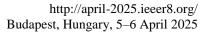

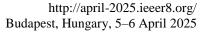

SUBJECT: Approval of the 2025 Region 8 budget v.1b

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

At the time of the R8C meeting in Bordeaux in October 2024, the R8 Committee approved provisional budget plan v.0 which assumed the same figures for 2025 Budget as in Budget 2024.

At the OpCom meeting in Morocco in November 2024, it was decided not to update v.0 as there was not enough information.

Due to the late amendments to some of the 2024 expense details and delays in financial closing of substantial external grants we had in 2024, actual spending in 2024 could only be reconciled in March 2025. As the result, the proposal for the Budget v.1 was sent for comments to OpCom only recently. These comments have been included in the proposed here Budget v.1b.

The budget predicts a similar actual annual regular income as in 2024, with additional amount of \$44,060 from the continuing and newly awarded grants. Therefore, the planned Budget v.1 is \$35,385 larger than v.0, but not by a full amount of the grants. The Budget assumes that the transfer of the surplus, accruals and savings from 2024 and from the accumulated during the COVID period reserves will be \$463,800 it total, i.e. \$2,570 less than in the previous year.

PROPOSED ACTION

RESOLVED that the 2025 Region 8 Budget v.1 as presented shall be approved. This budget includes:

- A 2025 balanced budget without material surplus or loss.
- 2025 budget expenses of \$ 1,197,800.
- 2024 budget income of \$ 1,197,800 consisting of: actual annual income, existing grants and savings of \$680,320, accrual expenses of \$127,740, \$389,740 transfer from actual 2024 operational surplus and COVID accumulated reserves.

A petition was submitted by Region 8 Vitality Coordinator Andrejs Romanovs (#92772530), requesting the formation of the IEEE Rwanda Subsection in Region 8.

The boundaries of the Subsection correspond to the boundaries of the country of Rwanda (see map), surrounded by four countries: Democratic Republic of Congo, Uganda, Tanzania, and Burundi. The Rwanda Subsection will be a part of Region 8.

Currently, 79 IEEE members lives in Rwanda: 14 professional members, 39 graduate students, and 26 undergraduate students.

The request has been evaluated based on activities and the Region 8 Section Vitality and Development Committee guidelines. As per Region 8 Operations Manual section R8-8.1 the Region 8 Committee needs to approve the formation of a new Subsection and is requested to do so.
