 2025. This system will digitize border crossings for non-EU nationals, replacing manual passport stamping. Upon a traveler's first visit to the Schengen Area after EES implementation, they will be required to create a digital record, which involves submitting fingerprints and having a photo taken at dedicated booths upon arrival. This new requirement aims to enhance border security and more efficiently identify individuals who overstay their authorized period. Travelers planning visits from October 2025 onwards should anticipate potentially longer processing times at border controls during their initial entry into the Schengen Area due to these new biometric data collection procedures. This advance awareness allows for better planning and reduces potential stress upon arrival.

Health and Safety Precautions

Ensuring personal health and safety should be a top priority for any traveler. Dubrovnik offers generally good healthcare on the mainland, but preparedness is key.

• Emergency Contacts: Access to emergency services is critical. The universal

- emergency telephone number in Croatia is 112, which can be dialed for police, fire, or ambulance services. For direct contact, police can be reached at 192, the fire department at 193, and an ambulance at 194. For medical emergencies, Dubrovnik General Hospital can be contacted at +385 20 431 777, and the Health Centre at +385 20 416 866.
- Healthcare and Insurance: While healthcare services on the Croatian mainland are generally considered good, those on the islands may be limited. Comprehensive travel insurance is highly recommended to cover potential medical treatment costs or, crucially, expensive medical evacuations. Although a Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC) or European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) can provide access to medically necessary state healthcare, it is important to note that a charge for treatment is always applied (up to €530), and these cards do not cover all potential costs, such as medical evacuation. The consistent advice to secure comprehensive travel insurance, even with the availability of state healthcare access, highlights the potential gaps in coverage provided by GHIC/EHIC and the substantial financial burden that could arise from serious medical emergencies, particularly those requiring evacuation. This underscores the importance of robust travel insurance as a primary safeguard against unforeseen medical expenses.
- Recommended Vaccinations: Travelers should ensure their routine vaccinations are upto-date before departure. The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and World Health
 Organization (WHO) recommend specific vaccines for Croatia, including Typhoid,
 Hepatitis A, and Polio. Depending on travel plans and duration, vaccinations for Tickborne Encephalitis (with limited risk along the Adriatic coast) and Rabies (especially for
 long-term travelers or those with potential animal contact) may also be advised.

Local Health Risks & Prevention:

- Insect-borne Diseases: Tick-borne encephalitis poses a risk in forested areas, and cases of West Nile virus have been reported. To mitigate these risks, travelers should use insect repellent, wear long, loose, light-colored clothing, and ensure their accommodation is insect-proof.
- Hemorrhagic Fever with Renal Syndrome (HFRS) / "Mouse Fever": This is a
 risk in forested regions. Prevention involves avoiding contact with rodents and their
 droppings, refraining from sitting or lying directly on the ground in forests, keeping
 food and drinks in sealed containers, and avoiding drinking from forest springs.
- Food and Water Safety: Adhering to good hygiene practices is essential. This
 includes practicing thorough hand hygiene, avoiding food from street vendors
 unless confident in their sanitation, opting for thoroughly cooked dishes, and
 choosing bottled or canned drinks with intact seals.
- **General Safety Advice:** Croatia is generally a safe destination, but standard precautions are always recommended.
 - Terrorism/Protests: While rare, vigilance is advised in public places. Travelers should monitor local media for any developments and adhere to the advice of local authorities. Avoiding protests and demonstrations is also recommended.
 - Crime: Exercise normal safety precautions, particularly in busy tourist areas, at bus and railway stations, and on public transport. To prevent petty crime, never accept food or drinks from strangers and avoid leaving personal food or drinks unattended. It is crucial to look after belongings, especially in crowded areas. Travelers should also avoid displaying overt signs of affluence or carrying large sums of cash.
 - Financial Safety: When using debit or credit cards, exercise caution. Pay close
 attention when others handle cards, use ATMs located in well-lit public areas or
 inside banks, cover the keypad when entering a PIN, and regularly review account
 statements for any unauthorized transactions.
 - Natural Disasters: Croatia is situated in an active earthquake zone. Forest fires are a common occurrence during the dry, hot coastal season from June to

- September. Floods and landslides can also occur. Travelers should monitor media for updates and follow the guidance of local authorities in such events.
- Road Safety: Road conditions can vary significantly throughout the country; some roads may be poorly maintained, congested, narrow, and slippery when wet. It is mandatory to use headlights from the last weekend in October until the last weekend in March, and also during fog and rain. Winter tires are required on motor vehicles between November 15 and April 15.
- Minefields: For those venturing outside major tourist destinations, it is critical to consult maps of suspected minefields, pay close attention to warning signs, remain strictly on paved roads, and avoid open fields or unmarked trails.
- Water Safety: Exercise caution when walking on the shore. Avoid visiting beaches
 or coastal areas during periods of severe weather warnings and always heed
 warning flags at beaches. Never dive into unknown waters, as hidden rocks or
 shallow depths can lead to serious injury or worse.

Understanding Local Customs and Tipping Etiquette

Respecting local customs and understanding tipping etiquette can significantly enhance a traveler's experience and interactions.

- **Social Conventions:** Croatian life is deeply rooted in strong family values and traditions, often centered around the Catholic Church. When visiting religious buildings, it is appreciated for women to wear long sleeves as a sign of respect.
- Greetings: A handshake, accompanied by a smile and direct eye contact, is the standard
 greeting when meeting someone for the first time. It is best to address new acquaintances
 using their surname first, reserving first names for closer friends. Among close friends and
 family, hugs or a kiss on each cheek are common greetings.
- **Punctuality:** Croatians generally have a relaxed approach to punctuality. When invited to someone's home, arriving on time or even up to 15 minutes late is considered acceptable.
- Hospitality: Should one be invited to a Croatian home, it is customary to bring a small gift for the host, such as cookies or flowers. If bringing flowers, ensure they are in odd numbers and avoid chrysanthemums. Guests are often offered slippers to wear indoors, and accepting this gesture, as removing outdoor shoes is the norm, is appreciated. Hosts will likely offer food, coffee, or rakia (a popular homemade liquor); politely accepting a sip or taste is important, as outright rejection can be considered rude. When dining, it is customary not to begin eating until everyone is seated. Furthermore, declining additional food by simply saying "NO" can be misinterpreted as disliking the food, which could offend the host.
- Coffee Culture (Kafići): Spending time in "kafići," or coffee shops, is a significant and cherished social tradition in Croatia. Typically, the person who extended the invitation for coffee will cover the bill, though splitting the bill is increasingly common among younger generations. It is not uncommon to observe a playful argument over who gets to pay the bill
- **Shopping Etiquette:** When entering a shop, it is customary to greet the staff with "dobar dan" (good day), and upon leaving, to say "doviđénja" (goodbye).
- **Tipping Etiquette:** Tipping in Croatia is generally not expected but is highly appreciated by service providers. When leaving cash tips, it is essential to use Euros. The detailed guidelines for tipping, which emphasize that gratuity is "appreciated but not expected," highlight a cultural nuance where genuine gratitude is valued more than a rigid obligation. This allows travelers the flexibility to adjust their tip based on the quality of service, while still encouraging generosity for exceptional experiences. This nuanced approach helps visitors navigate social dynamics more smoothly, avoiding the pressure of fixed rules

while still showing appreciation.

- Restaurants: For good service, a tip of around 10% is considered standard, increasing to 15% for excellent service, particularly in major tourist hubs like Dubrovnik. It is always wise to check the bill to ensure a service charge has not already been included, though this is rare.
- Cafes/Bars: For casual settings, rounding up the bill or adding approximately 3-5% is appropriate.
- Hotels: Tipping is generally not required for hotel services. However, if assistance is provided, such as by a porter, a small tip of €1-€2 per bag is suitable. For satisfactory maid service, a few Euros can be left. For exceptional concierge services, such as securing hard-to-get reservations, a tip of €5-€10 is a generous gesture.
- Taxis: Tipping is not expected, but it is common practice to round up the fare by
 €1-€2 to simplify transactions and avoid dealing with loose change.
- Tour Guides: Tipping tour guides is highly recommended due to their valuable local knowledge and insights. For private half-day tours, €10-€15 per traveler is appropriate, while for full-day tours, €20-€25 is suggested. For shared group tours, a contribution of €5-€10 per guest is generally suitable.
- Other Services: For personal care services like spa treatments or hairdressing, a 10% tip is a general guideline, potentially increasing to 15% if the service was particularly pleasing. For food delivery, rounding up the bill or adding a couple of Euros is customary, especially in adverse weather conditions.

III. Arriving at Dubrovnik Airport (DBV)

Dubrovnik Airport (DBV), also known as Ruđer Bošković Airport, serves as the primary gateway to the city, offering a range of facilities designed to facilitate a smooth arrival for travelers.

Airport Facilities and Services

The airport is equipped with essential services to cater to immediate traveler needs upon disembarkation.

- Money Services: For currency exchange, two bureaux de change are available, one in International Arrivals and another in International Departures. A bank and a post office are also on-site, alongside ATMs from major Croatian banks, including RBA, PBZ, ZABA, ERSTE, OTP, HPB, MoneyGet, and Euronet, ensuring convenient access to local currency.
- Communication: Free Wi-Fi access is provided throughout the terminal buildings, allowing passengers to connect with ease. Additionally, two fixed internet kiosks are available for public use. The comprehensive array of airport facilities, particularly the immediate availability of money exchange services and free Wi-Fi, enables travelers to address essential needs promptly upon arrival. This proactive provision of services significantly reduces initial travel stress, as visitors can acquire local currency and establish communication without delay, contributing to a more positive first impression of the destination.
- **Shopping:** A duty-free shop in the international departures area offers a selection of local produce, fashion items, and perfumes. For domestic travelers, a newspaper and tobacco shop is located in the domestic departures area.
- Luggage Services: The airport provides left luggage services for temporary storage, a lost and found service (contactable at +385 20 773 328), and a luggage wrapping service

- for added security.
- **Food and Beverages:** Cafés situated in both terminals offer a variety of hot and cold drinks, snacks, and light meals.
- Other Amenities: Additional amenities include a parking lot with 200 spaces (the first 15 minutes of parking are free), dedicated business and VIP lounges, and a tour operator/travel agency for last-minute bookings or information.

Navigating the Arrivals Process

Upon landing at Dubrovnik Airport on a scheduled flight, the first step for international travelers is to clear passport control. After successfully passing through immigration and collecting any checked luggage, passengers should proceed outside the arrival terminal. This area is the designated access point for all ground transportation options. For those planning to use the official Platanus Airport Shuttle Bus, tickets can be conveniently purchased at the Platanus travel agency counter, which is located immediately adjacent to the baggage claim area.

IV. Seamless Transfers to Rixos Premium Dubrovnik

The journey from Dubrovnik Airport (DBV) to Rixos Premium Dubrovnik offers several convenient options, ranging from complimentary hotel services to public transport and private transfers. Each method provides a different balance of cost, speed, and comfort.

Rixos Premium Dubrovnik: Location and Exclusive Transfer Services

Rixos Premium Dubrovnik is a luxurious lifestyle hotel positioned approximately 23 kilometers (about 14.3 miles) from Dubrovnik Airport (DBV). Its prime location places it just 1.5 kilometers (approximately 0.9 miles) from Dubrovnik's historic Old Town, making it highly accessible for exploring the city's main attractions on foot. The hotel's design offers panoramic views, enhancing the guest experience.

For guests seeking the utmost convenience, Rixos Premium Dubrovnik offers a **complimentary return airport transfer** service to and from Dubrovnik Airport. This exclusive benefit is typically extended to guests who book a suite and commit to a minimum stay of 4 nights. This offer is subject to availability and specific terms and conditions, which should be verified directly with the hotel. For other room types or shorter stays, airport transportation is generally available, but it usually incurs an additional surcharge. Guests interested in availing this complimentary service are strongly advised to contact the hotel directly via email at dubrovnik@rixos.com or by phone at +385 020 200 000 to confirm their eligibility and arrange the transfer details in advance. The provision of a complimentary airport transfer for suite bookings represents a significant value proposition that aligns with the preferences of discerning travelers. This amenity not only adds considerable convenience by removing the logistical burden of arranging transport upon arrival but also enhances the overall VIP experience, potentially influencing booking decisions for longer, more luxurious stays at the hotel.

Public Shuttle Bus (Platanus Agency)

The official Dubrovnik Airport Shuttle Bus service, operated by Platanus Agency, provides a cost-effective and reliable transfer option between the airport and central Dubrovnik. **Route and Stops:**

• From Airport to Dubrovnik: Upon arrival at Dubrovnik Airport, buses are scheduled to meet all incoming flights. Departures from the airport occur approximately 45 minutes

- after each flight lands, with service operating 24/7 from the first flight in the morning until the last one in the evening. The bus makes two primary stops in Dubrovnik: first at Old Town Dubrovnik (Ploče gate), and then it continues to the Main Bus Station in Gruž Port.
- From Dubrovnik to Airport: For departures from Dubrovnik to the airport, buses leave from the Main Bus Station in Gruž Port. These departures are typically scheduled 90 minutes before domestic flights and 2 hours before international flights. Additional pick-up points include the Cable Car stop (approximately 5-10 minutes after departing the Main Bus Station), Grawe station, and Srebreno station. The Platanus Airport Shuttle Bus offers a cost-effective and relatively quick transfer option. However, travelers should be aware of a distinction in its scheduling: while airport arrivals are demand-driven, departing "after every flight," the schedules provided for departures from the city are fixed. This means that while arriving passengers have a flexible service, those departing need to adhere strictly to the published timetable, which is an important consideration for travel planning.

Journey Duration: The total travel time from Dubrovnik Airport to central Dubrovnik typically ranges from 30 to 40 minutes. Specifically, the bus journey from Dubrovnik Airport to Dubrovnik Old Town takes approximately 30 minutes.

Ticket Purchase and Pricing: A one-way ticket for the shuttle bus costs €10, while a return ticket is priced at €15. Tickets can be conveniently purchased at several locations: at the Platanus travel agency counter located next to the baggage claim area at the airport, at the Main Bus Station, at the Cable Car stop (which also houses a Shuttle bus office), or online. Connecting to Rixos Premium Dubrovnik from Shuttle Stops: Since the Rixos Premium Dubrovnik is situated 1.5 kilometers from the Old Town , travelers arriving via the airport shuttle bus will need to arrange onward transport from either the Old Town (Ploče Gate) or the Main Bus Station. From the Old Town area (specifically Pile Gate, a short walk from Ploče Gate), local bus line 4 is a convenient option to reach the hotel's vicinity. The hotel is also within a 4-minute walk of the Pera Čingrije local bus stop. Alternatively, a short taxi ride can complete the journey from these shuttle stops to the hotel.

Taxi Services

Taxis offer a direct and often faster mode of transport from Dubrovnik Airport to Rixos Premium Dubrovnik. They are readily available just outside the arrivals terminal.

Estimated Fares and Travel Time: The quickest way to reach Rixos Premium Dubrovnik from Dubrovnik Airport (DBV) is by taxi. This journey typically takes around 25 minutes and costs an estimated €40 to €50. For comparison, taxi fares to Dubrovnik's Old Town are approximately €60, and to the Dubrovnik Cruise Port, they range from €80 to €100.

Important Considerations: To ensure safety and fair pricing, it is advisable for travelers to utilize official airport taxi services. Taxi fares are usually displayed on a board, which passengers should check before boarding to confirm the cost. While some taxi drivers may accept card payments, cash (Euros) is generally preferred for taxi fares.

Ride-Sharing Options (Uber/Bolt)

Ride-sharing services provide an alternative to traditional taxis, offering convenience through mobile applications.

• **Uber:** Uber is available for pickup services at Dubrovnik Airport (DBV). Travelers can request a ride directly through the Uber app, which provides step-by-step directions for meeting the assigned driver. Pickup locations may vary by terminal, and designated rideshare pickup signs might be available to guide passengers. The cost of an Uber trip

- from DBV depends on several factors, including the chosen ride type, the estimated length and duration of the journey, any applicable tolls and city fees, and the current demand for rides. An estimated price can be viewed within the app before confirming the ride request.
- **Bolt:** While some sources indicate that Uber might not be widely available for general intra-city travel in Dubrovnik, Bolt, another popular ride-sharing service, does operate in the city, alongside local taxi services. Bolt generally offers pricing similar to local taxis. The information regarding Uber's general availability within Dubrovnik is mixed, with Uber's own site confirming airport pickups, while another source suggests it's not generally available in the city beyond that. This indicates that while Uber is a viable option for airport transfers, travelers should be prepared to rely on Bolt or traditional taxis for getting around within Dubrovnik itself, managing expectations for local transport.

Private Transfers

For travelers prioritizing comfort, luxury, and direct door-to-door service, private transfer options are an excellent choice from Dubrovnik Airport directly to Rixos Premium Dubrovnik.

Benefits: Private transfer services typically utilize high-end vehicles, such as luxury Mercedes-Benz sedans and vans, ensuring a comfortable and stylish journey. They are operated by professional, English-speaking drivers who provide a safe and prompt transfer. These services are particularly advantageous for those wishing to avoid the crowds associated with public transport, especially during peak tourist season, or for larger groups.

Flexibility: A key advantage of private transfers is their flexibility. They can often be customized to include additional stops, detours for sightseeing, or even integrated guided tours along the way, offering a personalized travel experience.

Booking Process: Pre-booking a private transfer online is highly recommended to ensure a seamless arrival. Reputable companies such as Adria Luxury Travel and AirportTransfer.com offer these services. Many providers offer flexible cancellation policies, including free cancellation up to 48 hours before the scheduled trip, and provide 24/7 car service, ensuring reliability regardless of flight times. Travelers typically provide their flight and hotel details during the booking process, allowing the service to manage all logistics.

V. Exploring Dubrovnik from Rixos Premium Dubrovnik

Rixos Premium Dubrovnik's strategic location offers convenient access to the city's main attractions, particularly the historic Old Town.

Proximity to Dubrovnik Old Town and Walking Accessibility

The Rixos Premium Dubrovnik is ideally situated just 1.5 kilometers (approximately 0.9 miles) from the iconic historic Old Town. This close proximity makes walking a viable and enjoyable option for guests wishing to explore the Old Town and its myriad attractions. A leisurely stroll from the Old Town back to Rixos Premium Dubrovnik typically takes around 22 minutes. This direct access allows guests to immerse themselves in the city's rich history and vibrant atmosphere at their own pace.

Local Public Bus Services

Dubrovnik boasts a well-connected and frequent public bus system, efficiently operated by Libertas Dubrovnik. This network provides an excellent means of navigating the city. **Routes to Rixos Premium Dubrovnik:** The hotel is well-served by several local bus lines, with the closest bus stop, Pera Čingrije, located just a 4-minute walk away. Bus line 4, which operates between Pile (near the Old Town) and Hotel Palace, is particularly useful for guests as it connects the Old Town area directly to the vicinity of Rixos Premium Dubrovnik (stopping near "ekonomska skola").

Journey Time & Frequency: A direct bus ride from Dubrovnik Old Town (Pile Gate) to the area near the Rixos Premium Dubrovnik typically takes approximately 5 to 9 minutes. Services on these routes generally depart every 30 minutes, ensuring regular and convenient transport throughout the day.

Ticket Types and Purchase Locations: Libertas Dubrovnik offers a variety of ticket options to suit different travel needs and durations. The variety of local bus ticket options, including single-ride, hourly, daily, and multi-day passes, provides travelers with the flexibility to optimize their transport costs based on their specific itinerary. This tiered pricing structure allows for greater

control over travel budgets and enhances the overall efficiency of moving around the city.

- Single "S" Bus Tickets: These tickets cost €1.73 and are valid for one hour from the moment of first use, allowing for an unlimited number of rides in all directions within that hour. They can be purchased at newspaper kiosks, official Libertas stalls located at major bus stops (e.g., POS Pile, POS Grawe), travel agencies, and hotel receptions. It is important to validate the ticket by stamping it upon entering the bus.
- In-bus Tickets: For immediate travel, tickets can be purchased directly from the bus driver for €1.99. However, these tickets are valid only for that single ride and are slightly more expensive than those bought at kiosks. It is advisable to have exact change when purchasing tickets from the driver.
- Two-ride Bus Ticket: This option costs €3.19 and is valid for two separate bus rides, with each ride valid for 30 minutes from its individual registration.
- **Daily Bus Card:** Priced at €5.31, a Daily Bus Card provides unlimited bus rides within a 24-hour period from its first stamping. These cards are available exclusively at Libertas Dubrovnik bus kiosks and require stamping every time a passenger boards a bus.
- Three-day Bus Card: Similar to the daily card, the three-day pass costs €11.95 and offers unlimited rides on local public transit for 72 hours, activated upon first use.
- Dubrovnik Pass: A highly recommended option for tourists is the Dubrovnik Pass, which includes free bus tickets. For instance, a Daily City Pass often bundles a 24-hour Daily Bus ticket with entry to attractions like the City Walls, making it a cost-effective choice for sightseeing and transportation. Children aged 6 years and under travel free on public buses when accompanied by an adult. The Dubrovnik Pass, by bundling bus tickets with attraction entry, provides a significant financial and practical advantage for tourists. This encourages the utilization of public transport and broader exploration of the city, streamlining both budgeting and access to key sites.

For entry into Croatia, adherence to passport validity requirements is crucial. Travelers should be particularly aware of the impending European Entry/Exit System (EES) expected in October 2025, which will introduce biometric data collection for non-EU nationals. This procedural change may lead to longer processing times upon initial entry into the Schengen Area, necessitating additional time allowance at border control.

Prioritizing health and safety through comprehensive travel insurance is strongly recommended. While Croatia offers state healthcare, its limitations, especially concerning evacuation costs and charges for treatment, underscore the necessity of robust private coverage. Awareness of local health risks, such as insect-borne diseases and HFRS, coupled with preventive measures, will contribute to a healthier trip. Adhering to general safety advice regarding personal belongings, financial transactions, and being mindful of natural disaster warnings further enhances security. Understanding and respecting local customs, particularly around greetings, hospitality, and the cherished coffee culture, can enrich interactions with Croatian people. While tipping is not strictly expected, it is genuinely appreciated, with clear guidelines provided for various services, allowing travelers to express gratitude appropriately.

Upon arrival at Dubrovnik Airport, travelers will find well-equipped facilities, including currency exchange and free Wi-Fi, enabling immediate essential needs to be met. For transfers to Rixos Premium Dubrovnik, a range of options caters to different preferences. The Platanus Airport Shuttle Bus offers a cost-effective solution, though a local connection to the hotel will be required from its city stops.
